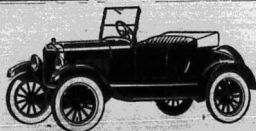

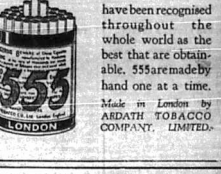

SONGHOOR FARMERS' ASSOCIATION.

Local Views on the Federation Question.

(*STANDARD CORRESPONDENT) Soghoor, January 14.

The last meeting of the Soghoor Farmers' Association, held on December 15, was very well attended, and the ordinary work of a local government institution had come to believe that the work of local government in Nairobi is hampered by the interference caused by Government departments, by the delays surrounding official decisions on matters of moment to the people of Nairobi and by the general attitude of contempt for local representation suggested by the manner in which the local municipalities are treated, which is in some places which has sometimes aroused the relations of Government and the Council. Doubtless of this kind are unlikely to improve relations. Every town in British and in the Dominions is entitled and permitted to take its own decisions, and the maintenance of traffic and protection of life and in many cases speed limits apply within their boundaries without reference to the general policy of the country. There is no reason therefore why the public opinion of Nairobi should be subjected to the arbitrary and grandmotherly whims of a body which is not the Member of Parliament South suggested in its recent speech published in fact which is no account in its functions that even the Budget of the Colony does not even come under its responsibility. We can find time amid the affairs of life to demand the respect of a Town Council for a traffic police. If the townpeople of Nairobi have any real regard for the preservation of their right to be allowed to control their own provincial affairs, they will take immediate steps to influence to Government that their opinions are submitted to some consideration; if they do not do so they are failing in their duty to those they have appointed to represent their views.

We have on many occasions had cause to believe that the work of local government in Nairobi is hampered by the interference caused by Government departments, by the delays surrounding official decisions on matters of moment to the people of Nairobi and by the general attitude of contempt for local representation suggested by the manner in which the local municipalities are treated, which is in some places which has sometimes aroused the relations of Government and the Council. Doubtless of this kind are unlikely to improve relations. Every town in British and in the Dominions is entitled and permitted to take its own decisions, and the maintenance of traffic and protection of life and in many cases speed limits apply within their boundaries without reference to the general policy of the country. There is no reason therefore why the public opinion of Nairobi should be subjected to the arbitrary and grandmotherly whims of a body which is not the Member of Parliament South suggested in its recent speech published in fact which is no account in its functions that even the Budget of the Colony does not even come under its responsibility. We can find time amid the affairs of life to demand the respect of a Town Council for a traffic police. 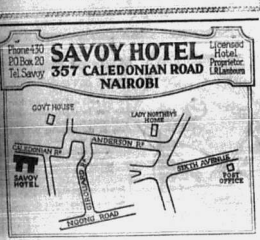

SPED LIMIT AN URGENT NECESSITY.

Surprise at Government's Attitude.

That the Government's decision regarding the suspension of a general speed limit of twenty-five miles per hour for motor vehicles in the public opinion is suggested by the results of the inquiry into the Nairobi Standard representative.

On two occasions the Government has been asked to consider a proposal that such a measure should be introduced, but has never suggested an alternative régime of fifteen miles per hour in the commercial area of the town, with special safeguards at dangerous points.

Views of considerable importance as they may be accepted as representing the opinion of the majority of responsible motorists on this question were given to a Standard Nairobi representative by Mr. J. G. Galton-Frost, the Hon. Secretary of the R.E.A.A.A.

Up to a few months ago, he was opposed to the idea of a speed limit, "he said. "But in view of the large number of accidents which have been recently and which, so far as we are concerned, are attributable to excessive speeding, I regard the introduction of a limit as a matter of extreme urgency. About two years ago, in connection with the police, we approached the Town Council with a proposal for the introduction of a speed limit of 15 miles per hour at the dangerous points. We then decided a maximum limit of 18 miles per hour at the dangerous points, with a general limit of 20 miles per hour for the remainder of the town. It was a matter for great regret that the R.E.A.A.A. has turned down the R.E.A.A.A.'s proposal, so as the result of the decision by the Nairobi recently point to the fact that the average speed is much too fast.

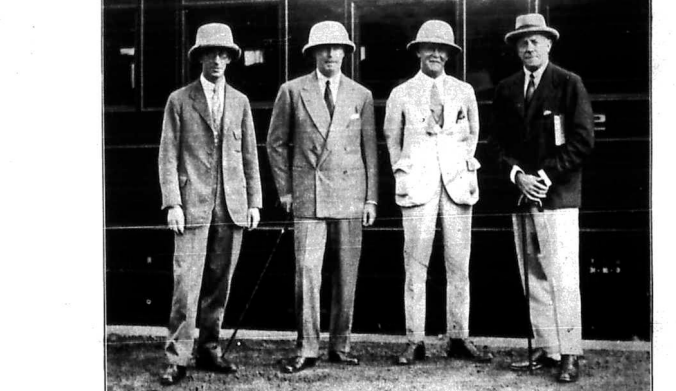

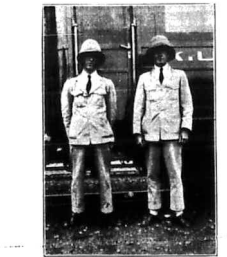

LINKING THE INDIAN OCEAN WITH THE SOURCE OF THE NILE.

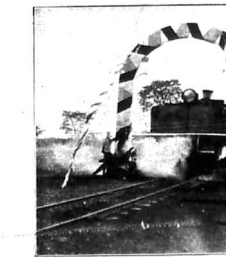
The Kenya and Uganda Railway's first train into Uganda, which left Nairobi January 9th, arriving in Jinja on January 10th, 1928.



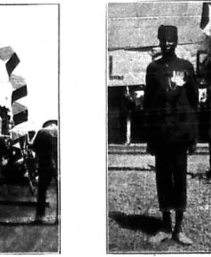

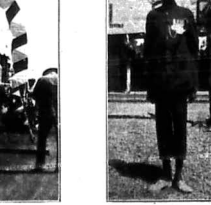

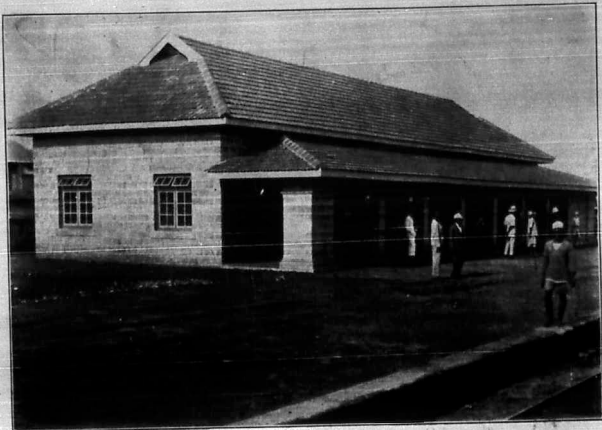

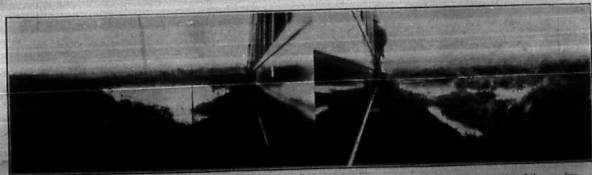

Terrified Natives Make Many Sacrifices.

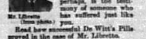

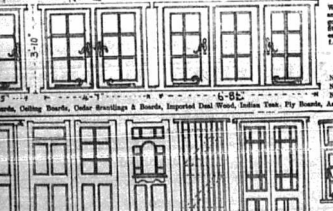

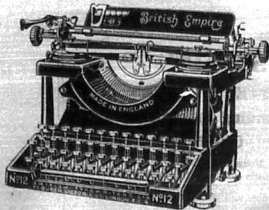
