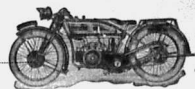

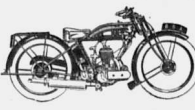

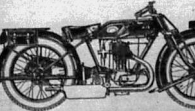

THE IGNITION SYSTEM.

A Few Hints to the Owner Driver.

AN INTRICATE PROBLEM

As every owner-driver will agree, the importance of ignition cannot be over-emphasized. In accepting the responsibility of driving a car can require a knowledge of the intricate problems of the ignition system. The most intricate problems are those of the ignition system, and it is not surprising that many of the most serious accidents occur when the system is not properly adjusted. The common adjustment and the location of fans in the different parts of the ignition system are usually explained in the heavy books of instructions issued by the makers. In the article we are more concerned with the problem of ignition failure.

The Four-Stroke Cycle.

Nearly all auto-valve engines work on the four-stroke cycle. In the first (downward) or suction stroke explosive mixture is drawn into the cylinder. During the second (upward) or compression stroke the mixture is compressed into the combustion chamber of the cylinder. Towards the end of this stroke the mixture is fired by a spark which is made to pass across the gap between the electrodes of the spark plug. During the process of combustion and expansion the ignited gases reach high values. The succeeding or third (downward) stroke is the power stroke in which part of the energy of the exploded gas is converted into mechanical energy and drives the engine. In the fourth (upward) or exhaust stroke the burnt gases are expelled from the cylinder.

The cycle is thus completed in four strokes or two revolutions of the engine, and a spark is needed in every second revolution. Consequently the distributor arm must revolve twice as fast as there are cylinders in the engine. In order to obtain the best results the ignition system must be adjusted so that the spark is timed to occur at the correct instant.

Combustion.

The combustion oxygen is necessary. During the process this combines with the carbon and hydrogen in the petrol to form carbon dioxide and water vapour respectively. To avoid detonation this combination of two violent characters the amount of oxygen must be restricted and the spark must be delayed so that the oxygen is just suited for this purpose.

If the air is much in excess (i.e. mixture much too weak) ignition is feeble and slow, and the addition of benzol—which has higher compressive or detonation resistance—will return a mixture slightly weaker than that needed for complete combustion gives the improved results. With a mixture too rich (i.e. too little air) carbon is deposited, at the same time, owing to incomplete combustion, and carbon monoxide is emitted at the exhaust, while back-fire in the cylinder may occur.

Carbon monoxide gas is something to be avoided. It is a deadly poison, all the more insidious because it is odourless. For this reason it is undesirable to start up an engine in front of an open door closed, for the party who is struggling makes the mixture too

The Ignition System.
