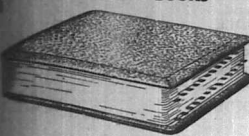

### THE CONFERENCE ON CUSTOMS DUTIES.

(Continued from page 1.)

Kenya had to protect certain industries which were being developed by white population. As a result of such protection Kenya has shown rapid development.

Trade of the Colony. He quoted figures showing that in 1927 (the latest trade returns available) the total trade per head of the population of Nigeria was Shs. 25; while that of Kenya and Uganda was Shs. 40; and suggested that if the 25 millions resulting from the tin industry in Nigeria were subtracted the trade per head for Kenya and Uganda were double that for Nigeria.

These figures show that where there is the energy of a white population trade returns are high. Such trade must benefit the commercial community. Even if produce is sold direct to England or through Co-operative Societies the money resulting from such sales is spent on imports which pass through the ordinary trade channels.

At present the trade per head of population in Tanganyika is about Shs. 11. Will Tanganyika follow the Kenya or the Kenya policy?

Kenya adopts the dual policy of European and Native development. Uganda is practically following the Nigerian policy. Of the total imports into Kenya and Uganda the 1929 proportions were 67.50 per cent. Kenya and 32.50 per cent. Uganda.

Exports from Uganda have remained practically stationary for the last five years during the same period the exports from Kenya have increased by £1,000,000.

He mentioned the Wheat industry in Kenya which prior to 1924 had shown the greatest increase. In 1922 there were 13,000 acres under wheat; to-day there were 80,000 acres. He pointed out that the farmers and millers are not exploiting the public.

Local Distillers stated that for three quarters of a point of four required for 1 lb. had cost the baker at Nairobi 18 cents at Kampala 15 cents and at Dar-es-Salaam 13 cents.

He urged Tanganyika and Uganda to follow Kenya's example in developing their tin and copper and policy lines and not to depend solely on native production.

Tanganyika Assembly. The Hon. Mr. General L. B. Boyd Moss thanked Lord Del-

more for placing his views before the meeting. He suggested that the Delegation from Tanganyika should study the views of the Kenya Tariff Committee and, to-day, meet the views put forward by Kenya. The three Territories must stand together and look at the question from the point of view of East Africa. Protection should be added is probably necessary for certain industries in Kenya and Tanganyika will do all it can to further the economic development of the territories.

The Hon. Major Orpin considered the matter from a European point of view. The native can, at any time, be said to have a cry that ceases to be economic. The European, having heavy capital commitments, cannot do so. He suggested that the principle of protection is supported by all the Territories who rely on Customs for a large proportion of their revenue; the only question on which there is any difference of opinion is in the degree of application.

Protection means settlement, including farmers, traders, and artisans. Capt. W. Tyson considered that the opposition to protection arose from a misunderstanding and on the fact that, at one time, our protected products were insufficient for the consumption of the territories.

Col. Tucker replied that such objections should not again occur. He suggested that Tanganyika, which had made great strides in development during the last twelve months, possibly holds different views on the subject of protection to those held a few months ago.

The Hon. Capt. Kambui expressed the view that 75 per cent of the protective costs of East Africa are paid to the native and that of the 25 per cent goes back into trade.

### E. A. A. S. GOALS.

Major Perkins stated that the chief complaint of Tanganyika had been the shortage of supply of protected commodities. He commended the Report of the Kenya Tariff Committee which was a basis for discussion.

The Hon. Major Lord urged Delegates to consider East Africa as a whole. He stated that he had been a life-long Free Trader but admitted that the special circumstances of these young Colonies made a case for a protective policy during the development period. He was of opinion that the duties should be reviewed from time to time.


