Two very big and very interesting mergers have been brought to the notice of the public world. One involved steel and steel-making, the other iron and steel-making. The first was announced by Messrs. Lang & Co., Ltd., and the second by Messrs. J. & F. Thomas & Co., Ltd. It is understood that several other steel firms on the north coast will be involved in what will eventually become a large iron and steel combine. The negotiations for the present fusion have been proceeding for some time. The industrial manufacture of both firms are world wide. In recent years Messrs. Lang have specialized in bridge building and Messrs. Thomas have specialized on the iron and steel trade in Transvaal. The combined turnover and assets of the two companies is about £10,000,000. Neither has sold any dividend on the ordinary capital since 1919/21.

The other merger is equally interesting and in the future of Lever Brothers with the big Anglo-Dutch margarine combine; a provisional agreement has been signed. The extent of the combination may be gathered by the summary of the capital concerned—Lever Brothers, £60,000,000; Anglo-Dutch margarine combine, £12,000,000. Total £72,000,000.

It is thought this combination may affect vegetable oil interests all over the world.

Safety of Railways.

The safety of British railways is maintained by a report issued by the Ministry of Transport, which shows that the liability to death or injury to passengers during 1919 by train accidents was killed, 1 in 24.7 millions arrived; injured, 1 in 2.3 millions arrived. The number of passengers killed in 1919 was 40, and injured 715. Even these figures are an increase on those of 1917, of 21 killed and 197 injured. Notwithstanding as far as we can see the railways are the safest means of transport.

Sisal in Tanganyika.

GOVERNMENT DELAY IN POWER SOBERED.

Vital states in the Pangani Valley Tanganyika Territory, where most of the sisal grown in the British Empire is produced, are protracted in the negotiations for the sisal industry in Pangani Falls says the "Financial Review." It was originally announced that an award might be expected in August, but it is now stated that the Tanganyika Government has decided to defer the decision until December. Meanwhile the sisal plantations have been extended and new machinery has been installed. The need for additional power is becoming urgent, but the company concerned have delayed taking steps to do so, whether they should install steam or electric power plants in the hope that an adequate supply of cheap electricity would shortly be available.

Perhaps Too Late.

If as the result of the uncertainty as to the Tanganyika scheme they are forced to put in alternative electric power units, the market for the power industry will be considerably restricted, as it will obviously not order to take electricity from the present development. By holding up the latter project, the Government is therefore justifying its proposals of success. Another point which is worth attention in view of the present need of creating a combination in Great Britain is the much greater value of sisal at this time of the year. Such orders, provided they are made in the winter, when it is most needed.

Port Improvement.

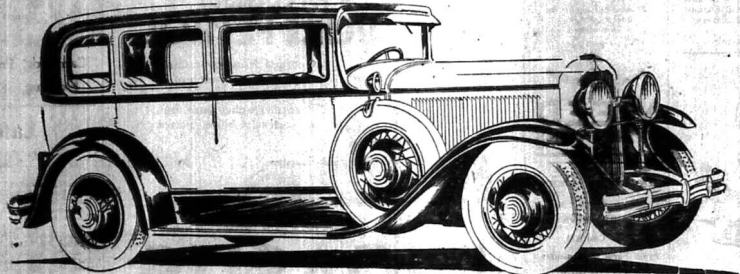
It is hoped that the Colonial Office will exert its influence to induce the Tanganyika Government to expedite its decision on both the projects mentioned. The cost of the power development proposed will be about £500,000, a considerable proportion of which will represent electrical machinery and turbines. Improvement of the port of Tanga is now being undertaken, and this is an additional reason why the provision of cheap power for the station will pay itself out of the traffic of the port, should be hastened.

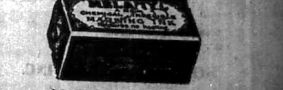
