Sept. 14.—M. Stolypin has refused permission for a Congress of Constitutional monarchs to be held, consequently the meeting will take place either in Finland or Sweden.

Sept. 15.—The Tsar Tzarina and their children left several days ago on a yachting excursion in the gulf of Finland.

Sept. 17.—The French Government has asked not to contact the Churches in the West if the Priests do not conform to the law of December 1907.

Sept. 17.—Gangs of thugs are terrorizing the inhabitants of Odessa assaulting and killing students and Jews in the streets in the presence of the Police.

Sept. 17.—It is stated that the Russian Government is organizing a Massacre of Jews. Warsaw, terrible panic prevails in the town.

Sept. 18.—General Diehlain the Commander of Germanists has been appointed to succeed the late General Troppoff as commander of the Palace.

Sept. 19.—The Tsar returns from his nine-day and will attend the funeral of General Troppoff.

Sept. 19.—The German Ambassador at St. Petersburg has made representations to the Russian Government in connection with the murder of a German Manufacturer.

Sept. 15.—The American Gunboat Marietta has landed a detachment of Blue Jackets at Centropolis which place is being besieged by the insurgents and where the fortifications have already been damaged.

Sept. 15.—After a conference between President Palma and the American Charge d'Affaires the American Blue Jackets landed at Havana were ordered to return to their ship leaving only a small guard at the Legation.

Sept. 17.—Mr. Secretary of State Taft left Washington yesterday for Cuba accompanied by Assistant Secretary Bacon, to investigate into affairs generally and to try to restore peace. Four more American Cruisers are leaving for Cuba.

Sept. 17.—There has been sharp fighting between the Government troops and the Insurgents near Havana, the latter were dispersed.

Sept. 18.—Messrs. Taft and Bacon have started for Havana.

Sept. 18.—After consultation with the Insurgents believe the Government there have announced the intention to an indefinite suspension of hostilities.

Sept. 19.—News from Cuba is very meagre but President Palma's advisers appear to be making desperate efforts to come to some understanding with the insurgents prior to the arrival of Messrs Taft and Bacon. The Insurgent leaders however seem to be disinclined to accept the Government proposals.

Sept. 20.—Messrs Taft and Bacon have arrived at Havana and have visited President Palma.

### A BISHOP MISSING.

Sept. 14.—Sir Frederic Lugard who is now in England has resigned the Commissioner of Nigeria owing to ill health.

Sept. 14.—The representatives of Australia assembled in Melbourne have approved the New Zealand Preference Treaty by 22 votes to 11.

Sept. 17.—The Melbourne Representatives have adopted the Preferential Tariff with Great Britain mentioned in Reuters of the 31st ult.

Sept. 19.—Dr. Jameson is in London and today will interview Lord Eglon on the subject of the controversy between the Cape and Natal concerning their respective shares of the Railway Traffic to the Transvaal and Orange River Colonies.

Sept. 19.—A disastrous typhoon has struck Hongkong Harbour and great damage to shipping has been done. Three British steamers and one German have been sunk. 2 British steamers including the Canadian Pacific Coy's s.s. "Montague" 4 German steamers, and one American Baling ship are ashore.

Sept. 20.—Latter advices from Hongkong show that 3 British River Launches have been damaged and one wrecked also one French Destroyer, 4 Officers and 16 of Crew were drowned. Hundreds of native crafts have been sunk and one hundred lives lost.

Sept. 20.—The Typhoon at Hongkong lasted two hours, vessels were pitched ashore all along the water front where the wooden piers were demolished. The Docks and masts of six stranded with wreckage from masts, funnels, portholes and masts. The streets are flooded and resemble rivers.

## Our Army.

Sept. 14.—An Army Order has been issued constituting the General Staff which is by command of the Adjutant-General and 111 comprising the district commands.

Sept. 17.—It is reported in Paris that the special privileges allowed to British Officers at the French Manoeuvres foreshadows an Anglo-French Military Convention.

Sept. 17.—The Humberts have been released from prison.

Sept. 18.—A great sensation has been caused in Paris owing to the arrest of 35 Members of a gang of robbers. The correspondence seized shows that they had confederates in Germany, Britain and Spain and that preparations were being made to operate in Chicago, and in Argentina. It is believed that many well-known families are implicated.

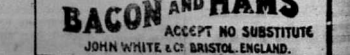

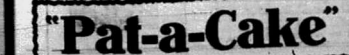

EDITORIAL.

Under the heading 'Official Auctioneers' our readers will find a letter from one of our correspondents in Mombasa. It appears that complaint is made that they are official brokers and yet are not allowed to participate in the benefits offered by the auction sales at the Customs. The present auctioneer has monopoly of Government sales and the Customs, which monopoly is very considerable and we doubt whether his having been auctioneer for some years entitles him to any claim of the Government to monopolize the whole business. In the High Court of East Africa, where one naturally expects to find the law, it is stated that Official Auctioneers take their turn in proper rotation, the present auctioneer at the Customs having his turn next. We do not blame the present auctioneer, we openly advocate him to hang on to his monopoly as long as he possibly can and also, we would all do the same ourselves, but we doubt the justice of the policy of the Government officials. In fact the Customs Department has hung on to unsatisfactory methods longer than many other Departments but if the officials will be wise in their generation, they will be in the future, a little more circumspect in their general actions. In time the present auctioneer has come to the front with reference to this Department, which is to say the least, is not exactly the thing. A strict time saves nine.

Totalisator. The decision of the most honorable Right Honourable the Chief Justice in the past few months has been a most decided one. It has made to get a Bill through the Parliament legalising the totalisator of the effort, the Bill will be passed and the totalisator will be for many months. In the meantime the Book-makers are having a most successful time of the whole objection. The totalisator is the most satisfactory check on the vagaries of the 'Bookie' and the natural law of the 'Bookie' put up a strong case against the totalisator and won, much to the benefit of his own purse. Our Turf Club Authorities would do well to examine their own position for there might be a case made out against them at any time by one or other of their members at Nairobi at the expense of the totalisator. In passing it would be well to get the Bill of the East Africa Turf Club not to let out on hire the totalisator plant in the future, for by thus doing they are most deliberately breaking the law and if the Chief of the Police should

be not connected with the totalisator which have been started in the past few months and are doing so in a most successful manner. The State of San Francisco is in a most appalling - we hear of little, the Mayor of this city is troubled on account of the new proposition at the totalisator, but the last mail brought news that 120,000 persons are crowded in San Francisco and 30,000 are destitute outside of San Francisco. Further, to prove the presence of great destitution in San Francisco, and the fact that it is not for many months by some of the General (Greely's) war to some of the soldiers of San Francisco - that is the first of next November, the rains begin, the soldiers should erect wooden barracks to house 70,000 persons. For God's sake believe that at least 100,000 might still be dependent on charity six months hence.

At Valparaiso: The latest news states that 10,000 persons are crowded on board such steamers in the harbor as escaped the great tidal waves. Only ten buildings escaped.
