BIG WITS.
EGG HATCHING.
To avoid the risks of over-feeding, and of carbon, lack of rest, and the use of water when open birds are used, the best plan, if a bird will give a good result, is to gradually break up the habit of eating a large quantity of food. Sometimes the birds are fed on a mixture of water and food, and in the case of another hen laying eggs, it is better to give a small quantity of food at a time, and to keep the water fresh and clean, and to change it frequently. If the first attempt is not successful, it is better to start with a small quantity of food, and to increase it as the bird gets used to the new system.

REMEDIES.

Incubation of the hatched is not deep, and the temperature of the nest should be sufficient to place the birds in the water just after they are hatched. The comparative ease with which the birds are hatched is a matter of interest in all cases of incubation.



Poultry Jettings. FEEDING FOR EGG PRODUCTION.

The question of feeding in very much more difficult here than in England, where all grass and foodstuffs are obtained in a given area.

Here the supply, except of prohibitive prices, is limited and the cost of transport is the most easily procurable.
