an engine. There are many technical terms which scarcely come within the scope of this article. Some cars have P.M.P. painted on the side of the engine, which means that a car is fitted with four wheel brakes. In other words, with at least one brake on each road wheel. Many cars of only a few years ago had brakes on their back wheels alone, but with rear-viewing speeds year by year, designers have been compelled to provide means of pulling up more quickly. This is accomplished by means of the hand of cars, though nowadays, many cars have all wheel brakes, the use of one sign is not at all general or really necessary. When an engine idles or runs at low speed, it is advisable to retard the ignition. The ignition system from which a spark is applied to the vapour created within the cylinders, causing an explosion, and forcing down each piston in turn, so providing motion which is transmitted directly to the road wheels. The spark is produced by means of a magnet, the same gives to a special form of electrical machine which generates current. When the ignition starts owing to the time required for the gas in each cylinder to burn effectively the spark is timed to come instantaneously before the piston reaches T.D.C. (top dead centre). The spark is the apparatus which forces the piston from the cylinder is usually made to take place slightly before the piston has finished its upward path. Piston slap is a phenomenon which will be caused when pistons are made slightly smaller than the full diameter of the cylinder bore to allow for the expansion of the metal when hot, or when, in the course of the work, the pistons have worn themselves out of shape. The slap is caused by the piston being up against the cylinder walls.

"The Mixture" It is as if to start with some gas to feed the combustion before the engine is turned over by hand or by the electric starting motor. 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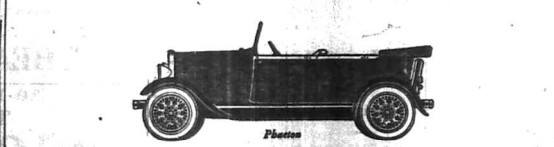

**HASTY JUDGMENT ON CLOSER UNION DANGEROUS**  
**Needs More than Usual Deliberation.**  
**THE PREMIER'S PROPOSAL.**

Following is the text of the letter signed by seven peers, which was published in "The Times" on February 20 proposing that the closer union should be sent to a Joint Committee of the House of Lords and the Government. The Government has not yet replied to the letter.

On the same day "The Times" published a leader commending the proposal and declaring that the existing system of administration in East Africa has nearly exhausted its capacity for progress.

The Peer's Letter:

The letter by the seven Peers reads:

The question of the future government of the British territories in Eastern and Central Africa, of which attention has been directed by the Report of the Commission on the Closer Union of these Territories, is one which deeply affects the future of the Empire. It relates to an area of upwards of a million square miles with great potential resources. It is bound up with the question of the best principles which in the light of past experience and changing administration should govern the conditions of subject races throughout the Empire. It affects the relations between India and the rest of the Empire. It involves the international relations of this country, inasmuch as more than half of the area of the three northern territories is held under a Mandate from the League of Nations. The problem for which a solution has to be found in East Africa is linked up with the wider problem of the relations between the white and black races throughout the African continent.

A question affecting such large and varied Imperial interests clearly calls for more than usual deliberation. The broad principles of policy on which the government of these territories ultimately should be based are matters on which the nation must make up its mind. It is essential that all parties in the House and also the constituent bodies of the committee in East Africa should be afforded the opportunity of public opinion both in this country and in East Africa on the issues raised by the Report of the

Commission. When, in the light of such discussion, His Majesty's Government is in a position to make a firm declaration of policy, such pronouncement should be made in a debate in Parliament.

As a means of ensuring that policy in regard to East Africa should be made in a debate, it offers a national policy committee, which would be empowered to consider the proposals adopted in connection with the closer union, offers a valuable precedent. After the publication of the Montagu-Chelmsford Report, and the recommendation of the Southborough Commission and the receipt of dispatches from the Governments of India giving their views on these proposals, the draft of a Bill concerning the Government of India Act was prepared, and after introduction into the House of Commons was committed to a Joint Committee of both Houses. Similarly it has been decided that, after the Statutory Commission at present in India has reported, His Majesty's Government will make proposals for consideration by a Joint Committee of both Houses. The questions to be determined in East Africa are second in their importance for the future of the Empire only to those of India, and it seems to us desirable that any proposal, constitutional or administrative, which is embodied in a draft Bill or draft Orders in Council, be submitted for consideration and report to a Joint Select Committee of the two Houses of Parliament, or that some other equally effective means should be adopted to secure that they are subjected to a careful public scrutiny.

In the course of its leading article "The Times" said: "It is six weeks since the Report of the Commission on Closer Union of the Dependencies in Eastern and Central Africa, to give the Hilton Young Commission its full title, was presented to Parliament and published in its entirety. In the first place, it has been immediately affected by the Government of the Colonies, and by the local committees or their representatives. Messages from our East African Correspondents from time to time have reported some of the movement of opinion stirred by the Report. In this country, apart from some com-

plaints in the Press, there has been no public discussion of the principles upon which the Report has been framed or of the merits of the Commission's proposals. A fortnight hence a motion by Lord Lugard in the House of Lords will bring them for the first time into the field of Parliamentary discussion. This is not long enough for the general assimilation of the proposals, and the discussion of their merits. It is an argument, and measurement of consequences and for the consideration of such differences as may arise, or in the case of the importance between the Chamberlain and the Montagu-Chelmsford Commission. Much more time must be necessary before the time for the introduction of legislation in a settled scheme for the future of the East African territories can rightly be said to have arrived.

For some delay cannot reasonably mean disappointment. On the contrary, public opinion would be surprised and disturbed only by precipitate undertakings of any kind in East African affairs. There is therefore liberty to be general agreement with the main purpose of the letter that appears this morning in an adjoining column.

The signatures advance a proposition borrowed from recent Parliamentary practice in Indian affairs. They suggest that any changes to be proposed should now be embodied in a draft Bill, or in draft Orders in Council, as the case may be, and referred to a Joint Select Committee of the two Houses of Parliament. They do not put this forward as the only procedure conceivable, but rather as follows the best and most expeditious procedure. Whatever the reasons, there can be no objection to the end-to-secure that, through and mature public inquiry into any reforms proposed before any commitment of policy is accepted. The Commissioners have reported in such terms as whether their recommendations are acceptable in whole, in part, or not at all, have no other course open. They are aware that progress in the matters mentioned is broad for inquiry entails, in the first place the determination of the Commissioners themselves believe that the value of any practical measure to be adopted depends upon a settled definition of long-range policy. The reasons which induce the Government to appoint a Commission confirm their view. The existing system of administration in East Africa has nearly exhausted its capacity for progress.
