The Argument of Force.

The numbers of the Simon Commission have left India on the completion of their investigation of one of the most difficult of international questions—the constitutional reform of India—a problem almost only foreign in its importance to the question of the future of this vast and fertile continent of Asia. The Empire will regard with interest and horror the advice to that department—the use of bombs and the methods of the Assassins of the Delhi Legislative Assembly Methods used as they are foreign to normal British notions of justice, public order, and an equal ability to encourage the development of the country to regard with less doubt than hitherto the ability of the Indian people, under one of its present extreme leaders to carry the heavy responsibility of directing and conducting the activities of India. 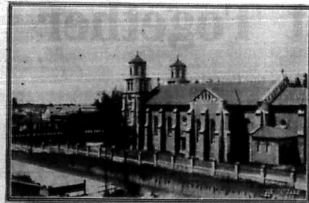

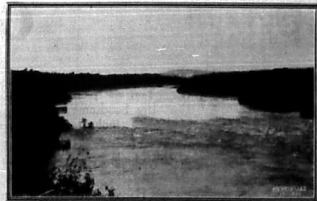

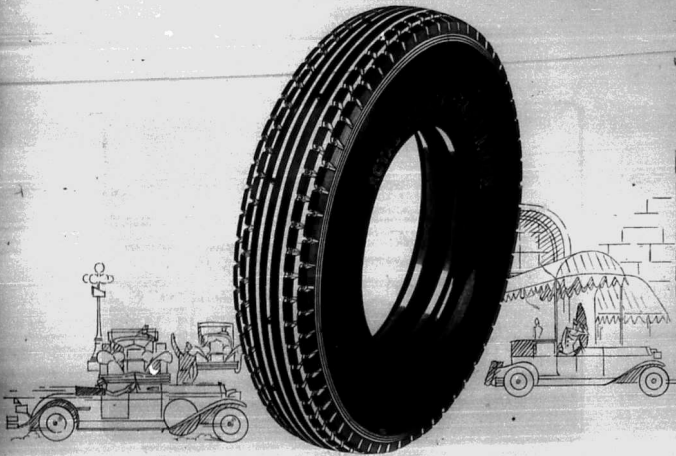
