COFFEE INDUSTRY

Planters Warned to be Prepared.

WARNING OF ATTACK

Immediate Steps Necessary in Order to Safeguard Crops.

The coffee industry in the present threatened by a serious menace in the form of swarms of locusts which it is feared may attack some of the oldest planting districts, particularly those close to Nairobi.

The occurrence of such an attack cannot be overestimated since if a swarm attacked a coffee estate the loss would be very considerable.

The Department of Agriculture has therefore issued a statement, signed by the Senior Officer Oport, suggesting methods which may be taken now to order that planters may be prepared to fight an attack. It is suggested that farmers will be well advised to make preparations immediately.

Major measures of locust control are necessary in order to prevent the outbreak in being very serious.

Importation of Pedigree Livestock.
Details of the Assisted Scheme.

The following scheme for assisting the importation of pedigree livestock into Kenya, from the United Kingdom, has been approved by Government and reported by the Kenyan Marketing Board, which body has constituted a committee to advise on the subject.

1. Only those old farmers in Kenya Colony and Protectorate will be eligible.

2. The Owner's Right as quoted in the Customs Law from the United Kingdom to Kikindi will be paid by Government and the Kenyan Marketing Board.

3. Applications will be dealt with in the order of the date of their receipt by the Director of Agriculture. The maximum sum available for this year 1922 is £5,000, and allocations up to this amount only will be made.

4. Approved applicants will be given a certificate from the Department of Agriculture, with a copy to the Trade and Information Office of the Eastern African Protectorate, in Cookspur Street, London.

5. The Classes of Animals for which assisted freight will be provided are as follows—
(a) Cattle—Any pedigree bred or male, fully registered in an accepted herd book in the United Kingdom, providing that it is of a value greater than £50, if over 12 months old, and £20 if under 8 months old at the time of shipment.

(b) Horses—Any pedigree bred or male of an accepted blood recorded in an approved Book Book in the United Kingdom, providing that it is over six months old, and of a value of £10 or over.

(c) Pigs—Any pedigree boar sow or gilt, fully registered in an approved herd book in the United Kingdom and of value £5 or over and at least five months old.

Provided always that any such animals so certified from Kenya and in the case of cattle, have been tested and are cert that they are free from the disease of sheep and in the case of sheep, that they are free from the disease of sheep.

6. The actual cost of insured freight to the place of destination in Kenya, and for an amount equal to the landed cost of the animal. This policy must be taken out in the name of the importer and the proceeds of the policy must be paid to the Kenyan Marketing Board.

7. A notice calling for an amount equal to the landed cost of the animal to cover a period of one year from the date of the arrival at destination in the Colony, and for a special certificate of insurance, and in the name of the importer and the Department of this Colony, and the proceeds of this policy must be paid out to the Director of Agriculture in Kenya.

8. Should a claim for sold be made for the former limit (1) replace the United Kingdom, or (2) refund freight to Government.

9. Any animal imported under this scheme may be required by the Chief Veterinary Officer to pass through the quarantine station in Kenya for purposes of examination or testing for disease before proceeding to the destination.

10. No animal imported under this scheme may be disposed of by the owner within one year after the arrival in the Colony, except under a permit first obtained from the Director of Agriculture.

11. It shall be a condition that any applicant for this freight for a horse must first undertake to fulfil and pay a deposit book on his farm if one is not already provided, unless he shall have entered into an agreement enabling him to use a dipping tank on an adjoining farm. He will also register the animal in the East African Stud Book.

12. The papers in connection with the animal including—
(a) Health Certificate.
(b) Certificate of value.
(c) Registered Number in the Herd Book.
(d) Transport Insurance policy.
(e) Evidence of arrangement of freight and expenses in order to comply with the above

cases of the last stage of paragraph c.

will be introduced to the Trade and Information Office of the Eastern African Protectorate, London, which will retain Transport Insurance Office and report immediately to the Department of Agriculture if all conditions mentioned prior to shipment have been complied with.

11. Maintenance of the freight paid will be made by the Department of Agriculture in Kenya on that Department's policy which the animal has been fully landed in the Colony, and the proceeds of a satisfactory report from the Trade and Information Office and report immediately to the Department of Agriculture if all conditions mentioned prior to shipment have been complied with.

Applications for allotments under the 1922 Scheme should be forwarded to the Director of Agriculture, and those the total estimated value of funds is only half that of last year, early application should be made to ensure success.

MISSING FRAGMENTS FOUND AFTER 25 YEARS.

During excavations 25 years ago on the site of the Boston camp at Humberston, near Bishop Auckland, Durham, portions of a lost battle of Bannan were discovered.

These were put together and the fragments were reconstructed at the British Museum.

Recently Mr. James McIlroy, a member of the Newcastle Society of Antiquaries, was working at the camp when he discovered fragments of pottery which have been found to be the missing portions of the bowl now in the possession of the British Museum.

One fragment bears the name of the potter, "John of London," an indication that it was made in the early in the second century A.D.





Rearing the Chickens Artificially.

Various Methods in Use.

Foultry farmers, who are using incubators for hatching, do not always have handy help available for rearing the hatched chicks, so the question of rearing them is of an important one. During the dry, warm weather in East Africa it is not a very difficult problem.

If by any means it is very simple. I have only one incubator in use at the present time, so as a rule three hours do not more than forty or so chicks to hatch, even if the incubator has been run at full capacity. The chicks are kept in a box in the kitchen for the first four or five days, after that they are put into the day and back into their bar brooder in the kitchen at night. The brooder has an enclosed compartment and a grass run.

I find the chicks keep quite warm and fit in this. After they are a fortnight old, I show them, they reach all day in the garden, and they are left in the brooder and they are well bedded-down and appear to be perfectly warm and comfortable without artificial heat at all.

Of course this method would not be satisfactory if the chicks had to go into the brooder as soon as hatched. In a case like this I would use the same foster mother but the nesting department is done with strips of blanket to afford the necessary warmth to the chicks. The design of this chick brooder is illustrated in my notes on poultry farming published by the "East African Standard".

This idea will prove that artificial heat and artificial bedding are not as healthy as hen hatched ones. I have even been told that chicks hatched in incubators will not breed! The idea that incubator chicks are delicate probably arose from the fact that numbers of people have had incubator "cases". They run their incubators at wrong temperatures, or put in any sort of egg, or are not strictly clean and sanitary, or cannot tell by the state of the eggs whether they are hatching too much or too little incubator. This sort of person, should not attempt to run an incubator, but trust the eggs to the broody who will always choose more intelligent. While stating that there is no good reason why incubator chicks should not grow into perfectly healthy birds, I would always advise the hatching of valuable eggs under the hen. The temperature in this country will vary so enormously during the twenty four hours that it needs a lot of attention and a very well run incubator to ensure no variation in the temperature of the machine; also chicks reared by hen do not run so many risks of being taken by hawks, etc., as those which are reared about on their own.

Another thing in favour of hen hatching is that eggs which are rather stale, or may possibly have delicate germs, will stand more chance under a good broody than in a machine.

Scottish Home Rule.

HOPE OF REPEALING THE ACT OF UNION.

(WARRANDER'S CORRESPONDENT.)
London, Jan. 30.

Small beginnings sometimes have unexpected results, and it is therefore worth to ignore the Nationalist movement in Scotland. Quite recently a Scottish candidate obtained quite a respectable number of votes, and now Mr. Lewis's success has been adopted as the candidate of the National Party of Scotland at the forthcoming by-election in North Midlothian, Scotland, at 21. Mr. Spence said that in the long run the Scotch would be fighting for her very existence. It is in a partisan sense, waged in the Nationalist cause. It was a of his party was to secure self-government for Scotland, with an independent national status within the British group of nations. When they succeeded in winning a majority of Scottish seats at Westminster they hoped to introduce a one-stage Bill regarding the the 14th of 1707.

There are those all over Scotland who demand for Home Rule, and it was discussed the week at the Conference of the Union of University Librarians at Glasgow. Mr. H. O'Farrell, Glasgow, moved a resolution requesting self-government for Scotland, and the proposal that independent time was devoted to Scottish affairs at Westminster. He said that it appeared that the Empire, the center did it become to obtain self-government for Scotland, and that the whole conduct of Scotland should be vested in a Parliament where too much time was devoted to the interests of London, and its immediate surroundings.

Mr. L. J. Taylor, Liverpool, said that the importance of maintaining latest Scottish national traditions, such as her fame for the strength of her whisky and the way in which she had nurtured her ships. The resolution was carried by a large majority.

Of course Scotland may not eventually think it will make a good financial deal by pushing Home Rule, and in that case we shall hear little more about it. But, the movement is gathering the sentimental support of numbers of the younger generation.
