London, April 19. Dr. Schmidt, the chief German delegate to the Reparations Commission has turned an ultimatum to the Allied experts that unless they recovered the Colonies and the Eastern Territories they would not pay a penny more than sufficient to cover the Allied debt to the United States.

This is confirmed up to the present, but a rupture in the Reparations' Conference is possible.

Dr. Schmidt's ultimatum is in effect a demand for a new source of raw materials supply.

It is officially stated that Germany has declined to increase the monthly instalment of £10,000,000 in the Reparations' Conference.

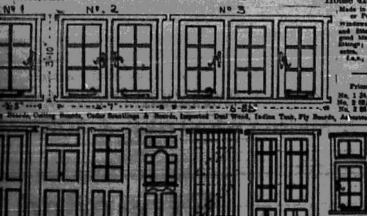

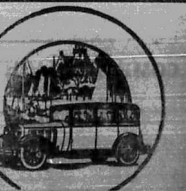

Stagnation.

It is doubtful whether the movement of public affairs in Kenya has ever been quite so sluggish as at the present time. The position is far from being satisfactory and there is no doubt that the effect upon the work of the country as a whole is undesirable. It would be interesting to discover how far the various departments are being retarded by their inability to obtain a decision on questions of importance to their own progress and that of the Colony. The greatest stagnation covers a fairly long period. Twenty-two years ago it began when the Government had to convene the House. Then there followed the period of political activity in preparation for the coming of the Crown Union Report. The visit of the Princes of Wales, itself a happy incident, again put a brake on normal progress. Later, the Governor was called to London for a Conference on the Report of the Commission and it is understood, although no official information has been given to the Colony, that he will not return until the middle of the summer. Now there is a further period of delay pending the hurried tour of Sir Samuel Wilson. The present situation in the Departments is interesting and in itself a sufficient indication of the difficulties of the moment, even had there been no abnormal political pressure. In addition to the absence of the Governor, the Secretary is without a chief and a new Colonial Secretary is due at the end of the present month. The Lands and Local Government Department is under an acting head, there has been no appointment to the General Managership of the Kenya and Uganda Commissions, the Chief Native Commissioner is on leave, the Judicial Department is without its head, and the coming departure of the Chief Veterinary Officer will create a similar position in that section of Government activity. Only recently a new Director of Education was appointed and in the Forestry Department the post of Conservator remained vacant for about two years. There is no reference to any man who was very actively carrying on the work of departments in the temporary absence of the immediately responsible officers but it cannot be expected that they are permitted or encouraged to initiate their own policies or programmes and their ordinary routine work is undoubtedly directed by the general stagnation created by the absence of so many able officers in their departments. The list of important references held up until the country returns to its normal condition is lengthening seriously. Many months ago the Legislative Council proposed the appointment of a Commission of Enquiry to investigate the condition of the premier industry of the country but so far there is no sign of any movement on the part of Government to set up the Agricultural Commission. The disease and vital crop problem of the Native Land Trust Bill remains unsettled, questions affecting the possibilities of employment of the Civil Service of the Colony are apparently no nearer a answer, two Bills intended to provide a sound basis for the Dairy and Stockbreeding Industry have laid for public publicity, two proposals for the extension of Northern Frontier has not been passed although special investigations were carried out over a year ago, the Domestic Revenue Regulation Bill has been referred to the Government of India nearly two months and has apparently re-

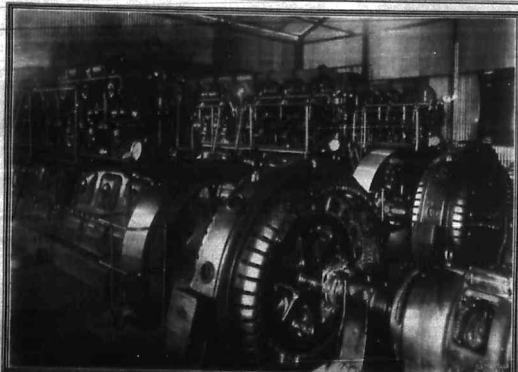

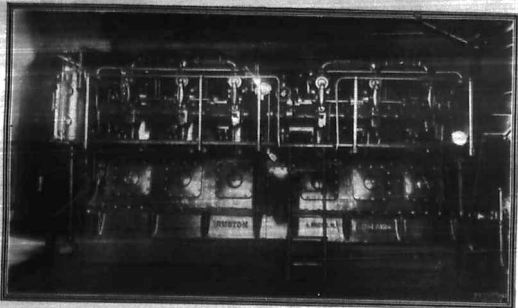

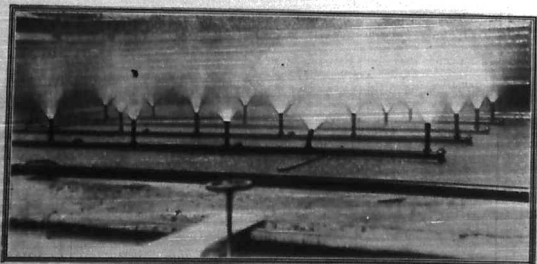
NAIROBI'S AUXILIARY POWER STATION.

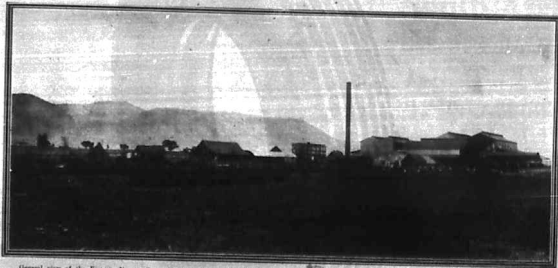

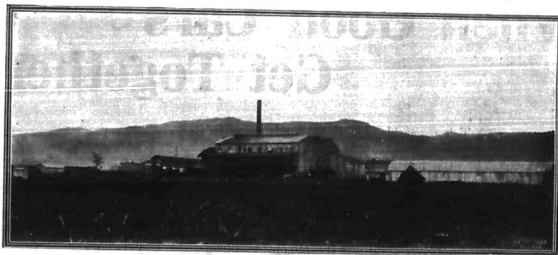
The spray tank for lowering the temperature of the circulating water cooling system.

AMATEUR BOXING IN KENYA.

Marking a New Era in the Game in East Africa.

ESSENTIAL FACTORS TOWARDS ACHIEVING SUCCESS.

Decisions at General Meeting.

Every indication is afforded that 1920 will mark a new era in amateur boxing so far as Kenya is concerned. For several reasons the sport has not enjoyed too happy a period in the Colony in past years. It would be wrong to lay the blame on the Boxing Association; rather was it due to frequent disappointments in their promotions: when competitors "piled off" at all the matches. Nothing can be more substandard to "blame" the public than this, and mainly due to this cause the fight game has not been highly supported.

Just over a week ago a new impetus was afforded when a highly successful promotion was staged in the Railway Institute under the auspices of the Association. The bouts were not unbrisk with very great degree of ability, but there was sufficient indication in the material on tap to warrant the assertion that, given the proper impetus and atmosphere, the game could be prospered and furthered with judicious nurturing and training of the men in view.

Such was the heartening support accorded the proposition by the public that it was deemed expedient to call a meeting if the Association in order that a new start might be made - and a real step even to boxing in East Africa.

On Bare Foundation

On Monday evening the general meeting held in the New Stanley Hotel, Nairobi, afforded an indication of the new spirit permeating the art. The turnout was distinctly satisfactory, and the many points mooted and brought forward had their effect in permitting a complete line to the boxes, and a bedrock foundation laid for the building up of the sport in these parts. First, while much was accomplished, there still remains the practical part to be played. For this purpose a formal and working committee of ability sufficient to overcome the obstacles which will of a surety be met with in the days to come, had to be appointed. It was an essential in the general scheme of things. A desperate consideration of that committee is sufficient warranty to permit

statement that the necessary qualities are to be found in the body. On them and their work depends much of the future success, and there must be no lolling on the road, no dissent, but energy and enthusiasm in abundance.

Stomp Old Ideas

The activities of the governing body, however, must not be wholly confined to the promotion of occasions. Guidance and help must be accorded the various clubs which will utilize in due course to it. The amateur laws must be strictly enforced, and the body of boxers who form the backbone of the whole building must be carefully wooed and every encouragement afforded them in the way of providing proper training facilities. Old ideas must be abandoned, while the original constitution adhered to nothing calculated to further the interests of boxing must be omitted. Along such lines success will assuredly follow.

A Headmap

At the outset of Monday's meeting a brief statement of accounts was submitted by Mr. E. L. Lester, the secretary, and this showed the funds to be in a healthy state, though, in view of the existing state of affairs and the expense devolving on the Association by the purchase of a new ring, further provisions would be necessary in order to build up a balance to proper proportions. One of the headings under which the Association worked at present, advised Mr. Lester, was that of having no proper place to train, and in order to pave the way to acquiring premises which he had in mind, he emphasized the necessity for securing another promotion during the coming month.

He added that the Railway Institute had now formed a club, the Police another, and the formation of a town club likely to fructify in the course of the next few days. Nairobi had its club, and were standing by Messrs. Dalrymple and Co. Ltd., from their London office.

Creating Competition

Referring to the question of holding a second tournament of boxing the meeting was agreed to, and Mr. Sinclair said it would afford them an opportunity of pitting the best to meet the Navy in July. It was essential that these men should be adequately fit, so nothing was more calculated to drive the public mind to the ring had trained.
