ORGANIZATION OF KENYA COFFEE INDUSTRY.

The first part of the motion is that the Government had previously agreed to this. In reply to a question, the Chairman said he remembered the speeches which had been made by the Hon. Mr. MacLellan when he was Acting Governor in which it had been stated that the Government would be willing to contribute in this way. There was to be the Coffee Planters Union and to the Coffee Conference.

General Research Station

The third part of Mr. Burgin's resolution was to the effect that the Government be asked to make a special initial grant of £75,000 to build and equip a General Coffee Research Station, to provide fully for the institution of a publicity campaign, and to meet other special needs of the industry. Mr. Burgin said that it was intended that there should be two research stations in other districts and it was hoped that part of the sum would be used for travelling laboratories.

Regarding the publicity side it was essential that steps should be taken immediately on arrival of the position with which the coffee industry is faced. So far and (Hall had mentioned the Board might be willing to meet on this matter.

Considerable discussion followed during which it became evident that the majority of the members were in favour of the Research Station dealing with all the other problems which varied according to the amount of climate and other considerations. It was also suggested that it was necessary to include a public relations campaign as well as the research side as £75,000 being sufficient.

As a result of the various suggestions the motion was resolved that the Government be asked to make a special initial grant of £75,000 or such additional sum or sums as may be necessary by the Board to build and equip such a General Research Station, experimental plots and other necessary equipment, and to get the substance of our various recommendations to the effect of the Coffee Industry of the Colony.

This motion was carried unanimously.

Regarding the composition of the Coffee Board, Mr. MacLellan When proposed the following:

This meeting recommending that the Board be composed as under—The Director of Agriculture, Kenya, to be empowered to appoint a Deputy, The Director of Research of Kenya, to be empowered to appoint a Deputy, One member (official) nominated with the Coffee Industry to be appointed by Government.

A Deputy, Two Licensed Buyers, One member to be appointed by the Kenya General Meeting of Coffee Planters and Dealers, Two Planters to be elected by Licensed Coffee Planters of West Kenya.

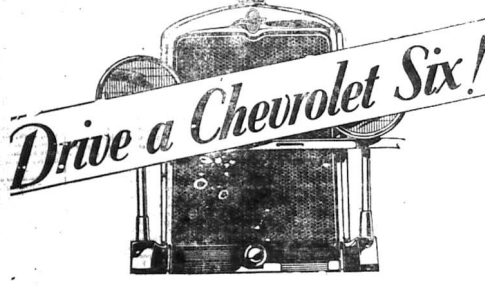

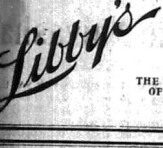

Statement by Mr. J. H. Thomas in the House.

He said that he had been asked to go to the church to see if the natives had returned their offerings on the question of circumcising their children.

WHAT 1930 CARS INCORPORATE

Many Improvements in Bodywork.

OUTSTANDING TRENDS

(Continued.)
Turning to electrical equipment, the use of air lines regulated either in the light of an accessory, or by a solenoid, is an important complete set in many cars that might be incorporated in the manufacture. As a result, we had inaccessible wiring, obscure fuses to trace and a mass of terminals behind the face board which could only be reached by disassembly.

An annual improvement has, however, been noticeable in this important respect, and particularly marked this year. In laboratory systems the latest is very carefully planned to enable the retention wires to be braided together to form thick, damage-proof cables consisting of telephone practice. A number of the connections are made in an accessible junction box secured to the dash under the board, and here laws may be provided for the various circuits.

These developments have been encouraged by two factors—the greatly increased use of cool gas engine systems and the ever growing number of electrical accessories.

A majority of the manufacturers are now providing controls for the lighting system at the top of the steering column, where they can most conveniently be reached. At the same time the controls take the form of a single lever mounted vertically with the throttle and ignition levers.

Steering wheels tend to grow larger at the same time, and use is being made of cast and steel reduction mechanisms which cut down friction to a minimum—both trends, which reduce the

physical effort involved in guiding the car. With light steering, however, there is always the difficulty of preventing a kick-back from the wheel when a rough road is negotiated. This is being counteracted by many Continental and American manufacturers, who use a special floating arrangement, with a limited range of movement, and steering spring fitted steel, so the steering drag is, in the case of one set of springs in the case of cast metal steering marks.

Retain Valve This Year.

Finally, there is the matter of pistons, and a broad survey goes to show that, on the whole, there have remained steady during the change-over from 1929 to 1930 pistons. On the other hand, some manufacturers have taken the opportunity to add recesses and provide new accessories.

It should also be remembered that the standard of performance is continuously being raised, so that at the present time for a sum of, say, £200, one can purchase a new cylinder car which, in respect of cylinder, accessories, valves, and general road-workability, is the equal, if not the superior, of the best car which could be bought five years ago at double the price.

Supporting the Bonnet.

One of the many irritating little habits provoked by the falling side of the bonnet is that it is difficult to scratch the various body if the side should slip after it has been raised and plipped up in position on the vehicle. From this point of view, the side of the bonnet might, however, be made so strong that it is more convenient to it to rest a small buffer strip to make a board, and set the lower edge of the bonnet in this block, thus holding it securely.

For Adjustable Spacers.

With justice a good mechanic allows an adjustable spacer, for it is not an engineer's tool, and the jaws have a tendency to gap, slip, and work loose. To the mechanic, however, it is a necessity, for it does not want always to carry a complete set of fixed spacers. One of the main drawbacks of an adjustable spacer is the jaw working loose, but this can be overcome on the machine shown. The sliding portion is detached, and about the middle of each back a hole is drilled and tapped for a small set screw with a knurled head. While it is disassembled a number of shallow nuts should be fixed along the point of the set-screw, when the jaw is locked. By this means it is possible to obtain quite a fine range of positions.

Overhead Valve Noises.

Sometimes the push rods of an overhead-valve engine cause noise by what can only be called rattling at high speeds. Such trouble can, in some instances, be cured by connecting two neighbouring push rods together with a light coil spring.

Extracting Cotter Pins.

A great number of ingenious tools have been made to extract cotter pins and castellated nuts, and some can only be called "them good," all of them likely to be useless when it is really necessary to extract a split pin. If a small pair of pliers with round jaws is available a split pin can be extracted using a nut as a fulcrum point.

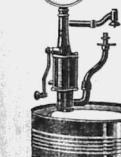

"East African Standard" adds in a further article that the programme is vague at present and it is not apparent from the brief summary received whether the Prince intends to visit the East African Colonies. It may work north or south.

The Prince's visit to East Africa is a valuable one for the information published in London. For all Africa four have been under discussion there and it was originally intended that the visit should take place after Christmas. The whole details, however, depend largely on the health of His Majesty the King.

At the moment, however, it is understood that the Prince after his tour of South Africa will travel north to Rhodesia and will then use his private aeroplane (when it is proposed should accompany him on the African tour) for a flight to East Africa, visiting Tanganyika and Kenya and possibly Uganda on an extended big game hunting tour.

It is understood that at present arrangements are not made in Nairobi for the Prince's second East African visit and that plans are now being prepared.

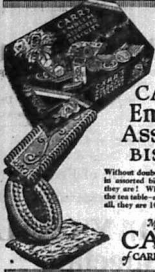

PLANNING FUTURE OF UGANDA RAILWAY.

**Negotiations with the Belgian
Authorities.**

**CAPETOWN - MOMBASA BY RAIL
VIA STANLEYVILLE.**

**Statement by the Governor of
Uganda.**

His Excellency the Governor of Uganda prepared for the opening of the Uganda Legislative Council last week one of the most important addresses during his tour of office. Like Sir Edward Grigg, this is perhaps his last Budget statement in his present position.

The Governor indicated that at the end of next year, if the revenue and expenditure were as estimated, Uganda would have a surplus balance of a million sterling.

The Secretary of State deprecated the caution which marked the 1920 Budget report that when provision was available more money should be spent on development than was being done.

In the following extracts from the speech, space has been found for the important references to the future extension of the railway to the Congo border—to which reference was recently made by the Governor of Kenya—and to the hearty co-operation of the Belgian authorities. The scheme, if completed by Belgian and British authorities, will connect Capetown and Mombasa by rail.

PROTECTORATE'S BUDGET.

His Excellency Sir William Gordon, Governor of Uganda, prepared for the opening of the Session of Legislative Council on Thursday last a long and important statement reviewing the situation with the Protectorate, primarily to the usual custom, Sir William did not deliver the statement as a speech. He handed printed copies to members and adjourned Council for an hour, while they digested the announcement.

The review extended to over 10,000 words and the following extracts are made:

The proposal I have before you at this opening, meeting of a new Session is the continuation of the Revenue and Expenditure of this

considerable extent from the import duties on the assumption that the sections which will not be the highest possible ones that may be obtained and that the duties on the plantations, but at a reasonable one. It is not possible to estimate the revenue for the year 1920. Any revenue estimate would be based on the estimate of the surplus balance and used for unforeseen liabilities. It is not possible to make certain that the revenue is obtained before we make provision for spending it.

This matter, however, did not entirely commend itself to the Secretary of State who in consequence of the 1920 Estimates, observed that the estimates of expenditure were framed with marked caution and that when circumstances should permit there would be considerable room for provision of new services on a more generous basis. He also questioned whether the Protectorate Government was spending enough upon ordinary development and hoped that due regard would be paid to the importance of making the fullest possible provision for paid and research services, with a view to the improvement of the condition of the people and the development of the Protectorate's natural resources.

The Secretary of State's views have been borne in mind in preparing these Estimates with the result that revenue estimates have been drawn up on more optimistic basis, and in fact represent the maximum amount of revenue likely to be secured in 1920, so far

as conditions can be foreseen, while the additional revenue of £100,000 is balanced by an increase in departmental recurrent and special expenditure which now stands at £1,518,607. Compared with £1,429,065 in 1920, considerable extra provision is made under the heads of Police, Medical, Education, Transport, Telegraphs, Agriculture, Veterinary and Mining.

The special expenditure to be financed from surplus balances consists of expenditure on public works to the total amount of £727,217.

The position is that certain major works and start to execute there, which as I said in 1917, I hoped to finance in future from Loan Funds, must either be abandoned altogether or be met from surplus balances until such time as the Protectorate can raise a loan on its own account.

Colonial Development.
In this connection I invite the attention of Honorable Members to the terms of the Colonial Development Act, 1920.

It appears from Section 3 of that Act that the provisions of the Colonial Stock Act, 1919, as

amended by Order of Council to a territory under His Majesty's protection, whereas, hitherto the provisions of those Acts applied only to Colonies and not to Protectorates. It is my intention to propose that the Secretary of State will not order in respect of the Uganda Protectorate, so that the capital expenditure necessary to carry out local development may be financed by the necessary advances.

In this connection I may add that I think it will be most convenient if borrowing powers in respect of advances for railway and other development affecting more than one of the East African territories, should be made over to the High Commissioner and Central Council of these three territories should the proposals for the creation of this office and this body as forementioned in the recently published Report of Sir Samuel White as previously carried out.

The Surplus.
In this position funds are available in our surplus balances for major works and there appears to be no reason why they should not be so used.

The anticipated excess of assets over liabilities on 31st December, 1920, is £1,265,786. Deducting from this the sum required for Reserve Fund of £700,000, working cash balance of £100,000 and for unallocated stores of £100,000, that is to say a total of £900,000 there remains a surplus of £365,786 available for expenditure this being £65,283 in excess of the amount available at the close of 1920. In view, therefore, of the large capital expenditure which is being incurred during the current year the revenue for the year will exceed the expenditure. At the end of 1920, assuming that special expenditure in excess of that provided for in the estimate is met from savings or from additional revenue, surplus balances will stand at over £1,000,000 on the 31st December, 1920, and should be sufficient to provide for such works in 1921 as cannot be met from the revenue proceeds of that year.

As regards the Palestine and East Africa Guaranteed Loans the only works which the Loan Committee consider suitable for inclusion are the Jinja-Kampala Railway and the Kampala Water Supply. Funds for these works are at present being advanced from surplus balances. At the next meeting of Council a Bill will be introduced to enable these works to be covered by the Guarantees to be issued by the Government.

Revenue.
It will be observed from the Revenue Schedule that the principal items on page 11

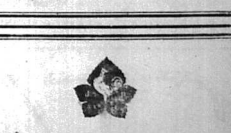
