### TOPICS FOR MOTORISTS.

## The Turning Circle.

Becoming Larger in Modern Cars.

The size of the turning circle is a subject which has been commented upon fairly frequently, because there has been a general tendency lately to increase it to become larger. At one time a majority of cars could be turned between forty 40 ft. apart, but nowadays 45 ft. or even more is the width often required. This is a regrettable trend, because the addition of even 2 ft. to the diameter of the turning circle makes a noticeable difference to the handling of the vehicle.

This trend has been thought to be due to a recently coming to the fact that for three months we have been driving daily one of the modern medium-sized cars of 30 ft. diameter, which has a turning circle of less than 40 ft. in diameter. The exact diameter is 37 ft. 6 in. On any easy or ordinary way we have been able to turn in a circle of less than 40 ft. in diameter. The trouble with increasing turning circles is that the tendency has been a gradual one, so that, going from car to car a driver slowly becomes accustomed to a certain lack of handiness and so does not criticize it too strongly. He has to return to a car with a really small circle in order fully to appreciate the big advantage which such a vehicle possesses.

In London, as in most other towns nowadays, it is very frequently necessary to park a car in a confined space, particularly for those who use automobiles in the course of their daily business. Other cars may be ranged in lines along the kerb, for example, with length available to the driver. Here the fortunate possessor of one with a good turn can reverse into position without much difficulty, give a little skill and practice, whereas with many more the feat would be quite impossible. Similarly, in some cases it is necessary to reverse into a space between two cars which are parked along the kerb, projecting into the width of the road. If the road is a one-way, it will be almost impossible to do this with a large turning circle, because the driver, no matter how skilled he may be, cannot approach the car which is in line with those already

parked. In other words, his is a manoeuvre which is so difficult that unless the car is considerably wider than the gap he finds it impossible to enter it.

**Over-shooting a Turning.**  
There shows in the simple matter of over-shooting a turning, with the subsequent process of getting round in order to return to the kerb, the danger of getting stuck unless one obtains a convenient position for the front wheels, which, at a great advantage if the car can be turned in reverse, always a troublesome manoeuvre if there is any other traffic on the road which has been forbidden by the police to certain road districts.

In any condition of heavy traffic the car with the small turning circle scores heavily over its more cumbersome prototypes. For example, the driver may get up and then realize that the lorry is going to be in the way for some time, discharge its load. Whether or not it will be possible to pull out and get past it, without first reversing, then largely depends upon the steering lock of the car concerned.

**Factors Affecting Steering Lock.**  
The angle through which the front wheels can be moved by the steering gear, which, together with the wheelbase, affects the turning circle, is largely dependent upon the width of the frame, track, diameter of the wheels, the steering gear itself and the front-trunk mechanism. It is not imperative here to enter into a long discussion of the engineering aspects of this matter, so that it should be sufficient to point out that as there are some medium-size cars with front-wheel brakes and a 10-ft. wheelbase, which can be turned in a circle less than its diameter there is really no excuse for similar cars which require 45 ft. or more.

Wheels are the body cars to be steered from this criterion, but, besides, although an exact hand, they are often unevenly bed of either front or rear, giving a good point of view. This is usually due to the narrow wheelbase, which makes it difficult to allow the front wheels to move through a sufficient range. Incidentally, the diameter of the turning circle is also always specified in our road test reports.—(The "Motor.")

**Tanganyika Concessions.**

**PROGRESS OF THE KATANGA.**

Mr. Robert Williams was in his speech at the meeting of the Tanganyika Concessions, when dealing with the progress in the Katanga (says the "Daily Telegraph.") From 1911 until 1927, the Katanga has built up a mining industry and a great railway, all of which required time and cost labor. The official disclosures have proved the existence of over 5,000,000 tons of copper worth well over £300,000,000, and led to the announcement of the Cape to Cairo Railway route through the Rhodesia and Belgian territory to the navigable Congo in the progress of the Union Minister.

It is satisfactory that the programme of new plant additions is making headway with the object of increasing the production of copper to 200,000 tons per annum. At the end of last year the reverberatory furnaces were started up and are now in full operation, with the result that the production of copper shows a marked improvement and reached a total for the first six months of 27,000 tons, and will probably amount to 115,000 tons for the whole year. At the same time the production of steel has been materially increased. Of equal importance was the increase of plant in the construction of the Danangula Railway, and what is in completed and the hydro-electric power and washing are available. The Union Minister will be able to treat a much lower grade of copper and produce the cheapest copper in the world.

Crimes in Kenya.

While there may be some doubt as to whether the Gibberian dictum that 'A policeman's lot is not a happy one' may be applied truthfully to the Force in this country, there is, we venture to think, 'no possible doubt whatever' that the way of the evil doer in the Colony is becoming each year more and more difficult. This is evident from the recently published Kenya Police Annual Report which 'in one spot which all ranks of the Force, from the Commissioner downwards may be congratulated for its most satisfactory feature is the proof which is afforded that there is a general increase in efficiency with regard to the prevention and detection of crime. In no far as the decrease in the number of cases is undoubtedly due in large measure to increasing police vigils and the development of the night in the patrol system. It is reflected in the greater percentage of convictions obtained in comparison with the most serious branches of crime such as housebreaking, thefts, stock thefts and robbery. The figures quoted give no indication of the number of stores reported which have not led to prosecutions and we suggest that it would be interesting in future reports to have this information for the purpose of comparison from the fact that the percentage of convictions show a marked increase. It is reasonable to infer that these have been an improve-

ment in the presentation of evidence against the accused and that the evidence in undoubted cases of guilt has been prepared in such a way as to amount to incontrovertible proof. That in turn betokened a more experienced and better trained force and the employment perhaps of more scientific methods. The progress of the Report which will strike every dwellers particularly is the remarkable and progressive improvement which is indicated in the decline which has taken place during the last two years in the number of housebreakings. As related to this phase of police activity is the somewhat amusing figures in connection with the recovery of stolen property last year. This amounted to £116 per cent on the value of goods stolen throughout the Colony, which in the capital alone the figure is put at 68.6 per cent. The significance of these figures is better realized when it is learned that in the London Metropolitan area only 13 per cent of stolen property is recovered. 'One of the largest problems in past years was the prevalence of stock thefts. The 170 cases reported in 1927 represent a reduction of 24 per cent on the previous year. The figure and the rate of the livestock the Colony has known of late some very considerable time. This is due to the fact that the institution of police patrols in the districts where the crime was most prevalent and the proper implementing of the law. ### CRIME IN THE COLONY DURING 1927.

Reduction in Number of Sock Theft.

INTERESTING FACTS.

Success in Recovery of Stolen Property.

Part II of the Kenya Police Annual Report for 1927 deals with crime in the native and urban areas. The outstanding feature of the year's statistics is the marked decrease in the number of stolen goods, and in particular the reduction in the number of stolen socks.

A reduction of 24 per cent in the number of cases of sock theft in comparison with the previous year is shown. Evidence one of the most interesting features of the whole is the fact that with the recovery of stolen property, the number of stolen goods, and from the ratio of success in the recovery of stolen goods, it can be seen that the figure shows a decrease exceptionally well with those of any other place quoted.

#### Crime.

In 1927 the Police arrested and tried 2,100 persons and 2,036 convictions were recorded under the Indian Penal Code; that number, 1,707 were obtained as serious crimes, the latter being 211, or 38 per cent, below the 1926 total.

Convictions were recorded by Magistrates and by the Supreme Court in 5,009 of the total of 7,145 persons tried under the Indian Penal Code, 1,321 persons being charged in court by Police, 2,004 or 28 per cent, were obtained.

In serious crimes, convictions were obtained in 464 cases, 377 persons being convicted.

On magisterial institutions, a further 249 minor and summary offences under the Indian Penal Code were investigated by the Police, 193 persons being convicted.

The outstanding feature of the year's work in the success which has followed Police activities in prosecuting offences against property, more particularly those involving a crime that, in its degree prevent, a productive and breaking of any and every respect to the public.

Increasing Police vigilance and activity in organized night pilfering and in systematic removal of unaccounted articles from the Police in the prevention of crime, and continued activity throughout the year in the discovery of these offenders, the most powerful weapons in Police work in this colony.

Stock theft and theft generally were also reduced in number in comparison with 1926; nevertheless, in spite of the deterrent success achieved, in preventing and deterring stock theft in the year under review, it can not be regarded as a point to state that we have not stock theft under complete control.

These results have been achieved despite the increase in numbers and productivity of the native professional criminal.

The detailed and systematic recording of the class of crime in which the individual concerned is engaged is added and the method of commission adopted by him; for the professional criminal seldom varies either his crime or methods, or of the utmost value to the Police in the detection of crime.

The provision of such records and their classification and registration so as to include all who have proved themselves to be members of the professional criminal fraternity is one of the most important tasks of the Criminal Investigation Department. With few exceptions it is in the detail criminal who is responsible for the most serious and serious offences against property and as he advances in pro-

gress and in numbers approximates the records of the Mohan Openair. Hence, it is of great value to the Force in the investigation and detection of crime.

## CRIME IN THE COLONY DURING 1927.

Per cent on the previous year. Although the number of prosecutions in this form of predatory crime has been reduced to 10, the total area of the settlement areas and the aggregate of the towns in the Colony have increased for some years. The conviction percentage has also increased in the past twelve months with 62 per cent in 1926.

### Recovery of Property.

The percentage of recovery of stolen property by the Police in other parts of the Empire is given as follows:—Borneo, 1926, 18.0 per cent; Saigon, 1926, 18.0 per cent; Siam, 1926, 20.0 per cent; Mauritius (Trafalgar), 1926, 20.0 per cent; Hong Kong, 1926, 20.0 per cent; Vancouver, 1926, 27.0 per cent; Zanzibar, 1926, 27.0 per cent; London, 1926, 18.0 per cent; London, 1927, 69.9 per cent.

### Retrospective Criminals.

Of native reconvicted criminals resident in the metropolis in urban areas, 107, 80 per cent in 1927, 80 are classified by the Police as "dangerous individuals." The steady increase reflected by these figures on the part of the professional native criminal is in accordance with the general increase in the population of the Colony to contact with the metropolitan areas.

The native criminal class is composed in the main of the destitute and low-down African who usually possess a very low degree of education and the mental training which would enable him to make comparisons of the value and significance to the planning and execution of crime.

### Criminal Investigation Department.

This department continued its work in the Colony down to its inauguration in 1926. The work of the Crime Investigation Department, the investigation on behalf of, or in connection with, the military forces, of important securities and would these include the detection of unusual complaints.

Forty cases were requiring investigation during the year, in connection with which the Police had to be called upon to furnish information to the Police of the districts concerned.

Twenty odd offenders who were charged with offences were tried and returned to active service in the Colony. 18 persons "waited" were located.

Thirty addresses were investigated in connection with the investigation Department, which included the investigation of the following cases out of the Colony (Singapore 12; Malacca 2; Sumatra 2; Natives).

On December 31, 1927, 608 persons were under Police surveillance, a considerable increase on the total for 1926. Of these 2 were Europeans, 2 were Asians, 598 were Natives.

It is of interest to note that Akhroy comprised 94 per cent of the total of 608 convicts under surveillance, and Kivindo a further 18 per cent.

A branch Passport Office under the supervision of the Crime Investigation Department, Nairobi, was opened at Kisumu in December to meet the convenience of the public in the Coast area.

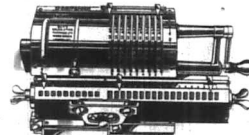

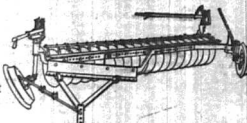

POLICE WORK IN THE OUT STATIONS. Decrease in the Number of Stock Thefts.

AID IN RESERVE. Urgent Need for a Station at Kabete.

The third post of the Kenya Police Inspector for 1927 deals with the work which has been accompanied by the various stations throughout the Colony. In general there appears to have been less crime throughout the country districts than in the previous year, although slight increases have been recorded from one or two districts. Stock thefts in particular, have decreased considerably during 1927.

Stock thefts, which during the previous year in the district had shown a considerable rise, was reduced to 41 cases, a fall of 28 per cent. This was effected by Police activity in the form of regular patrols and the seizure early in the year, by the local police, of a considerable number of cattle on which brands were found to have been shaved or mutilated.

The infliction of administrative punishment on neighbouring Beasara has proved of material assistance to the Police in their efforts to control this sporadic form of active crime.

Valuable aid was rendered by tribal relations in adjoining reserves in three cases of stock theft. Rate of crime, however, is generally appreciated by the Police, particularly so as they are delighted from operating in native reserves under the supervision of the Government.

About the middle of the year a number of thefts of cash left unattended in motor cars in Eldoret township took place. Three Nandi were arrested by the Police, and a considerable sum in cash recovered in the first instance. This class of theft would after some time have been eliminated.

Police work in the Turbo area is being largely centred in the presence of the Railway construction party. The transference of the camp to Turbo has already diminished crime in that locality.

A motor accident, which may be classed as one of the most serious hours in the Colony, took place at the close of the year in Eldoret when a car left the road near the station Hotel bridge and overturned completely over in the bed of the stream. Two of the occupants were pinned under water beneath a suspended net. Although immediate efforts were made to rescue them and artificial respiration resorted to for over an hour and a half, neither could be saved.

The magistrate summoned at the request upon complaint work undertaken by the Police in removing the victims of the accident and in attempting to compensate by artificial respiration those who had been rescued in the river.

Fort Hill. Two Police Stations which had been in close proximity at Chiromo and Thika township were amalgamated early in the year into one station at Thika, staffed by an Inspector, a Sergeant, and the customary African personnel. This step has resulted in enhanced efficiency, economy, and more effective control of crime.

The station is under the control of the Assistant Superintendent of Police at Fort Hill and has jurisdiction over the Ngaruro area, formerly in Kiambu Police District, and over parts of Dunga, Sabaki, Athiroo, and parts of Malindi.

The increase in Fort Hill of these areas has resulted in a general increase being reflected in the crime statistics for that district. It is satisfactory to note that, notwithstanding new arrivals, has decreased the year showing only 16 cases throughout the whole district. Theft and stock thefts are being controlled, and a fall in crime.

The District Police received valuable assistance from tribal relations in the local reserves in arresting offenders and producing evidence for trial to property owners who lodge the reserves for compensation.

Kiambu. The Police work in a general sense was marked, particularly so as regards offences against property. The reduction of stock theft by 20 per cent on the 1925 total, fourteen cases only being reported during last year, is particularly gratifying.

## Nairobi Plot Sales.

It is a very considerable time since any Crown land was sold in the commercial area of the capital. A circumstance arising from the delay which has occurred in connection with the formation of a town plan. Will it be long before the Government will be able to sell any Crown land in the future, since the town plan has not yet taken final shape it is interesting to learn from the latest issue of the Official Gazette that next month there will be a sale of eight plots, the first instalment of what we hope will be a series of such outcrops. It is generally known that the two plots at the corner of Ninth Avenue and Elliot Street, opposite to the offices of the East African Standard will be offered for the new provision for the Standard Block of South Africa. The balance of plots comprise the vacant ground towards the New Shankley Hotel, the rest of the forthcoming sale is included in the land to be sold being in Elliot Street and Hardinge Street. The conditions of sale have been drawn up by Government with a view to obtaining the maximum activities of the land operator whose sole purpose is buying a plot would be to retain it until such time as a big application in town values would make it to make an extremely profitable undertaking. The conditions provide for the payment immediately on the fall of the auctioneer's hammer, of a deposit of twenty-five per cent of the purchase price, the balance of which may be paid in full within seven days of the date of the sale, or in three equal instalments, interest being charged on the unpaid portion at the rate of six per cent per annum. Each purchaser, within twenty days of the grant of the plot being executed, will be required to submit to the Town Clerk of Nairobi a plan of the building it is proposed to erect. Moreover, it is a condition of sale that the design of the proposed building shall conform to the architectural specifications of the neighbourhood. It is noteworthy that this is the first occasion on which the sale of Crown land in Nairobi has been accompanied by such a stipulation and the innovation is one that will be welcomed heartily by all who have a love of beauty and orderliness. This we hope will make for a decent standard and a departure from that incongruity in building construction which to-day makes a very big portion of the commercial area of the town such as the architect's eye can see. In submitting his plan, the plot holder must also specify the period in which the proposed building will be completed. Here again Government has reserved the right to notify the purchaser of the final date by which the building must be ready and has the power to reject any plan which for any reason or other, may be considered unsatisfactory. With the exception of two of the plots the buildings to be erected must be of not less than two storeys and must be of a minimum value of Shs. 1,200 per plot. 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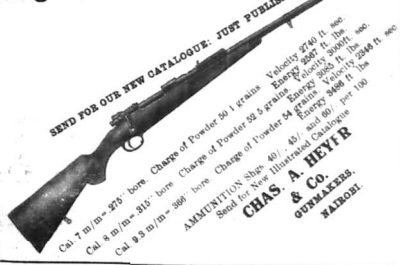
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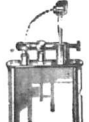
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**Pioneers of Speed.**  
Thirty - Four Years of Racing.

Every year sees an increasing number of Motorists pushing to appear on the literary market. These, with a few exceptions, devote their pages to story-telling by laboratory tests of motor "advice," shod up in a form so similar to their own that the discerning that the average expert usually finds in such articles is a first class piece. "The Motorist," a new publication from (London) Messrs. A. and C. Black, Ltd., London, has been very different.

As the name implies it contains a fund of information on all modern subjects of the subject. In this, together with a history of Motorism, is a subject, all the branches from the very earliest days. Tables of speed and other records, lists of our manufacturers, body manufacturers, necessary manufacturers, necessary specifications follow and finally, statistics, touring information for Great Britain and the Continent, are only a few of the many subjects covered in the 450 odd pages. While the publication as a whole will be of some actual value to motorists domiciled in the Old Country than to those who have to find their way under the Southern Cross, there is still much to be learned for every African owner whose car is more than a year old.

**The First Motor Event.**  
It is generally accepted that the first competitive event to be specially organized for motor vehicles was the "Goncourt des Volvres" in France by the "Paris Journal" in 1864. Each car was required to cover 20 kilometers in three hours (afterwards extended to four hours), and the conditions were that the awarded car, easily handicapped by the fast runner, was the elimination trials, the competition was held from Paris to Metz (700 miles). It can be said that the first prize was awarded equally to the petrol-driven vehicles of Messrs. Peugeot, and the fastest time was made by M. Lemaître on the Peugeot with an average speed of 11.2 m.p.h.

Following this competition a Committee, headed by Comte de Dion (which subsequently became the Automobile Club of France), promoted the famous Paris-Bordeaux-Paris trial of 1889 (afterwards extended to 1895) which saw 45 vehicles entered, half of this number being petrol-driven, and on June 31, 25 vehicles started. M. Levaillant was the first home on a Peugeot, covering the total distance in 2 days and 46 minutes (average speed 15 m.p.h.), with only one day of interruption, lasting 22 minutes. Nine vehicles completed the course.

The Chicago "Times-Herald" edition of 1894 was the first to hold in America under the name of "The Automobile Club of America," and the racing started in 1894. The first race was held in the competing class. A Duryea was the first to finish, in a trial (8 hours, 20 minutes), the winner being M. Duryea. The second race was held in Paris on June 19 (9 hours 35 minutes) in 1896 (the "Paris-Marcigny" Paris race of 1902) which was held under the regulations of the Automobile Club of France. The race, however, was made difficult by the fact that the cars were not allowed to start until they had only 200 miles of petrol left. The first series of attempts, held at Le Mans, was in 1897, and was won by a Peugeot. **Closed Circuit Races.**  
Many road races were held in France in 1899, including the first "Tour de France" which was a closed circuit of 1,500 miles, with a total time of 10 days and 16 hours, 30 m.p.h. or so. **The English trials.**

The frequency of record-breaking attempts grew in step with the opening of various national racing tracks on the Continent, notably up to Paris, which it is said to be up to speed of over 100 m.p.h.

**During the 200 M.P.H. Mark.**  
Short-distance road attempts over the sands at Pauline, California, in 1924, by Messrs. U.S.A. and France, and, near Capetown, South Africa, in 1924, were the most notable, mostly over the maximum and higher, culminating in the Messers. and Campbell records of 1927-1928, in which 200 m.p.h. was exceeded.

**In this same post-war period** road racing was very popular in America, and a number of notable records were obtained in the trials provided by the Indianapolis 500 mile race, held annually over a difficult 100-mile track. Until November, 1926, American road records were not recognized by the International Union of Automobile Clubs. Consequently, many of the records in Europe were established in France, and in 1926, a record of 107.7 m.p.h. was set by a higher speed for the given distance had previously been obtained in America.
