Mr. T. A. Wood stated that he understood Government would be in agreement with the City Square site.

**THE POULTRY WORLD.**  
**THE AUSTRALORP.**  
**Two Distinct Varieties.**

A correspondent writes to me asking for the standard of the Australorp. This breed has only recently been accepted by the Poultry Club and the Standard of Perfection is not yet a part of it. I have the standard condensed in the back of my book. The latter mentions that there are two varieties in this country: "some more or less like the 'Dutch' variety, others much longer in the back, and also more a drooping tail, especially in the male birds."

The Australorp is described thus: "The Australorp is undoubtedly, in my mind, the old type of Orpington that is being done down to that type, being done head and wide in the body, feathered and curly. This narrow bodied Leghorn or Minorca pattern is hardly the type. The tail should be short and compact, and the neck should be medium in length the extreme as well as the throat should be avoided. It is dangerous, and a little high should show, with the deep front and wide body are no deep. Reverse leg with one every foot is an undesirable excessive symmetry. Symmetry and balance are ideal, and a bird that is all body and no leg—over all legs and no body—cannot be of any value. 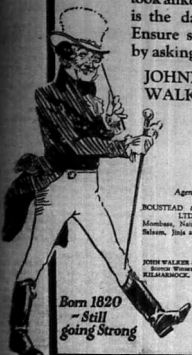

(2) As the present waste spaces round National become occupied and transportation replaces the present road levels, the dust of Nairobi will disappear and noise can be maintained by traffic control.

(3) The City square provision entails expense. (4) The City square is infinitely more easily accessible only to the general public but by the majority of the Civil Service working in a central Government office.

(5) The initial cost and value of the land in the City square is as nothing to the actual saving out in time and transport to the general public who would have to travel on business to the offices far away from the Town.

(6) The scrapping of Sir Herbert Baker's plan is unobtainable but cannot be helped.

Allowing that Nairobi must and will be a far greater Town than it is at present and that who are present distant now may in the course of years appear so not a few interesting but beautiful buildings of modern Town Planning, it seems wrong to scrap, although in a rough way, the only error of South Africa and Australia both of which would probably not have happened if politics had not complicated the question.

In speaking in support Mr. Hargrave said that he thought everyone felt strongly that every effort must be made to bring about the necessity for the Central Office being situated in the City Square.

The motion was seconded by Mr. V. Baban. The Chairman (Mr. F. A. Wood) said he had recently attended certain meetings from which he had drawn the conclusion, which might or might not be correct, that Government would be in agreement now with the original Office being in the City Square.

Opposition. Mr. C. B. Anderson said he was surprised at the Chairman's remarks as he did not think it was

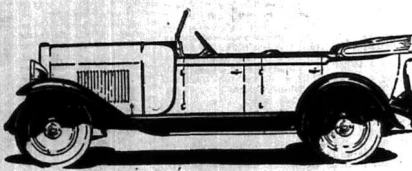

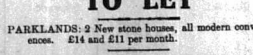

**Telegraph Deposit Accounts.**  
LEDGER FEE CHARGED BY POST OFFICE.

According to the Telegraph Bureau, 1922, a Telegraph deposit account may be charged for the rate of Rs. 5/- per month by the Post Office. This fact became evident during a discussion on the subject by the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce at its meeting on Thursday.

The Secretary said that he had made enquiries from the Postmaster General in London with the subject in order that the meeting might have had information on the subject. The P.M.G. had sent the following reply:

"With reference to your letter of the 15th instant on the subject of Telegraph Deposit Accounts, I have the honour to forward herewith details of the conditions under which such accounts may be opened. Telegraph deposit accounts are usually used for numerous small transactions and require a number of banking transactions, and it is customary in Post Offices in other countries to charge a ledger fee for the same."

**The Editor.**  
The following copy of the Telegraph Bulletin, 1922, was read by the Secretary:

"Deposit account may be opened by persons who are unable to send telegrams without prepayment. A charge of 5/- per month shall be made for the opening each account. The amount of the deposit required in each case shall be fixed by the Postmaster General and shall be based on the estimated cost of telegrams despatched over a period of three weeks. The Postmaster General may accept a Bank's guarantee in lieu of a cash deposit.

On assuming possession each month will be credited into four periods and at the end of each period the amount due from the depositor showing the total amount due from him and to the first period's account the monthly charge of five shillings will be added.

Telegrams will not be accepted without prepayment if any account is opened and the later office may refuse to accept telegrams without prepayment if the cost of them would exceed the total amount due from the depositor to exceed the amount deposited in the limit of any Bank's guarantee given. ### New Gadgets For the Motorist.

#### ADVANTAGES OF AUTOMATIC BRAKE.

Mr. C. G. Galbraith, Secretary of the Nairobi Water Supply, was again discussed and it was decided to submit certain questions prepared by Mr. Carr to the Town Clerk.

Following discussion it was decided to write to the Commissioner of Lands asking what town plots were available and when it was intended to proceed with the sale.

On the motion of Mr. Bergman it was decided to ask members of the Legislative Council to ask Government what steps were being taken relative to the publication of an Auditors report.

Following the receipt of a letter from the subject of the Institute of Messrs. A. & B. Sub-committee, the matter was discussed in a special afternoon session, including a special charge, were discussed.

Memorial Hall. The following questions were recently submitted to Mr. C. G. Galbraith, Secretary to the Management Committee of the Memorial Hall.

(1) Who vested the Colonial Plot and including in a trust and in whom is the trust responsible?

# UNION OF THE CHURCH IN SCOTLAND.

## Basis of Agreement and the Principles at Issue.

### GREAT OCTOBER SERVICE.

#### World Wide Broadcast of a Historic Assembly.

The Union of the Scottish Churches which will be constituted at a historic gathering in St. Giles on October 2, is the subject of a world-wide Thanksgiving Service on the night of 6, in the pulpit of the following service, and will be followed in a brief review.

The basis of the Union is explained in its broader aspects, the safeguarding of the spiritual and material independence of the Church without sacrifice of its loyalty to the Crown and the National responsibility.

The Act of Union will be signed in St. Giles in the presence of H.R.H. the Duke of York, representing His Majesty the King, and a joint meeting in Kenya of holding nearly the whole white population of Kenya will follow. Attended by representatives of eleven million Protestants. The Archbishop of Canterbury will be present.

#### REMARKABLE UNANIMITY.

(Signed by the Moderator by the Rev. B. O. McClelland)

The early conferences met in an ultra-conservative frame of mind. As one of the leaders has recorded: "We agreed from the very first that this Church is to be a broad national Church, history for a purpose." #### Basis of Agreement

These arrangements proved acceptable to the U. F. Church and in 1920 the various house groups, definite committees were appointed to negotiate a union. The details took three years, but remarkable unanimity was preserved. The final proposal, passed in May, 1922 by both Assemblies after reference to the people, consisted of the following: The "Enabling Act" is a Union Act passed by both Assemblies on the 26th of June 1922. The Constitution incorporated the proposals of 1907 and an Act of the U. F. Church in 1909. Liberty of conscience is guaranteed, and no one is obliged to accept in principle (involving a complete arrangement) and a final statement and Formula to be used in the future. All members of churches in which a majority had been in the past, are to be retained under the most elaborate safeguard.

#### Securing the Unity

The "Plan" goes into details which cannot be discussed here, concerning the arrangement of Church Funds, Finance, Assembly Committee, and such matters, etc. etc. Four points may be noted:

- (1) The Assembly Synods and Presbyteries all consist of lay members, and all hold office. In few churches is the position of the lay members so well secured.
- (2) The Lord High Commissioner is to be invited, but not as such, as a permanent member of the Convention.
- (3) Any congregation professing to remain in a party's constitution, but without altering the present constitution, may do so, but it is a simple declaration to that effect.
- (4) The Theological Faculties of the four Universities removed as the gift of the Church will pass from the towns and vestry persons to a Board representing both Anglican and such interests.

CO-OPERATION IN THE DAIRY INDUSTRY.

Pooling Arrangement by Colony's Creameries.

NAIROBI'S PRICE INFLUENCE.

Strange Collapse of Promising Native Co-operation.

Lumbwa Creamery has attained its majority. It stands to-day as a striking example of sound co-operation and good business management in Kenya's dairy industry.

After 21 years experience, Lumbwa Creamery pins its faith to co-operation. It is extending the principle to embrace the other creameries in the district.

To eliminate the "intense competition" among the creameries for the local market, the pooling of losses on butter would, say experts, below the fixed price, has been extended. By the new arrangements the monthly total proceeds of each of the three creameries are pooled and then allocated to each creamery in the ratio of its production over the period.

The Nairobi market, however, largely governs the general price elsewhere. The butter of farmers who are outside the pool is thrown on the Nairobi market and the creameries are "met with the most severe competition which can only be met by competitive prices so long as there is any large body of outside suppliers."

Lumbwa appeals to outside suppliers to join the co-operative movement. One of the most interesting disclosures relates to the collapse of the supplies from natives, who were paid on the same basis as European suppliers. After six months, enthusiasm waned, although 70 natives were drawing a total of over £250 a month. The real cause given as being the lack of technical supervision to the native which should have been forthcoming from Government. Appeals to Government by the Creamery are said to have received no support. Another reason was the departure on leave of the District Commissioner, whose personal interest would much to back up the work.

THE OUTSIDE SUPPLIER.

The month's annual general meeting of the Lumbwa Co-operative Society of B.E.A. Ltd., was held at the Bangalore Hotel and the District Commissioner, Mr. H. J. Currie, Chairman of the Board of Directors, presided and was representative and well attended. The balance sheet and accounts for the year ended 31st May 1929 were presented and passed. The Chairman reported that the business of the Society had prospered and after a long and interesting discussion a large number of members had been added to the Society. 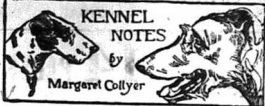
**WEALTH IN SHEEP.**

### KENNEL NOTES

by Margaret Culliver

*Miss Collier, Oxford, to whom all correspondence in connection with "Kennel Notes" should be addressed, is not responsible for accuracy of statements made by her which are in the main, based on information supplied by correspondents.*

Mr. Jackson of Adelaide writes to tell me that her Airedale dog was suffering from nose bleeding and she had seen the second letter. Almost certainly his dog's feet are the same kind of infection on his tongue.

I have thought a lot about this thing by the description of the nose bleeding. This was described as acute, not bloody mucus. Bleeding from both nostrils usually says that the parasite "Pentastoma Pastorelli" would account for it.

The only other thing that this disease could possibly be is Urticaria. Onset is in connection with copious and decayed teeth, it is the first thing that nose-bleeding could be accounted for.

I want Miss Jackson to read the following description of this disease and let me know if it is accurate and descriptive account of the dog's condition, when the last letter was received. "Induration and necrosis of the gums of the mouth in general seen in delicate, weak and anemic looking dogs and is associated with the presence of decayed teeth. It is seen, however, in a small proportion of cases where the teeth are perfectly sound and where the animal appears to be in fairly good health, especially when they are recovering from acute or sub-acute disease. Such as distemper, etc."

It is still a question whether it is infectious, but if not, it certainly affects a certain number of animals at a time.

Urticaria Stomatitis is also seen as a symptom in urticaria, inflammation, hemorrhagic gastro-enteritis, and in certain cases of poisoning, particularly mercurial. A simple case of urticaria without any other treatment or a weak urticaria condition, may become an acute case of Stomatitis.

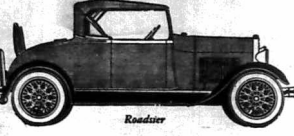

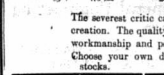

**Port Traffic.**

**ALL ROUND INCREASE FOR LAST YEAR**

A memorandum containing statistics in regard to the shipping, etc., at the Port of Mombasa for the first six months of this year, compared with similar figures for the corresponding period of 1928, has been issued by the Acting General Manager of the Kenya and Uganda Railway. It shows a percentage increase of 49.25. A decrease of 25.50 per cent. is shown at the Lighterage Quay and a decrease of 31.79 at the Cold Port. (Market handled 22,096 tons in 1929 compared with 207,700 tons in 1928, the increase being due to coal imports. Coal oil imports increased from 7,610 tons to 12,669 tons. 729 tons were transhipped at Shikanda; the increase of five tons of explosives was transhipped from 'Lighters at Fort Belia (Flora Point). The total imports at the Port of Mombasa were 501,437 tons in 1929, compared with 146,901 tons in 1928.

**Export Increase.**

Exports dealt with at the Deep-water Quay showed a percentage increase of 20.67, and at the Lighterage Quay a decrease of 1,820 tons. Mineral deals with 1,522 tons in 1928 and 2,351 tons in 1929. The Cold Port dealt with 9,181 tons in 1928, and with 4,057 tons in 1929. The total exports from the Port of Mombasa were 400,781 tons in 1929, and 190,442 tons in 1928.

**Shipping Figures**

The total number of vessels of over 400 tons N.T., which entered the Port of Mombasa in 1929 was 291 and in 1928 277. The number of vessels of over 400 tons N.T. berthed at the deepwater quay in 1929 was 71, and in 1928, 101. The percentage of vessels which came alongside during 1929 was 27.20 and in 1928, 36.46. The total net registered tonnage of vessels of over 400 tons N.T. which entered the Port of Mombasa was 918,719 tons in 1929, and 652,228 tons in 1928. The net registered tonnage of vessels of over 400 tons N.T. berthed at the deepwater quay was 325,272 tons in 1929 and 453,815 tons in 1928. The percentage of tonnage which came alongside during 1929 was 35.80, and in 1928, 55.90.

**EAST AFRICAN RECIPES.**

**"COOL SWEETS FOR HOT DAYS."**

(By a Kenya Housewife.)

**Pinapple Pan**  
Line a greased and floured tin (a round sandwich-pan will do) with short crust pastry. Cut out a round of white butter paper to fit over the pastry, and fill the hollow in the centre with rice. When the pastry is cooked, remove the rice and paper, and while the shell is cooling prepare the following mixture: Grate a medium sized pineapple, taking care to last none of the juice. Mix one and a half tablespoonful of sour cream to a smooth paste with two tablespoonful of cold water, and add to the pineapple and rice. Bring to the boil and add a teaspoonful of butter, a dessertspoonful of sugar, and the beaten yolks of two eggs. Place this filling in the pastry shell. Whisk the whites of the two eggs to a stiff froth, and spread over the filling. Bake the remainder in a puff oven for half an hour, sprinkle the whole with sugar, and decorate with almonds or cherries. Return to the oven for the egg white to harden. Serve cold.

**Pineapple Mound**  
Cut up one or two pineapples into small pieces, and to the juice add enough water to make a syrup. Heat the juice and add two tablespoonful of sour cream, (previously mixed to a smooth paste with a little cold water) and stir and cook until the mixture thickens before putting in the pieces of pineapple, sugar to taste, and two or three tablespoonful of cream or milk. Cook until the fruit is soft. Then turn into a mould raised with cold water, and when cold serve decorated with a little cold cream and crystallized rose petals.

**Orange Froth.**

Put one and a half tablespoonful of powdered ginger into a bowl, half a pint of cold water. After half an hour add the thinly pared rind of two oranges, three table-

spoonful of sugar and the juice of one orange. Cook over the fire until the gelatine is quite dissolved. Then whisk and leave to cool. When it is almost setting, whisk in the whites of two eggs and two tablespoonful of cream. Turn into a mould to set and before serving garnish with orange quarters, rolled in sugar and powdered gold-leaf.

**Apple Whisk.**  
Put two medium-sized handfuls of apple juice in enough hot water to cover, and allow to soak for at least an hour. Put this in a small pan, with sugar to taste, and three cloves. Now gently add the lemon rind and the cloves, and squeeze the fruit through a sieve or colander. Add more sugar if necessary, and allow to become cold. Whisk the whites of three eggs to a stiff froth and beat them now for apple pulp, whisking until the whites are set and frothy. If preferred, the apple pulp may be placed in the bottom of a shallow greased tin and the white of egg put on top to make apple meringue. Sprinkle with sugar and put in the oven for the meringue to harden. For Apple cream give the pulp in sterilized glass tins, and pipe-shaped ornamental cream on the top, instead of the white of egg. Decorate with sliced cherries and almonds or ground nuts.

**Tipy Oats.**

Place six round sponge cakes in small dishes or saucers. Split them and spread with jam. Cook for at least an hour in a steamer (A small quantity is sufficient). Whip some cream, and place a little on each sponge cake, and decorate with glace cherries. If necessary it is essential, use condensed milk instead of the cream, and browned nuts instead of the cherries.

CO-OPERATION IN THE DAIRY INDUSTRY.

(Continued from page 1.)

The actual figures for the last two years are as follows:— During 1928/29 was 194,522 lbs., as against 242,000 lbs. in 1927/28 or an increase of 50,000 lbs. or 25.1 per cent. In 1928/29, 11,143 gallons in 1928/29, against 10,110 gallons in 1927/28, or an increase of 25,825 gallons.

Expressing the gallons of milk received during the two years in terms of butterfat, we arrive at the following comparative figures. Total butterfat received in 1928/29 was 201,475 lbs., as against 192,788 lbs. in 1927/28, that is, an increase of 16,687 lbs., or 8.6 per cent. This is in favour of the past year or approximately 11 per cent. That has not been the necessity of a

large expansion of our largest supplying area, which materially affected the yields for many months that increase would have been considerably greater.

But in spite of the fact that the quantities of our supplies showed an increase, the amounts actually paid to suppliers was less than that of the previous year by some Sh. 87,566/7, the figures being Sh. 199,208/10 in 1927/28, as against Sh. 228,273/10 in 1928/29. This decrease is, of course, due to the smaller average rate of payment, which works out at Sh. 1.22 per pound of butterfat, last year, as against the recent figure of only Sh. 1.08 during 1928/29.

It will be noted that the fact that the price realized for export butter in the neighbourhood of Sh. 1.184, per pound last year, has not resulted in the same proportion of the three seasons' butter being sold at something like 100 cents of butter, which we have concluded with the other seasons.

hence, the lower prices realized are borne pro rata by all three. One more important factor which contributed very largely to the lower average rate of payment is that the necessary selling price of butter raised above Shgs. 2/ per pound, whereas during the previous year this figure stood for nearly five months at Shgs. 1/9 and we were able to pay to our suppliers a rate varying from Shgs. 2/10 to Shgs. 1/9 per pound of butterfat throughout those five months.

During the year under review our rate of payment varied from Shgs. 1/10 in February to Shgs. 1/10 to May, and in the circumstances I hope you will agree that the average figure for the year of Shgs. 1/17 is a highly satisfactory one.

surrounding districts have learned from the experience of the last two years to appreciate to the full the advantages to be derived from true co-operation, and it has been due to the high loyalty of our members, and to that factor alone that we can look back through such a long and so successful season.

The formation of other co-operatives in the natural order of the development and expansion of the dairy industry is just as essential to the progress of the industry as it is between the individual members of any of them. And it is just that spirit of co-operation which we have striven to introduce and to advance in our inter-recreatory relations; and it is in this relation that we record that our efforts in this direction have resulted in a great advantage being made in the closer inter-relationships of the three undertakings.

You are already aware that a price fixing and pooling arrangement has been in operation during the past three years. This has worked admirably up to a point, but there was always one great defect in that method and that is that it did not in any way stimulate competition for the local markets as between the three enterprises.

Though our system of pooling did mean that no co-operative should obtain a higher price for its products than either of the other two, it still left the door very widely open to intense competition for the local markets, and such competition must inevitably be very detrimental to smooth working or to satisfactory relations, besides having very practical disadvantages.

You Board have, therefore, put their heads together to try to evolve a scheme which, while absolutely fair to all, should at the same time automatically eliminate that artificial barrier on the part of each co-operative to push its products at the expense of the other co-operative undertakings. The scheme was fully evolved and I am glad to say has now been accepted by both Nairobi and Nairobi.

Our supplies having increased the production has naturally risen in sympathy, the comparative figures for the last two years being as follows:— Production of butter in 1928/29 239,058 lbs., compared with 195,722 lbs. in 1927/28.

Production of cheese in 1928/29 16,822 lbs., compared with 40,721 lbs. in 1927/28.

Sales of butter in 1928/29 amounted to 220,048 lbs. or just over eight tons per month at an average selling price of Sh. 1/10, as compared with the sales of 1927/28 of 194,546 lbs., realizing Shs. 2/29 per lb., showing that the average selling price of butter was 35 cts. lower in 1928/29 than in 1927/28.

Cheese sales amounted to 15,497 lbs., averaging Shs. 1/12 per pound, against 40,320 lbs. at Sh. 1/18 during the previous year.

Other Observances. I now come to what I consider one of the most important features of our year's activities, and that is our relations with the other co-operative enterprises in the country.

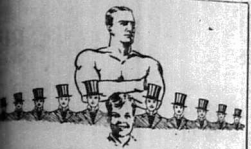

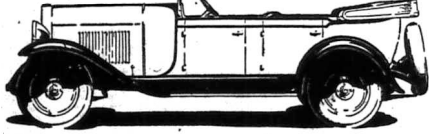

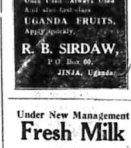

CROPS IN THE NATIVE RESERVES

Satisfactory Harvests Foreshadowed.

GENERAL IMPROVEMENT.

Effect of Rain Adversely Affects Certain Areas.

Improvement in crop prospects in the reserves in Kenya, the Department of Agriculture reports that a general improvement in crops is indicated. Certain areas have, however, suffered from rain, with the result that the harvests in these are still below normal.

Quality feature of the report is the improvement in yield of maize now being produced by the native farmer, even in areas where the yield has not been as usual.

Work on being grown in large quantities in the Coast and the outlook is very encouraging. Great success is evident in the Mamburi district.
