WORLD'S NEWS.

Rumano-Bulgarian Friction.

Dispute Unsettled.

MEDIATION OF THE POWERS THE LAST CHANCE.

London, Feb. 27. Reuter's Special to "E. A. Standard."

Reuter learns that the Powers complete mediation between Rumania and Bulgaria. There have been many discussions between those two countries on the various complications. The matter has now been referred back to Bucharest. Rumania has offered to recognize Bulgaria if she receives a further extension in the Peace run to Kalmar and Bulgaria refuses, as Rumania which could be proved that that spot contained mines.

Reuter at Bucharest reports that an official statement has been issued which announces that the latest proposals of Bulgaria are inadmissible. Their sole hope now lies in the Powers' initiative in the matter of mediation.

Despite public agitation the Rumanian Government are preserving their unflinching consciousness of their strength. The Government point out that British diplomacy has played a considerable part in the efforts to effect a peaceful solution.

London, Feb. 30. Reuter's agent at Sofia, reports that the representatives of the Powers with the exception of Russia have been instructed to propose to Bulgaria to submit her differences with Rumania to the decision of the Powers.

Reuter at Constantinople reports that the new storms and bitter cold have checked the hostilities during the week these have been no serious developments. It is stated that Bulgarians are experiencing difficulties with regard to supplies.

The Question of Scutari.

London, Feb. 21. The Foreign Office on Thursday said that they were instructed to intimate that Montenegro would rather risk annihilation than accept compromise regarding her Scutari.

Mexico's Ex-President.

Mexico, Feb. 30. President Madero and his brother Gustavo Madero have been imprisoned in the arsenal under General Diaz. Gustavo was almost immediately taken out, however, and shot.

Reuter at St. Petersburg reports that the President was detained at Scutari with responsibility for the deaths of his various opponents.

Franco-Russian Friendship.

THE AMBASSADORIAL APPOINTMENT.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 21. As a further sign of the friendship existing between France and Russia and as an expression of the personal admiration that the Tsar has for Madero the Tsar has appointed Madero with the center of St. Andrew.

The appointment of Madero to the Ambassadorship to St. Petersburg, was announced at the same time delighted Paris as it is regarded as the first step towards the Franco-Russian Alliance. The Tsar's approval of the nomination was the first approval by the Emperor of a Despatched. Through official communications declare that the appointment is not connected with the Tsar's policy regarding the war.

Argentine Maize Crop.

Buenos Aires, Feb. 21. The first official estimate of the maize crop in Argentina for 1912 has been published. It is estimated to be 1,000,000 tons.

Rumano-Bulgarian Friction.

Dispute Unsettled.

MEDIATION OF THE POWERS THE LAST CHANCE.

(Reader's Special to "E. A. Standard," London, Feb. 29.)

Reuter learns that the Powers complete mediation between Rumania and Bulgaria. There have been many fruitless discussions between those two countries on the various compromises. The matter has now been referred back to Bosphorus. Rumania has offered to renounce Bulgaria if she receives a further extension in the Black Sea to Kallakari but Bulgaria refuses, as foris which could be created at that spot would be of no use.

Reuter at Bosphorus reports that an official statement has been issued which approves that the latest concessions of Bulgaria are unsatisfactory. The role here now is for the Powers to initiate in the matter of mediation.

Despite public agitation the Rumanian government are pursuing their sanguine course of their strength. The Government points out that British diplomacy has played a considerable part in the efforts to effect a peaceful solution.

London, Feb. 30

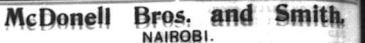

Mawson Expedition.

Wireless Messages Received.
 Two Deaths Reported.

KING GEORGE V LAMP DISCOVERED AND NAMED.

Reuters Telegram to "The A. Standard," London, Feb. 25.

Bruster's agent at Sydney reports news of the Mawson Antarctic expedition. Lata Nimsa and Doctor Miers are dead and Mawson and his other men have turned the relief ship and have been compelled to return to the continent.

London, Feb. 25. A telegram from Lord Denham, Governor of the Commonwealth, has received a wireless message from Mawson via Macquarie Island announcing three deaths and reporting that the names of the party and was following the message sent to Professor David Livingstone received which came from the Antarctic, stating that the party had been most successful with regard to their sledging operations.

It appears that Mawson and his friends missed the relief ship "Aurora" which was on the way to the continent on account of most unfortunate circumstances. They will probably winter in Adelie.

Mawson himself succeeded in the Liverpool General that the sledging party had covered a large area of new land east and west of Commonwealth Bay and that he had obtained important data from a number of stations in proximity to the magnetic Pole. The message concludes "My staff and myself have been unavoidably detained several days, but I am glad to be able to say to be transmitted to His Majesty the King."

HIS MESSAGE TO THE KING.
 The message asks His Majesty's permission to name the large tract of territory newly discovered "King George V Land." It was newly discovered on the coast between Victoria and Adelie.

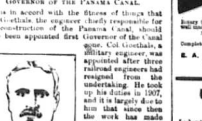

Canadian Navy Bill.

Germany's Heavy Naval Expenditure.

MR BORDEN'S "ONE EMPIRE ONE FLEET AND ONE FOREIGN POLICY"

(Borden's Special to "E & Standard")

The Canadian Commons have passed the second reading of the Navy bill early on Friday morning by 114 votes to 84 (majority 30). "Bones of the Quebec nationalistic who usually vote for the Government for the minority, One Liberal supported the Government, Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Mr Borden, waded up the debate. The former said that there was no reason to believe that Germany's naval expenditures were directed against Great Britain. The expenditures were only commensurate with the growth of Germany's population and commerce. He doubted the probability of an Imperial Conference because it would involve a final agreement between the English nations. Mr Borden in his speech said that there should be one Empire, one fleet and one foreign policy through a representative on the Imperial Council instead of five foreign political and five sectional fleets.

The debate of the Committee stage of the bill will be continued immediately. The Canadian Premier emphasized that he will use every effort to force the measure through.

NEW BILL IN FRANCE.

Paris, Feb. 25

The Government has submitted a bill to the Chamber providing for a law which would provide for the material which was most urgently required to bring the defence to a proper pitch of efficiency within the maximum term of five years. The preamble of the bill declares that recent wars confirm the necessity for nations to constantly maintain their defence on a level with the progress of military science and art. Otherwise, they would drift into a condition of inferiority difficult to remedy afterwards. In further emphasis that it does not involve any additional burden it only anticipates inevitable sacrifices.
