Good flaky pie-crust needs more care in the making than does plain short crust. A hard fat should be used, and this must be cut into the flour with two knives, or mixed in with a fork. Do not mix it very thoroughly; leave the fat in lumps, which will roll out to make layers or flakes.

Here is another recipe for a smart yet useful dry frock. Developed in bold and mannish-roomer check, black, white, or with a plain fold over skirt, and a straight bodice finished with a braided fur over the hip and a neat collar complete with soft beige silk bow.

Does not seem so rich as that in which a larger amount of fat is used, but the resultant pastry is excellent.

Have a hot oven for baking pastry, especially the flaky kind. Layers of rolls etc. have been incorporated into it, and the hot oven causes the air to expand quickly, making the crust light.

It is well to prick flaky pastries before they are baked, otherwise, it may puff too much in one place. This applies also in pastry shells for tartlets, etc. The lower crust of a pie need not, of course, be pricked.

Here are two good recipes: (1) Six together one pound of flour and one teaspoonful of salt; mix ten ounces of fat with a fork, or cut it in with two knives (do not use the fingers), and add the required quantity of water. Roll lightly and bake quickly; (2) mix flour and salt as above, cutting in the fat, but reserving one-third of the dough; roll out the dough spread with half the reserved fat and roll up like a jelly roll; roll out again spread with the remaining fat, and repeat the rolling process. If necessary, sprinkle with a little flour to prevent the paste from sticking.

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

**Mr. Riddell's Reply a Vigorous Affirmative.**

**TWO MEETINGS**

**Mr Carr Acts for Some Information**

Nairobi North station was again given the opportunity on Friday of leaving the waves of two of the progressive candidates for election to the Legislative Council. Mr. Riddell held a meeting on Friday afternoon at the Railway Club and Mr. Ernest Carr addressed a large audience at the Park Hotel before the meeting.

At Mr. Riddell's meeting the chief was taken by Mr. J. Jones. In his opening remarks Mr. Riddell mentioned that Major O'Brien had referred to people who leave Africa as being better able to represent Nairobi's views than those who come from Glasgow and other places. He himself had been in Africa 15 years, and he claimed that he knew it fairly well. He also referred to many of the notable figures, including Dr. Livingston who had come from the neighbourhood of Glasgow and who had done much for Africa. Mr. Carr and he had issued a manifesto but so far none had been published by Major O'Brien.

Mr. Riddell next dealt with Mr. Carr's remarks regarding a water supply for Nairobi and said that his contention was that sufficient water could be obtained at a reasonable rate from the Ruiru supply which was at present being worked on by the Municipality.

Mr. Riddell referred to the case that was put on the Municipal Council and said that in regard to the claim to represent Nairobi which in many ways was better than either Mr. Carr or Major O'Brien. Reference was made to the work which was accomplished by the Municipality during the time that he was a member, and he spoke in a strong terms regarding the Government he said, have been spending a tremendous amount of money every since the advent of the Edward Dragg. He thought the Governor was a good man in many ways, but he suggested that the Government of British in experts had not the country many

thousands of people which could have been used. The Electoral Commission had their eyes to the expenditure. Mr. Robert Morrison had been active today Mr. Riddell believed that the country would have been much further on the road to prosperity and the finger of scorn would not have been pointed at this country as it had been in the past.

**Development Land**

He believed that it was essential that there should be a large amount of land in the country. He considered that the most vital issue before the people of Kenya today, and he referred to the land grabbing and the granting of big timber concessions which had gone on in the past. With more settlement and a lead back to assist the small farmer he could see the country getting well on the road to prosperity. He believed that if there in authority had got down to the serious questions of economic reconstruction the country might have been in a very much better position than was now the case.

Mr. Riddell stated that he had believed in and understood the land law and thought none should be forced to put land on the market but to submit the large farms to the small wage and a large family and it might get out of it. He believed that in many instances the progressive tariffs could be removed but if some cases the tariffs should be kept on for some years yet.

Regarding conditions in the Civil Service Mr. Riddell said he thought that an organisation should be formed whereby civil servants could air their grievances without being criticised if they did so. There was a great many matters that had an organisation could discuss.

**"On the Spot"**

He did not agree with Major O'Brien that he could do as much for the country if he was in England as he could if he was here. Mr. Riddell was emphatic that the man elected for Nairobi North should be a man on the spot. Further witness in connection with the Edison Young 'Beyer' would be collected on the spot and it was stated to have a man who was at home.

When referring to questions Mr. Riddell said that he thought it was essential for the Railway workers to have some kind of association which could discuss the great points about the railway which was improving and doubtless his himself a trade unionist and had been one for years.

A large number of questions were asked regarding the conditions which were in the opinion of Mr. Riddell required before he would leave the country.

Regarding the Detention Force Bill Mr. Riddell said that he was elected to the House of Representatives and he would not be prepared to support the bill as it was presented.

Mr. Riddell closed with votes of thanks to the Chairman and to Mr. Riddell.



**The Mombasa Meeting.**  
The air in Kenya has been stirred considerably by the discussion of the East African Report which took place on Friday at Mombasa and a fresh point has been raised from which the country should be studied to permit a greater clarity of thought, the proper line of action considered necessary by the issue raised in the Report. It is clear from the Mombasa discussion that the issue at stake was divided into two compartments almost entirely, but not completely, separated. In the first place the same committee believe that consideration of the recommendations contained in the African Commission Report is dependent upon the prior solution of the emergency, made by the Commission, that the European Government has regard the door's ultimate self-government as aimed, although his liberators have been open to important pledges made by the Imperial Government. In Mombasa the issue is stated thus: "While admitting that Kenya is not fit for a self-governing Government we would deprecate any attempt to close the door against future aspirations in that direction, but these remarks" which should not be held up as a precedent of any political view which can be regarded as disinterested without prejudice when the same "plans dealing with the economic side of the situation have been given effect to." The bridge

between the two views is formed by the desire of the deponents of Mombasa to determine any attempt to close the door against aspirations for the future politically which the settlers in the Highlands consider of primary importance. The difference of opinion is that whereas the Highlands place their political belief in the forefront, Mombasa is desirous of carrying out economic co-ordination in the first instance, leaving the political controversy to be discussed at some future date, although in agreement with the justice of the opinion as to the right of the African people to political freedom. If that single desire of a right to the country, the result of the Mombasa meeting could only be viewed with indignation, that we believe that the factor will be removed in the near future in the form of a declaration by the Imperial Government withdrawing its former pledge. Nevertheless, there remains a serious difference between the two views and it rests with the country itself whether it will continue to be carried on far as to result in a split. In our view it would be unwise, and it is certainly unwise, to raise the political issue as an internal opposition until the view of the Imperial Government has been declared.
