MAGNIFICENT WORK BY KENYA POLICEMAN.

Prevents Clash of Masai and Lumbwa Tribes.

The policeman travelled alone into Masai country on hearing of the danger of a clashing of the tribes. He found a host of Masai, armed with spears, shields and knives, ready to march into Lumbwa Territory. Tribal relations reported that the young warriors of the Masai were out of control, but the policeman called the leaders of the little army together and succeeded in persuading them to desist and return to their own country.

Across the border, the Lumbwa war cry had been raised. On returning to his station, the constable encountered a crowd of Lumbwa, but, on his advice they returned to their farms. As a precautionary measure, guards were posted at certain points, police reinforcements having been summoned. There was however no further threat of a rising. PLAYING A LONE HAND.

ZANZIBAR FACES NEED FOR ECONOMY.

Recurrent Expenses Near the Danger Line.

DEPARTMENTAL CUTS.

Zanzibar Legislative Council was opened on 11th inst., this afternoon, and the Hon. Sir R. H. Higham the Sultan of Zanzibar presiding at the opening address the members on outstanding condition of the island, making special reference to the illness of His Majesty the King, and to the vast drought here. Over three years have elapsed since the Zanzibar Legislative Council was established and it had become necessary to decide whether to re-appoint five of the six original members of the Council to select new members to take their place. Referring to the position His Highness said—

"We, the members of the Council, are called upon to consider a high standard of service which the Council should maintain and we are bound to do so during their first term of office, and we are exceedingly glad when they all notified their willingness to serve for a further period of three years. The Government has to be very glad that so many members of the Council are willing to accept an additional term of office. I am glad to see that the Government has decided to re-appoint five of the six original members of the Council and to appoint five new members to take their place. This is a very desirable step and we should be very glad to see it done."

"The past year has been a trying one both to our Government and to our subjects owing to the smallness of the slow crop. We think God that the present season is likely to be a good one. Some few producers have been able to get a few extra crops as the price advanced for the past year is abnormally high, but this is not in the interests of the industry as a whole, and is likely to be very injurious in the future. 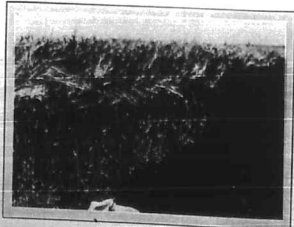

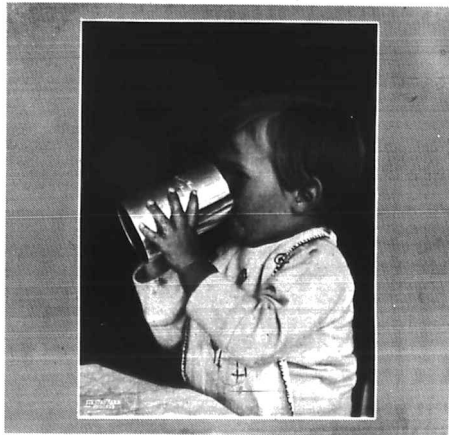

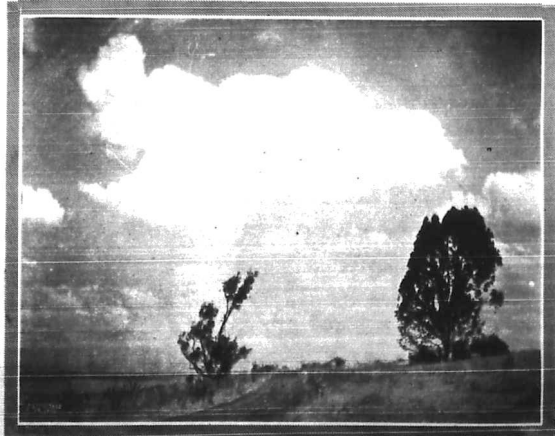
