WEALTH IN SHEEP. City Man's Hobby Pays.

LESSON TO PASTORALISTS To depasture 40 sheep, 24 lambs, 4 horses, and 2 cows for more than 18 weeks on sown and a half acre of land may seem incredible to pastoralists, but this was done by Mr. J. C. Marshall, at Nariva, where for the last five years he has successfully experimented with the cultivation of subterranean clover. He has 1,800 acres of land, and expects to keep a stock of 2,000 sheep, and to raise 2,000 lambs this year. Mr. Marshall says that the carrying capacity of the south-eastern territory could be increased twofold with the aid of clover—The Adelaide News.

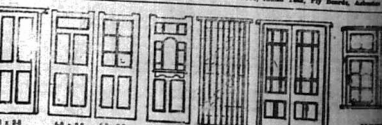

MOTOR CYCLING MATTERS.
Maintaining the Electrical Equipment.
IN GOOD WORKING ORDER.

The success or otherwise of electrical equipment is largely in the hands of the rider himself. Says "Bicycle Day in the Motor Cycle" and a study of the instructions and advice embodied in this article should go far towards enabling him to experience the trouble-free service that it is designed to give, but which is not always obtained.

Both dynamo and magneto must be kept scrupulously clean and free from oil, dirt, and petrol. The last-named is a veritable bane to lighting and ignition instruments, and where dynamo or magneto are mounted adjacent to the carburettor or petrol pipe every care must be taken to guard against petrol dripping or getting down on to them.
Remove the commutator cover from the dynamo occasionally, wipe the commutator clean with a rag, and if it is badly blackened with brush droppings, remove the brushes (after first seeing which way round they go) and polish the commutator with a piece of fine sandpaper—**not** emery cloth—by rubbing it with a strip of the paper and pulling to and fro.

Attention to the Brushes.
Scraps on the grooves between the brushes, and should need no attention for 7,000 or 8,000 miles. When they become "washed out" with paraffin and repacked. Dynamo normally get quite hot when charged, and ordinary grease is worse than useless. If lubrication is fitted, a few spots every thousand miles of a light-

oil such as is used for terminals for tightness; loose terminals have no cause but the dynamo and magnet. Next observe that the lamp retractor is in its correct position for shining in the direction of travel. significance to the newspapers it suggests Victorian tradition. Most of the bigger Empire offices in London have discarded it since it is now published in the Press for the obvious reason that it is now generally accepted as a waste of space. A few specialised trade papers like the "East Africa Economist" continue to suggest that it would be useful to get out the stock books and other cables of office agents which regularly supply London with statistics which would be of great value to the general public. It is a pity that the public is not more generally interested in this part of the world but who are always on the look out for suitable investment for capital or attractive openings for themselves or their dependants.

A Positive Policy.
I am quite aware that the London Office does an excellent job. It also considers there is a substantial number of applicants for guidance and advice, as it is. This is a question of judgment as to whether everything that can be done in this direction, is done. I do not think it is. But at the same time the London Office does not adopt the far more positive policy which I advocate. Below I indicate some of my own views as to what the general position of Kenya publicity which suffers, as most things, from neglect without effort.

Less to do.
I have already indicated that Kenya owes little or nothing of its

publicity, good or bad, to the East Africa office since the only deals with trade in a crude form, serves as a post-office for East African visitors, who seek guidance to the Kenya office. It is for Kenya only its publicity to individual prospective investors of whom there are large numbers of their own kind. There is also very questionable publicity being done from the East Africa office in the form of what is known as the "East Africa Year Book" which is a waste of space. 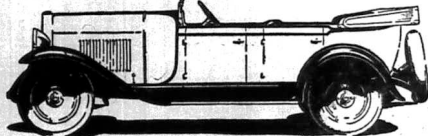

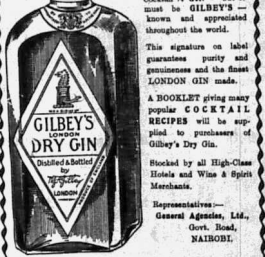

It suggests two main lines of improvement: (1) The formation of an All-Africa African Committee in the House of Commons with a competent organization combining official and non-official publicity fostered by the neo-grinders who fear the London press with contributions.

No reason exists in his mind, for the continued failure of the Government to appoint a Publicity Officer in London.

Russian Railway Smash.

DERAILMENT OF EXPRESS TRAIN.

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT)

Moscow, Sept. 24.

The derailment of an express train from Moscow to Siberia, five miles from Viatka, resulted in 45 people being killed and 30 injured.

During the course of a debate in the Assembly of the League of Nations, Viscount Cecil explained the British point of view in regard to land disarmament, following on his recent resolution. He expressed his surprise at the suggestion that it was being attempted to diminish security. He would be the first to oppose such a course. He had no intention of postponing or obstructing the work of disarmament—such charges were unfounded and unjust.

He announced that Britain was prepared to sign the convention relating to traffic in arms, and invited other nations to do the same. At the same time he pointed out that one producing country could not sign and ratify it, unless other countries did the same.

Child (head of the American Department in the Foreign Office) and Miss Henshaw. Lord Arnold accompanies the party in a unofficial capacity.

THE SECURITY FOR PEACE.

(BY WIRELESS)

Rebry, Sept. 24.

Viscount Cecil expressed astonishment at the League Assembly at Geneva today at the suggestion that it was trying to diminish security. He said: "I am amazed that any member of this Assembly should think such a thing. I should be the first to oppose such a course. I have only one thing in mind and that is peace. Peace is the greatest security. You can get peace only by the reduction of armaments without limitation of any nature."

Parliament as a whole, has, in a very, very general, sense, been a failure. It has done little to improve the economic and therefore fails to give us justice. 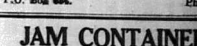

IN GOOD WORKING ORDER.
(Continued.)

Pull on the cables to see that they are firmly lead-bound into the lamps. If they are seen through, have a new cable fitted; it will probably save you the price of a set of bulbs later. Group such inter-lead bridges to see that it is tight and the plates firm. A thin strip of outboard, cloth, or similar material unaffected by acid can be thrust between the plates to feel if any of the paste has fallen and filled up on the bottom of the cells.

Do not pack the lid with asbestos wool or other material to absorb acid; it will merely short-circuit the terminals and run the battery down. Clean out stoppings very holes in the filler plugs in order to allow the free access of gases, and so prevent the possibility of one or more cells blowing up.

Ninety per cent. of electric lighting troubles are caused by failure to maintain the battery in good condition. Add distilled water only to increase the level above the plates. Never use tap water, as the iron, lime, etc. which it contains will have a destructive effect on the plates and curtail their life. Where the low level is due to loss by leakage, and not to the normal evaporation, that takes place, let a skilled battery man refill the battery and correct the gravity, strong or weak acid both lead to various troubles.

Leaking cell-head cases can be repaired by patting with about celluloid, using any acetate as an adhesive. Cases made of black composition cannot be repaired successfully, and a new case is essential.

Nickel-iron batteries, such as the N.I.F., use a caustic potash solution, obtainable from the makers. Acid will shortly ruin them. The level of the solution, how ever, should be kept up with distilled water in the usual way.

Liquid ammonia, if promptly applied, will minimise the effect of acid stains.

So much for the battery, we must now complete our examination of the lighting set. Examine the tall and slender lamps for sticking plungers. See that the screw from the screw lamp goes to the cycle frame and not to the chain-rod. The light fixture and shade in and out over portions, this particular point should certainly be checked. If the tall lamp fitting is loose, tighten it to prevent the bulb filament from fracturing due to vibration.

If the bulb adaptor is mounted on a rubber diaphragm and the light is intermittent, see that the fat spring which bridges the rubber and electrically joins the inner and outer parts of the lamp is unbroken and uncorroded. This completes the overhaul of the lighting system.

Overhauling the Magneto.
The mechanic should save every rivet attention. Take out the entire screw of the contact breaker, and rub the contact breaker with the brush as the show fits in it. Do not put the contact breaker in the brush; this shows that it is bushing properly, and is not a tumbler.

Slip back the retaining spring and lever off the rocker arm, but take care not to bend back the coil spring. Make sure the short

point is tightly riveted to the rocker, and that both points are clean and unburnt. If they are of composition and show discoloration, i.e., oxidation, polish them with a piece of fine emery cloth laid across a fat stick and smeared with engine oil, wiping the whole breaker thoroughly clean afterwards. If they are of platinum, remove the burning or pitting with not more than one or two rubs with a smooth file. Platin tips are often spun over the end of the steel screw, and being thin will not stand much filing.

The Rocker Arm.

Apply the correct trace of varnish to the pivot pin, so that it is clean and slippery. Replace the rocker. Move it to and fro lightly with the finger. It should move stiffly, neither the fibre bush over very, very slightly, nor so stiffly as to make it a slack fit, or the point spring will be affected. If there is slackness fit a new bush; they are quite inexpensive. On some magneto however, no new bush is possible, as the bush is made in one with the fibre bed of the rocker.

See that the mica insulation between the contact breaker screw breaks is clean and tight. Replace, if the mica is cracked, or the contact breaker screw is not tight, and check the gap with the special gauge usually found on the magneto.

Pull out the cone ring, apply a very thin film of vasoline to the outside, replace it, and move the roller and electrically join the roller and the contact breaker. This is an adjustment that the ring can be advanced or retarded a few degrees. Tighten the terminals set, if necessary, adjust the note of the horn, with a charged battery.

High-tension Fittings.

Remove the high-tension pickup fittings. Note if they are wet or oily; either state will cause the spark to be weak. Clean the insulation, resulting in nothing being done, as the wetness may be in their guides. Wipe the slip ring, and then the hole into which the pickup fits. Tighten the bolts, but do not over-tighten them. The springs open up and become lodged between the slip ring and pickup.

Finally, turn to the electric horn. In most cases the valve passes through holes in the cover. Turn them up if they show signs of being cut through. In a transformer horn, slip up the contacts if they are burnt. If there is insulation show signs of dampness—by no means an uncommon occurrence—dry the horn out thoroughly with a cloth. If the horn is so wet that water cannot run down them, then do so.

"Tuning the Horn."

Tighten up terminals and readjust contacts. Turn the pickup with a fully charged battery. If the horn is of transformer type, slide the contactor screw out the groove, apply a spot of thin oil to the terminals, and note carefully that the brushes are free to run. The brushes are often made of canvas and may be frayed by causing binding to occur. A few drops of oil will do the trick between the brush and the commutator. Tighten the terminals set, if necessary, adjust the note of the horn, with a charged battery.

The fear of a possible misapprehension of policy is intolerable. It has no positive and no real authority or authority. Its Press publicity is largely confined to send, unselected, printing—constructive material, full statistics, annual reports and rainfall statistics. They have their value but they appear as an limited value that the money spent on them, is a waste of money. The striking fact about any batch of newspaper articles reaching our office by the way of the London Office, is the wholesale indifference of material supplied to the Press publicity. They are invariably confined to a few specialist news items, such as the London Office is living in a Victorian age and attempting to do the job of a modern newspaper in providing information to those who seek it. EAST AFRICAN INDIAN'S DEPUTATION.

Presenting their Case in India.

BOMBAY MEETING.

The deputation of prominent Indians in Kenya, appointed to visit India, England with a view to stimulating interest in the East African Indian Deputation, held their first public meeting at Bombay under the presidency of Mr. Hayer Nandanji, a member of the Bombay Municipal Corporation. Mr. J. B. Pandey, who is the leader of the deputation, addressed the audience of length.

In welcoming members of the deputation, Mr. Nandanji said: "We have met today to hear the East African Indian Deputation on the questions affecting the Indian community in that country. It is my hope in India relating to the deputation of the issues involved and would desire once again in Kipkarron terms that under no circumstances are they prepared to accept a second class citizenship for their countrymen in any part of the British Empire. Kenya is the best to the whole situation. What the Rights Hon. V. G. Spry has said is desired in 1928 that 'Kenya land, everything else, is equally true today.'"

"I may say that the treatment of our countrymen in East Africa will be the acid test of the position of India in the Empire. We hope the Imperial Government of East Africa, will not forget the fact which India have played in the development of those territories, and that the 212 millions of their countrymen are behind them, earnestly watching the issue, and they would equally regret any indignity which may be inflicted on their countrymen in East Africa."

"Other parts of the Empire, such as New Zealand, and South Africa, are practically closed to our countrymen, and colonization. I am sure this attitude on which the whole of the continent stands on one platform, with the Government of India at its back, will restore the serious situation of Imperial settlement and that they will not be led away by a handful of European settlers in Kenya."

The Labour Party declared its policy a short time ago on the question of franchise, one of the most important issues. The Party declared itself in favour of the franchise for all British subjects who are recommended in the Hillier Commission report. The people of India demand that it should now be put into practice.

The President then, on behalf of the citizens of Bombay, attended a hearty welcome to the East African Deputation. At the close of Mr. Pandey's address, Mr. Hayer Nandanji stored the following resolution: "The public meeting convened under the joint auspices of the East African Indian Deputation, the Bombay Provincial Congress, the National Home Rule League and the Indian National Congress, held at Bombay and having for its president the leader, Mr. Pandey, declares its cordial sympathy with the leader of the East African for a Common Council with full and equal representation with Europeans in all matters such as land, education, administration; and expresses the strongest hope that the Government of India will give its full support to these demands. The resolution was carried."

Traffic Problem in Mombasa.

For some time increasingly numerous reports have been received from Mombasa of serious accidents in the streets of the port town. These accidents in all cases, have been caused by motor cars and have invariably resulted in the death or serious wounding of one or more of the parties to the accident. Our correspondent reports today a discussion which has taken place at a meeting of the Mombasa Municipal Board and a decision to appoint an investigating body to make recommendations. Those who know Mombasa will realize there is room for improvement in traffic control. The increase in taxis within the past few years has been very great and the Coast native, not unlike natives elsewhere, seems to have little regard for their own lives or those of anyone else. The Mombasa is currently reminiscent of other seaport towns up and down the African coast where the taxi business among visitors from passing ships is in the hands of native drivers who know no other methods save a measure of amputation to the visitor and a constant threat to the safety of strangers unacquainted with the peculiar customs to which a few new visitors from passing ships are subjected. They have no personal interest whatever in the identity of their passengers or in avoiding some of the most reprehensible law infractions which they have seen committed at the wheel of the vehicle that the whole of the roadways are their own special playground. They shoot out from the ranks, crowd the boats, cut in and out of the traffic streams, stop openly for fares and generally indulge in the most reckless exhibitions of driving before the eyes of others in the business. In a growing and important centre such as Mombasa there is no longer any place for the type of taxi service normally associated with passing vessels, but it is more than time before the Mombasa is reaching the stage where its life must be ordered and regulated and with stability must come a properly regulated taxi business. CROP EXPERIMENTS IN KENYA.

The Plant Breeding Station at Njoro.

VALUABLE INSTITUTION.

Excellent Results Already Accomplished.

The Njoro correspondent of the "E.A. Standard" recently paid a visit to the Government Plant Breeding Station at Njoro to obtain some insight as to the work carried out there by Mr. Burton, the Plant Breeder, and his staff.

In the accompanying article he describes his impressions of the visit, and states that although the Station has only been in existence for some 18 months, the work already accomplished following on considerable research.

During the course of a tour of the plant breeding plots, details of the methods adopted in trying to discover the best types of wheat, maize, barley and ryegrass were demonstrated.
