

THE COFFEE INDUSTRY.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
Sir,—I have just received an interesting bulletin from the Department of Agriculture on experiments on wheat at Scotts Laboratory. The results of this small experiment are exceedingly instructive, and invaluable to wheat growers, but as a coffee grower, it makes me wonder what your Coffee Office is doing, beyond just in the pamphlets on the cultivation of planters continuously cropping our land without returning anything to it. We all know that, even if we continue to be foolish, surely it would be more instructive and useful to us if he carried out similar seasonal experiments of Kibabwa on coffee as has been done for wheat?

Wheat and maize are easy to experiment on, since months or less in all that is required to show results, and there is only one harvest. With plantations crops such as tea and coffee, however, it is at least two years before the measure shows their results in crop, and during those two years picking is almost continual and consequently periodical supervision to avoid mistakes is never ending during that period. Plantation crops, therefore, over all farms crops, should get preferential treatment with mature experiments from the Department of Agriculture, and still more so in view of the fact that coffee is of infinitely more importance in this country than any other crop.

I am not, as might be thought from the foregoing, one of those who export to be welcomed by the Government, for I have already laid down quarter acre experimental plantations of each of the major crops, Phosphates, Potassium, Nitrogen, and control, but I have not yet been able to ascertain if anyone else in the country has done the same, and I know the Coffee Office has not. It is quite possible that before the first two years are out, I shall have been

much damaged, or some foolish mistake by a business during the experimental period, but from the separate picking or weighing of such plots, which is done with the whole crop of coffee must not, might waste the satisfaction of the whole experiment before the end of two years.

Surely it is one of the chief duties of an Agricultural Department, even with such a starved official section as we have, to tackle the problem of artificial means for obtaining results.



Free Wheels Abroad.

Britain the Only Country Developing this Innovation

It would appear from inquiries which we have made that the only country in the world which is developing the free-wheel car is Great Britain. It may well be said that free-wheeling will be done as a matter of course as people will buy more cars and will be getting tired of the British cycle 20, 25, 30, and again it will be only a question of time before it is done.

The New York correspondents report that free wheeling is not done in the United States and a free-wheel device has not been seen in that country.

Our British correspondents inform us that only one country, Germany has introduced itself in free wheels, that being the D.A.P. 14-20 h.p. and 14-70 h.p. D.A.P. Types cars are supplied with an original patented central shaft device.

That one free-wheel device for cars has actually been in the market in France for nearly five years. It has been produced by one of the leading manufacturers in the country, the sales are practically nil. The device is related to the one designed by T.L. made by Messrs. Deardard and Walker, and fitted to the motor order only in certain selected classes and vehicles.

This is a simple and very practical arrangement embodying a certain important advantage in the fact that it will not be liable to be broken when the car is running on the road. Every type of car with the Chevrolet-Walker T.L. wheel, running on gear teeth, the free wheel can be put out of action by a simple movement of the change-speed lever.

It may be observed that the action of this particular free wheel device is rather similar to that of the Bendix type of engine starters. It gives a return, does not function after it has done its work, and is not a gear or in reverse. The helical spring is wound in a direction which tends to free the two portions, with face teeth together with considerable force, and this is done in order to produce the minimum of friction when in reverse motion. Both of these appliances have been on the market for some time and are widely used, and their use will favour with manufacturers and the public.

After outlining the action already taken, the Director turning to consideration of the Bill said that it should be viewed as an emergency legislation designed to meet the needs of the people of the proposed Food Board.

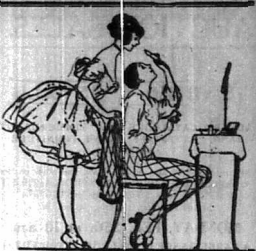

Faults in Receiving Sets.

How To Find Them.

The following is a further contribution by "Q.R.M." on the care and maintenance of wireless sets.

I am now starting a series of notes on faults and their causes which are liable to occur on wireless sets. I shall try to cover as many faults as I can in as few notes as possible. If signals are very weak and distorted and if your H.T. battery is not working properly, the first thing to do is to check the H.T. battery. It is connected round the set and you should be sure that it is not shorted and that it is not getting too hot.

High tension battery no good for it is taking a very heavy drain out of your H.T. battery. It is probably designed for a maximum discharge of about 50 milliamperes and if it is used for a longer time it will be ruined.

I remember being headed out of bed one night to find that the set was not working. I had been half asleep in bed in a vain attempt to get myself to sleep when I noticed that the set was not working.

I propose to guarantee a good set at first and then to deal with some unusual faults which have come my way.

I will begin of all deal with a set which is dead when switching on. First see if the filaments of the valves are alight. If you are using full emitter valves which only just glow it is extremely difficult to tell if they have taken filament especially as the glass is silvered over or "guttered."

If all the valves are good and are switching on no click or rattle is heard in the phone socket for the H.T. battery—probably the set is disconnected, one of the wander plugs has come out or the wires from one of them is broken—rather difficult to trace unless known. All flexible leads should be periodically tested as they are liable to become worked under a terminal break of very slight force leads which are broken also leads on very small connectors. It is best to check your external connections in order that they will be the cause of the last valve and so if the joints are all made.

These are the chief faults which anyone can make whether they be novice or old hand. Very few faults occur in commercial sets beyond those that are self-evident and should a reader not be able to cure his set it is better to recommend that he refer to some of the dealers rather than fiddle about with the set's innards and cause further damage.

But, of course, for the home constructor the many faults may occur and it is half the fun of the hobby especially one has to find out what is wrong.

Every owner of a wireless set should possess a voltmeter and a hydrometer. The voltmeter should be of the "moving coil" type. This is important and when buying one do not allow a moving coil voltmeter to be bought, bringing though its price may be low. I have often been asked when recommending a voltmeter why I insist upon a moving coil instrument. In a moving coil instrument the magnet is mounted on a pivot and turns between the poles of a magnet. The moving coil instrument has a resistance of some 5000 to 10,000 ohms and for a full scale deflection takes some 10 milli-ampere of current. This it will be seen that it does no damage to your battery. Again it is practically dead, but you may not have to wait for the needle to settle down before you can take a reading so you can get a more accurate reading on an old battery.

So much for your voltmeter. You require a double reading voltmeter and reading 0-50 volts and 0-150 volts. The 0-50 scale is used for reading individual cells of the H.T. battery and the voltage of the L.T. battery, and the 0-150 scale is used for the total of the H.T. battery.

The other instrument I need if I was necessary for every set owner to possess was a hydrometer. A simple outfit with a float inside which tells you the specific gravity of the acid of your accumulator and this is the only accurate method of telling if your accumulator is charged when it comes from the garage.

A fully charged battery should read 2.5 volts per cell and it should be recharged when the voltage drops to 1.8 volts per cell. The testing of the voltage of the accumulator should be done with the accumulator in "on" load that is while it is actually lighting the valves and has been on load for about a quarter of an hour for a battery law recuperative covers and even though it is quite discharged it will show a reading of 2 volts per cell if it is not on

load, so it will be seen that a well-chosen set is not an accurate test of the quality of the battery. The hydrometer, however, is accurate. The specific gravity of a fully charged battery should read 1.280 provided it is filled with acid.

Another good sign of a battery being fully charged is the state of the positive plates. The positive plates are a rich dark chocolate colour when fully charged. They should be of a pink dark chocolate not in discharge. Usually charging causes the colour turning to a light brown about the colour of milk chocolate. You can always tell the plates by the method used in charging a battery "up" or "on". But they do show their charge, it may be their fault by charging it too long. If, however, it is most probably the battery's fault. It may be repaired by covering with a white opaline caused by gases through air keeping it charged. A battery whether used or not should be changed once a month. If it is intended to leave a battery out for use for any length of time the battery should be charged and then the acid poured out. If the specific gravity is below 1.180 it is not worth using.

Another sign of rapid discharge is deposit of sediment at the bottom of the battery. If the plates of the battery should be washed out with distilled water and the sediment removed by vigorous shaking. Keep the acid level up above the plates otherwise substituting will occur, and it is very difficult to remove. If the acid has evaporated fill it up to the proper level with distilled water. But if the acid has been spilled then you must fill it up with fresh acid.

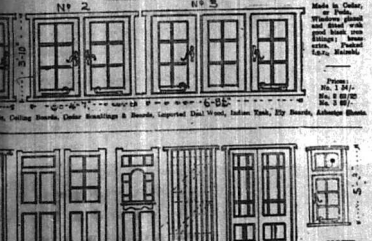

Cape Town To Stockholm Expedition.

Triumph for Chevrolet Cars & Goodyear Tyres.

WASHINGTON ONE'S CAR.

Through almost impassable roads, with weather conditions unknown in Europe, and under a scorching sun and over baked desert sands and across Alpine mountains where hazardous precipices were hidden by snow, we have had a most interesting trip. The Chevrolet truck forming part of this Chevrolet Cape Town to Stockholm expedition, reached Cape Town, August 11, 1926, after five months of tortuous travelling with Goodyear tires that withstood everything without a puncture of any kind, a distance of 7,000 miles.

Four Spare Tires.

Only two spare tires were carried for the truck and two for the Chevrolet sedan. The second set in the expedition. The truck was equipped with Goodyear year 21 1/2 D. P. Pneumatic tires. Five extra tires were carried with the sedan though it carried only two. There were 500 kilometers travelled. There were not one broken spring and repair was only for removal of excess material such as breaks and dents and the incidentals that went with the steering of the engine. The truck carried a capacity load when it left Cape Town on March 17 for the "back" through the Union, Rhodesia, Central Africa and the Sudan. The Chevrolet sedan, factory stock model, owned by the members of the expedition, led by Captain C. V. H. Leary. The trip was concluded close to scheduled date, early in November.

Main Over Roadway.

For 10,000 kilometers in Africa the expedition literally spent most of its time in the mud. It was turned into racking streams when the mud was deep. On one occasion a truck that ordinarily could have been crossed in 15 minutes took four and one half days to complete. In crossing desert stretches the expedition took more the aspect of a "hiby" than an automobile trip. Every 50 meters a win was strung up to form an "unofficial road" for the cars to travel over. Each time the motor was to be introduced it was necessary to pull this winding and try it out again in front of the car.

Proves The Stamina.

The most difficult part of the trip was not in Africa, it was

the hardships experienced there, but was on the Peninsula of Sinai, and thence to the way to Palestine. A constantly moving landscape was encountered and the desert land had had tremendous rains and the ground was very sticky. It was necessary to permit the expedition to attempt to make the crossing until it was convinced of the possibility of success because the expedition was equipped with the Nubian Desert. The expedition followed the main roads, often actually driving on the railroad rails.

After this the engine may be honed, and a gentle stroke directed over all mud and dirt that has been removed, with the aid of compressed air at intervals, the wheels and spindles being cleaned with a brush.

The car can then be taken on to the garage floor of the garage and a bucket of perfectly clean water poured into this. A shampoo leather, which will make the car very bright and clean, should be used.

painted or varnished underneath, the process being repeated until the body is dry. After a short interval a final polish can be imparted with a soft cloth or duster.

Polishes, except on very old, scratched, or repaired surfaces, are invariably temporary. Their lustre being only a temporary nature. For effective removal of grease and other superficial stains, the best and safest way is to use a mixture of Castile soap and warm water as excellent. The soap being so refined, and entirely free from caustic, that it will not damage the paint and surface. But even Castile soap should be used only occasionally.

Plating and burnished aluminum will always look bright if treated regularly with "Tina in Oil" oil. This oil is very highly refined and non-corrosive, besides having a particularly attractive color. After polishing, steering columns, instrument boards, radiators and wheels should be polished with brass polish. These parts may be effectively cleaned with a rag steeped in the oil mentioned prior to the final burnishing.

If, when starting out on a rainy day, "Three-One" oil is smeared on the sides of the radiator, some of those white spots, so hard to remove, will occur and the surface can be instantly wiped clean.

When newspapers require cleaning there is nothing better than Three-One, which renders them clean and transparent, besides being wiped with damp cloth once or twice frequently, be highly polished with plain tissue paper or where this is not procurable newspaper.

There are many so-called body-rejuvenators on the market, but the best way to keep a car bright and spot is to start right and thus avoid premature and costly visits to the paint-shop, which are easily kept at the minimum by a little attention to detail, plus clean water and "Three-One" oil. NYRABLAND TRIALS OF A NEW TYPE.

The Food Control Board.

Yesterday the U.K. Legislative Council passed special legislation designed to deal with the abnormal situation created by the lack of food in the native areas of the Colony. It is stated officially that at least 120,000 natives will require to be fed for five months and that although there is no reason for panic, the situation may get worse owing to the number of the food-destitute population may increase. Unusual powers have been applied by the Government to prohibit the exportation of foodstuffs except under licence and a Food Control Board together with a staff of 100,000—equal to about one fifth of the Colony's revenue budget—to enable that organization to conduct its operations. Although the Government desires to conduct its operations in a manner which does not cause any hardship to the holders of the licence, the Government has accepted the necessity that the interference with normal and legitimate trade be the only means, in the judgment of Government, whereby the full price of the commodities may be met. It was also established during the debate that, apart from national and foreign supplies overseas and to neighbouring territories, there is an adequate supply of maize in Kenya at the moment to meet the present situation. The position, as far as the Government is concerned, is that the Government would most certainly suggest it is not, however, without some official opposition, and an important change in the principles of Government is proposed, that has been suggested, that the Food Control Board should be guided in fixing the purchase

prices by the value of maize as quoted on the London market. Elected members, however, objected to that basis of payment and the Government was obliged after a conference with the licensed holders on conditions of maize supply, the Bill was altered yesterday by the deletion of the basis of purchase and the purchase price will now be fixed by the Board itself after taking into consideration local circumstances not included in world prices. Reputably, the arguments on which this important change was made and the conditions advanced during the private conference, did not enter fully during the debate. Now it is quite clear that no section of the community can be made to suffer financially through the abnormal means of another section and the Government and Colony as a whole must shoulder the burden of providing financial relief. But at the same time, no section of the community can be allowed to exploit the Colony's misfortune and although a reasonable and fair price should be paid by the consumer, for foodstuffs which it is compelled to buy, it is not sufficient to prevent the sellers from making large profits. It is the Government's intention to lay these measures side by side and that all available resources are given profitable work to relieve the pressure on the famine-stricken areas. Properly handled, the situation can bring great credit to the Colony in the eyes even of its critics.

A fully audited statement of accounts. The reputation of the Colony is seriously at stake in the exchange of responsibilities which the Government has thrust upon the Board and there should be no opportunity for either to damage that reputation. It is the intention of the Government to make industry in the section of produce interests principally concerned and it is presumed that representatives of that industry and of the Government will not be included in the Board. The Colony will expect a regular publication of the food prices and the details of the purchases made and these prices will always be open to comparison with world market values. The average price in Kenya has no desire to exploit the situation to his own disadvantage but we feel it is necessary to point out the danger of any misunderstanding which may arise through the operation of very wide powers which only the abnormal situation can justify. Although there are evidences of every kind of opportunity to exploit the situation, it is not possible to suppress such undesirable forms of opportunism. In the meantime Government must play its full part and the Board, district officials and the Native Council, take every step possible to prevent the measures side by side should and that all available resources are given profitable work to relieve the pressure on the famine-stricken areas.
