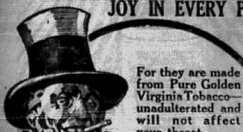

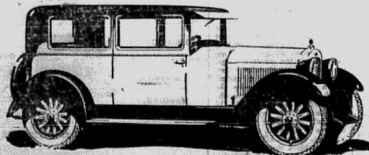

THE SOLUTION OF THE LABOUR PROBLEM.

Better Conditions Needed Than the Present.

Speaking on the subject of Native Labour at the annual meeting of the Nyasaland Colonial Society, Mr. E. H. Sir Charles Bowring, Governor of the Territory, inter alia said:—
Now that our land possesses, especially the native and the coloured, a public opinion, it is approaching settlement, it is in my mind the most important matter to be tackled. It would appear, however, that the Commission has not been so much surprised as they say, and that they simply duplicate information already furnished to them.

Mombasa's View.

That, of course, is Mombasa's view. There is a very small section here, in the know and in touch with the emigrants. They will have a long life of service and will remain old and beefy.

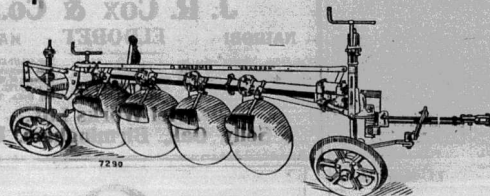

The first large tourist party to visit Nairobi—100 Americans and wives, and members of all kinds and sizes, and dozens of baby carriages—rough coaches—went about six hours in Nairobi and in the center district in the immediate vicinity on Tuesday. They undoubtedly enjoyed their brief visit to this part of Africa. There was evidence in abundance that the tourists had been amused by what Kenya offers and the general opinion was that the long trip from the coast was well worth it.

The tourists left New York on the specially-chartered "Queen of the Lakes" on January 14, calling at England before setting off on their cruise round Africa. Excursions similar to the one into the heart of Kenya have been made in various parts of the Continent. When it leaves Mombasa, the vessel will sail to Port Sudan and on through the Mediterranean to Gibraltar, finishing at London.

The first batch to travel up to Nairobi left Mombasa at 10 o'clock on Monday afternoon. They were accompanied by the staff of the very quite complimentary about the nature of the carriage and the excellent arrangements.

The arrangements made by the hotel organizers were quite equal to the American way of doing things. Immediately on their arrival at the hotel a selection of the waiting staff was selected to meet the country, while the rest of them spent the forenoon in Nairobi.

By this unprecedented invasion of Americans, Nairobi is naturally interested. It is generally admitted that the Americans are the most up-to-date and progressive of the world. The tourist American is generally regarded as one who is not only intelligent, but also a person of high character and high social position. WAGES OF THE COAST DOMESTIC SERVANTS.

A Higher Average Than the Highlands.

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT. Mombasa, Feb. 22. In connection with the Standard estimate of what native domestic employees earn in Nairobi, it is interesting to compare this with the Coast rates.

The Coast boy is, in fact, much more highly paid than his Nairobi counterpart. It might surprise the housewife in the Capital to know that, in Mombasa, for example, the housewife cannot get a cook for less than 50/- per month (not including the 10/- per month average. Perhaps if you put the average at 70/- per month, the ordinary housewife, their services are valued by the housewife at 40/- per month on the average. This too, may be taken into account in the estimate. Certainly, many people pay their table boys 50/- and 60/- per month and the tendency is for the rate to rise.

Why, even the humble aborigine boy of the Coast turns up his nose at the national pay which he is allowed of that evolution? At any rate, the national pay is not so low and not so much less than that out of the island.

Back Resting.

In Mombasa that, of course, there is some reason for these comparatively high wages. In the first place, the ordinary way of the British and Indian folk have no objection to working long hours. The rest that the boys have to stay in lodgings, the domestic wages are very expensive, from the native's point of view. You are, of course, questioning his own personal saving the money which he has to pay 10/- per month for a small room which he has to share with another worker! And this, he is told, is a most and more of the ordinary arrangement to ordinary rooms. Small wonder that the domestic servants are high wages! The average rate about 50/- per month is a large sum of a mombasa point. Those who would a room to themselves to live in, of course, their monthly "allow" have to pay more, because they are in a more convenient location with its many conveniences, plus the private system of "boarding" introduced in Mombasa, by means of which decent European and Indian houses are being built with servants' quarters as complete. This may serve to reduce the rate, but it is hardly like to do so, since the wages of the domestic servants are, in fact, not so high as the rate established there as a leader. On the other hand, those natives who have to live out are even less likely to be met out any more in cash than those who live in the city. THE EAST AFRICAN WOMEN'S LEAGUE.
President's Report on Work in the Country Districts.
WIDE FIELD OF ACTIVITY.

At the annual general meeting of the East African Women's League held in Nairobi on the 24th inst., the President, Mrs. R. H. Turner, presented the following report on the activities of the League in 1927:

In writing this report for the first meeting of the Headquarters Council of the East African Women's League it is difficult to separate the subjects that have been dealt with by the various local branches that have been formed by the old Central Committee. Reports have been given annually on the work done and it has been my privilege to do so for the last three years, and I am convinced that in time dissemination will simplify the work, that it is for the good of Nairobi to have a separate branch of its own. This branch was formed at a meeting on the 17th inst.

At the annual meeting in 1926 provision was made for the opening up of branches all over the Colony and the formation of the Council was arranged for at a special meeting in April last when an amended Constitution was adopted which is being incorporated into the report of the Chairwoman of every Branch, including Nairobi, and other members who will be elected today, with a President who will be President of the whole League; a Secretary and a Treasurer. This Council will receive the reports of all the branches and will be in a position to discuss the reports on broad lines and to decide upon a definite policy for dealing with the different problems which assail the women and children of a new Colony.

The Branches.

We now have branches established in most districts and we are corresponding with a few districts that have not yet linked up with a view to opening branches during the year. Most of the branches have held their Annual General Meetings and have elected their officers and committees for the year. Mrs. Pittel has sent in a most interesting and suggestive report and the minutes from the Hon. Secretary, Mrs. Hamilton, are all that can be desired. Probably this branch covers one of the most isolated areas in Kenya. Some of its members have much knowledge of the Luo language which is itself well of help to the League. It is very desired to send a Luo woman to be trained at the Punnett Madrasah, Harar. This branch desires that a branch of the Red Cross be started in this Colony, it has also been proposed to link up with the E. A. Nursing Association by subscribing to its funds.

Bugher (including Malindi, Mocha and Nandi) is a flourishing branch with the Headquarters Council has had a good deal of correspondence during the year and which I hope has been of some assistance. The League is very anxious to help this branch to obtain a Resident Nurse from the E. A. Nursing Association and I have every hope of this realization. Bugher had its annual general meeting and election last week; the membership is approximately 40.

FINES, BRANCH (comprising Eldoret, Turbo, etc.) Until this year there were separate branches at Eldoret and Turbo with Mrs. Harvey Anderson their inaugurator of the branch at D.V.P. It has now been amalgamated in the Fines Branch. The Committee of this branch has met regularly.

PROTECTING CHILDREN OF THE COLONY.
Age of Consent to be Fixed at 12 Years.
A NEW BILL.

An important amendment in the Colonial Law is proposed by the new Bill passed in the Legislature. It is especially late in the fact that the age of consent has been raised by the Government in the face of adolescent assaults on children on the ground that the child concerned. The new Bill places the age of consent at twelve years.

The amending clause reads: "Provided that where a woman is under the age of twelve years, her mother shall be deemed to have been entrusted with the custody of the child, and she shall be unable to understand the nature or consequence of, or to consent to, the actual or the receipt of criminal force, and such consent shall not be a defence to a charge brought under this sub-section."

A statement which accompanies the Bill remarks that the number of assaults on innocent natives of tender years is the subject of concern to the Government and that the existing law does not constitute an adequate safeguard against the commission of such offences.


The Present Law.

At the late session at present, it is a good thing to have a change of mind in the law to prove that the women themselves are in a position to take care of their own interests. The age of consent is now fixed at 14 years and seven years of age. It has been held in practice that under no circumstances should the consent of a young girl be taken into account in the case of a young woman who is under 14 years of age.

It is desired in the interests of public morality that young women should be protected from this class of lawless offences. Despite the fact that they are unable to understand the nature of it, it is proposed that the age limit at twelve years.

It is also mentioned that the English law has given this protection to young women up to the age of sixteen years but inasmuch as it is intended that the new amendment should apply to all races without discrimination, it is proposed to put the age limit at twelve years.

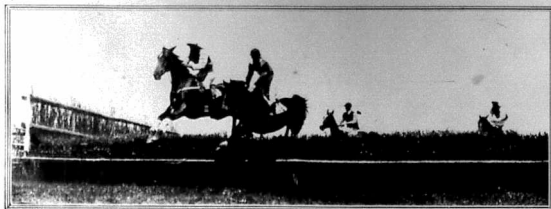

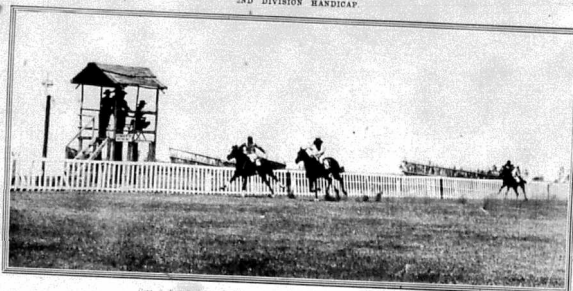

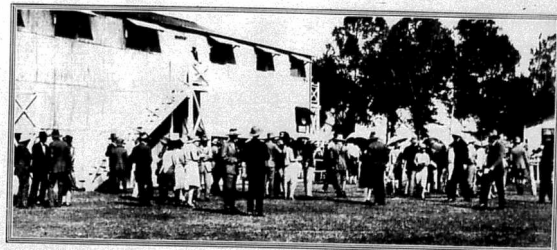

THE SANCTUARY OF THE SUDAN.

Innocent Refugees Not Compelled to Return to Slavery.

Some weeks ago a brief cable announced the publication of interesting documents relative to the position of Abyssinian slaves, who sought sanctuary across the border in the Sudan.

The Anti-Slavery and Abolition Protection Society issues for publication correspondence with the Foreign Office which contains an interesting letter from the Assistant Chamberlain, upon the question of slaves escaping from Abyssinia into British-occupied Sudan.

Sir Angus Chamberlain writes:

"The records of the province of Kassa show that during the last ten years one hundred and seventy three slaves have escaped from Abyssinia to Godesa, a District Headquarters lying some twenty-five miles from the frontier on latitude fourteen degrees. The figure 173 represents registered cases only, and it is probable that other slaves have escaped into the Sudan of whom no record exists."

"Refugees from Abyssinia sometimes appear in the Nosse, Beni Karmal districts of the Fung Province. As a rule such refugees come in parties of two or three or singly, but there have been numbering one hundred and one hundred and fifty crossed into the province from Abyssinia."

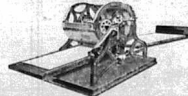
