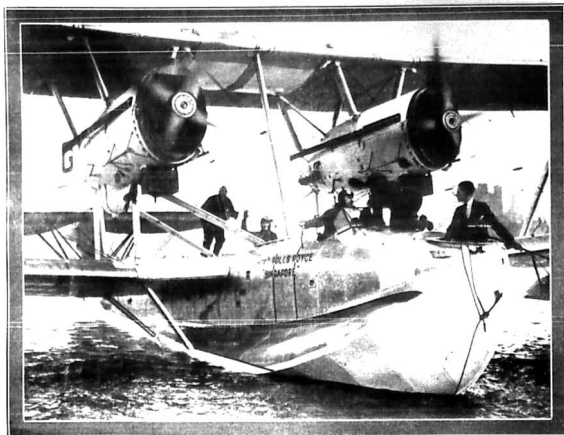

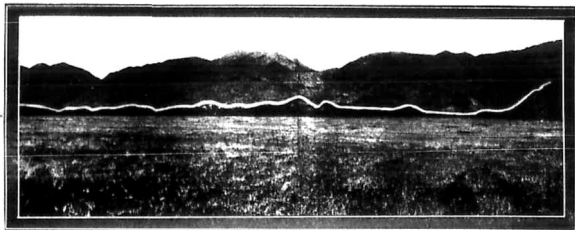

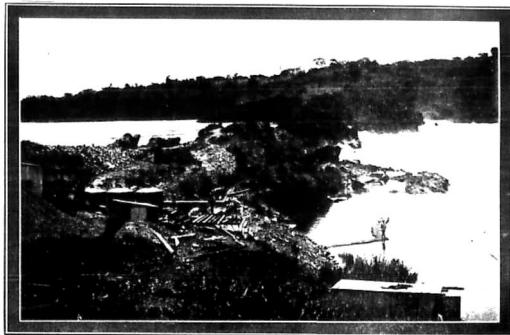

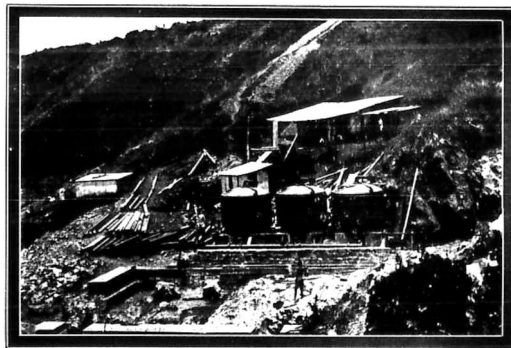

Freed Slaves.

ESTABLISHMENT OF A SCHOOL AT ADIS ABABA

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.]
London, January 17. Inquiries have been made by the Anti-Slavery Society about the progress of the proposed school for freed slaves and orphan children at Adis Ababa, the Capital of Abyssinia, so as to which the British Office appointed the Society last year. Although a building has not yet been erected, it appears that the school is already started as a small model institution brought together under the care of Dr. Martin, being taught to read Amharic, sewing, carpentry and tailoring. The Society is informed that a number of persons interested in the school have set on foot the effect of a mission to about one thousand of their slaves and still-born children. Slavery is described as being "a very difficult and uphill battle." By the way, Lord Balfour, during his duties in the House of Lords, advised a warning with respect to the suggestion that the slave labour should be employed in the construction of the dam in the northern part of the lake. Informal representations have been made to the Agricultural Survey, Dr. Martin, that public opinion in Great Britain would waver with serious consequences any proposal to send this class by slave labour.

Lord Meston had accepted an invitation to associate himself closely with the work of the Anti-Slavery Society, in which he is greatly interested, and is willing to oblige by being a very busy man, to give to the Committee the benefit of his help and counsel. Lord Meston will probably be appointed Deputy-President of the Society.

The toast of the happy pair having been proposed by His Excellency and he honoured by the guests the bride and bridegroom departed for Chwaka in a car, cheerfully stocked with provisions by Mrs. Murray and accompanied with the (including a very special brand of rice sent from home by the bride's family) by the guests.

Mr. and Mrs. Isherwood, having passed their honeymoon at Chwaka, returned to Zanzibar the following Friday and left for Dar-es-Salaam the German steamer the same evening.

An Empire Union.

A DEFINITION OF THE TERM "BRITISH"

London, Jan. 17. General Frank A. Sullivan, M.C., former British Consul in China, was one of the chief speakers at a meeting held at the May Fair Hotel on Thursday under the auspices of the British Empire Union (Incorporated), the President of the Society was the 'Laird' and in introducing the speakers, and opening the meeting he set forth the objects of the Union, namely, to secure matters of vital moment to the Empire and to British subjects throughout the world. In the course of the address he said he was specially pleased to note that no speaker in the different countries of the Empire had gone so unreservedly with our interests as he had done.

Professor Joseph of Alaba had said a very convincing and well-organized speech suggesting every-day should join the Union and "to the Empire. In defining British he said "The British people are those who do their duty with an understanding heart illumined by the Divine Light."

He then made to serve the world "it makes it better. As an example he quoted the work of British subjects in India, who were able by bringing down from hill tops iron and lead, to convert it into gas, petrol, and kerosene, they have done for India what we have got to do not only for the British Empire, but for the world. He was warmly applauded over America's attitude since if America and the British Empire would stand together and say there never had been a war on either nation does not exist. No one, moreover, has been so busy about relations of India who has defined the Indian Empire, the British Empire and the British Empire as inseparably in the mind.

Craze for Slimness.

BAD EFFECT ON THE SWEET TRADE.

London, Jan. 17. The chocolate and confectionery trades are suffering severely on account of the modern woman's craze for slimness. The annual report of the Sugar Section of the Manufacturers' Chamber of Commerce states that the longing to acquire a boyish figure has caused a greatly decreased turnover in these two branches of the trade. Another indication of fashion's effect on habits is to be found in the fact that the importers of sugar candy and refined sugar fell last year over 5,000,000, and as compared with 1925 when women, craving to be slender as they never had, had gained such ascendancy over the natural affections for sweet things.

"Sugar is certainly fattening," remarks a provisionist, "but as a matter of fact, it is not the most important item of the diet for women to abstain from. They would help themselves more by cutting out pastry and potatoes. A certain amount of sugar is essential in an excellent meaty food and women should be warned not to entirely abstain from it. Some of them, I have no doubt, already suffer their avoidance of sugar."

The Municipal Budget.

His Excellency the Governor has approved of the estimate of the revenue and expenditure of the Nairobi Corporation for the year 1926, details of which appear in the Official Gazette.

Kerosene Rebate.
A Bill to provide for the repayment to users of imported kerosene oil for agricultural purposes of an amount equivalent to the customs duty paid on such oil is gazetted by His Excellency in the Kenya Legislative Council.

Commercial Education.

WHAT IS NECESSARY IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.]
London, Jan. 5. Sir Hugo Hirst, chairman of the General Electric Company, speaking at a discussion on "What Commerce and Industry Ask of the Secondary Schools," said that he believed that good handwriting was essential. Arthur D'Almeida, Commissioner of the District and British Islands Colony, in the South Pacific, issued yesterday.

Clothes are now so cheaply associated in the popular mind with civilization that an open grassy area where there would be regarded by the natives as a disgraceful and on religion; they must now be regarded as an indecent and he said the only hope is to procure a habit of cleanliness and good taste in their use. European dress has been used in the colony for a quarter of a century. The distasteful garments worn by women and infants in Africa is often horrible and indecorous."

This assertion that "clothes have contributed in the moral decadence of the natives," is supported by the Hon. A. D'Almeida, secretary of the Malayan Mission, who has been in the South Sea. "In four missions," he said in an interview, "boys and girls are only allowed to wear loincloths. To assist in the habit of cleanliness on the part of those who will wear clothes we give pairs of shorts and trousers to boys. In the native are specially fond of the so-called 'saris'."
