The following notes dealing with the care and maintenance of the motor cycle are culled from the "Motor Cycle":

As a very effective method of liquid cooling, the motor cycle is usually equipped with aluminum cylinder heads and pistons and which does away with the necessity of refueling piston rings, in the employment of aluminum. The piston or head should first be washed in paraffin and then dried with a rag. If time permits it is a good plan to place them in front of a fire in order to expel the remaining paraffin. Next they should be placed in a receptacle to justify a just about right for a preliminary light ammonia. Care should be taken to have ammonia from fumes. After standing for an hour or two it will be found that most of the carbon can be wiped off, and if this paste are left for twenty-four hours, practically all of it will come away quite easily. The carbon behind the rings will be removed by turning the rings in the grooves, using the oil if it brings them inward.

Winding the Head.

One of the best tools can be made out of an old speaking pipe and a sheet of wood which is split, both of sheeted wood, both of which is a rubber shoe. Every body knows that the cylinder heads of c.v.s. engines are somewhat irregular and owing to this it is always the rule of cranking the head. Therefore, it is a much better idea to hold the head in the vice by means of an old speaking pipe secured into place in the lathe, better still, by the home-made device described. This plug will distribute away the entire dielectric ring. Now last, the speaking pipe and old plug it out with a hammer until it is too large to go through the locking ring. Slip the other end through the locking ring which should then be secured deep light into the base of the plug. Drive it at cut either side of the speaking pipe. The plug should be secured into the head and the speaking pipe held in the vice, as shown in the illustration.

Broken Valve Springs.

The following is a method which will generally overcome the difficulty attached to the removal of a broken valve-spring spring by placing the valve on a piece of wood and a screw into the valve head a hexagon nut of a suitable size.

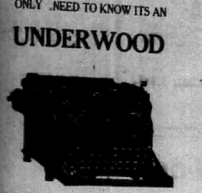

side which reservation was subject to interpretation by each Government as to what, itself and its ally, was that in a given case the Government would refuse resort to arbitration.

Pro- War Arbitration Delegates

The Optional Clause removed all the difficulties of the pre-war arbitration system. It conferred jurisdiction on all international disputes which could be settled by means of law. Under its terms no State could so refuse to allow a dispute to go before the court. No special agreement for the submission of a dispute would be required. No State by unilateral publication could avoid the obligation it so called to go to court.

We regard these changes, said Mr. Henderson, "as conferring great advantage upon the British Government. I say so because the British Government, in office in the past has desired and so it is believed, will continue to desire always that the country should be free from international disputes. We regard the Optional Clause as the logical sequent of our commitment to the Paris Peace of a year ago."

Words Must be Followed by Deeds

If the Pact was to be of real value and if it was to become a scrap of paper, it would must be followed by actual deeds. It was in part because the Government believed that by the country's strengthening the power of the Pact of Paris that they had destroyed as one of the first actions in their favour policy to accept and ratify the Optional Clause.

It is the opinion that the general acceptance of the Optional Clause by all members of the League of Nations would be a most powerful fact directly as well as indirectly in the creation of a new international security system. They were convinced that the creation of true international security was inseparably associated with the establishment of a strong and creditable system of arbitration.

British Reservations

Mr. Henderson said that he wanted to say very clearly and distinctly that the reservations were excluded from the British declaration of the Optional Clause. They were freely dispute with other

members of the British Commonwealth of Nations. The Government of Great Britain has not taken any action to ratify the Optional Clause. Mr. Henderson referred to the memorandum put down by the opposition during the acceptance of the Optional Clause "subject to the following reservation relating to the laws of war on sea, laid down by the Foreign Secretary at Geneva on September 22, 1924, as being absolutely necessary to safeguard the freedom of action of the British Government."

Mr. Henderson said that the operations of the British fleet which he was then referring to all Governments were exclusively operations in a case where they were engaged in warlike operations on behalf of the Council or League of Nations and with the approval of the Council or League of Nations. It was in these circumstances only that he said it was necessary in the general interests as well as the interests of Great Britain that the British fleet should be able to operate with freedom which might be required in the event of a war. In conclusion, Mr. Henderson said that all the Governments of the Dominion had signed the Optional Clause. WHAT IS WRONG WITH KENYA RUGBY?

Trenchant Criticisms By Well-Known Referee.

LESSONS WHICH HAVE NOT BEEN TAKEN TO HEART.

Duties of the Players on the Field.

Now why Kenya should not grovel to the same extent.

Not for the White Man!

Price to his offering to Kenya he had heard it stated that Kenya was not a white man's country! As far as he could see some of the boys at the moment were boys who had never been out of the country previous to that time capable of leading their own lives without the assistance of their parents. There were some who might disagree with his opinion in that they had been well educated by a school or two. Within the space of a few or twelve years Kenya which would be able to worthily uphold the traditions of the Colony.

One thing which must not be lost sight of and that was the lesson to the youth of the country. The great thing was to encourage them. The importance of that could be found in the following two instances. Again, about their minds look to the Spring-wood of 1906, at that time boys who had left Britain were 'come' here, while the whole of the South African 'African' was at that time was students at the Stellenbosch University.

Fostering The Game.

The only way they could hope to develop was to foster and teach the game in the youth. If they could succeed in inculcating it in the younger generation then the game would grow and prosper among the people. Many of the men who were playing Rugby in Kenya today were not taking the game seriously enough. These men thought they could do all sorts of things and at the same time being players. That was impossible. There was nothing more depressing than to see the game being played by such a lot of boys in their pockets throughout the whole game. Another point in which Kenya lacked was in not being progressive. They had in Kenya many representatives of the various public schools in Scotland and England. Each one had his own ideas of the game. They in Kenya were afraid to give up the old traditions. That was remarkable in the early 30's South Africa knew very little about the game of their present day people, and there was no rea-

Failure on the part of Kenya to assimilate to the fullest extent the lessons of the South African Universities tour were cited by Mr. J. G. Finlay, the prominent South African referee, who is accompanying the Students on their visit, as the principal cause of the failure of Rugby there. Only in one game had any real attempt been made to take to heart the lessons, and the effect had been at once apparent in the improved showing of the Kenya players.

If the game of Rugby was to progress in the Colony they must cast aside the old methods which presently bound the game, and move forward as the other countries had done. They must foster and encourage the youth of the Colony in the game, and so help its development.

DR. WILLIAMS AND A DISAPPOINTMENT.

Some trenchant criticisms of Kenya Rugby were offered by Mr. J. G. Finlay, the well-known South African referee and member of the Universities Rugby board party on Monday evening in the Avenue Hotel, in the course of a lecture on the game. The speaker was introduced by Dr. A. D. Williams, president of the Kenya Rugby Union, who presided. He had heard it stated frequently, said the lecturer at the outset, that there was something wrong with Kenya Rugby. These remarks had been particularly aptly followed in the last match recently played, with it to any view which was sufficiently interesting to face what was no mean representation of the cream of South African Rugby there, could not be very much wrong with such a Colony or with its Rugby. After all was said and done they had a very small white population, and he thought the fact that they could not even show the interest in the game they had done elsewhere to cast their minds only required to cast their minds when Mr. E. MacLagan a famous Scottish internationalist and Harrowed did exactly the same thing in South Africa as the students were doing today in Kenya. KIKUYU OPPOSE THE MARAGUA-YANA SCHEME.

(Continued from page 1.)

that the area in question was the thought of the same value as that which was included in the proposed power scheme and be informed that "I intend that in the old days we would have had a dam on the Maragua River to a large extent in that area south of Harau, so they actually looked at that land as their own."

Questioning the question of residence on the 1,000 acres required for the scheme, in reply to several questions Mr. Kikuyu said there was a negligible number of huts on the people who lived on the higher levels and only a few on the lower levels. He explained in response to a question by the Hon. Member for Constituency, that it was the intention of the Kikuyu to live on the valley. The area in question would probably have a useful field for the expansion of population owing to the density of the population in some parts of the reserve, which he estimated as high as 100 people as 600 to the square mile.

Undermining.

The District Commissioner was asked by Mr. Harau whether his opinion regarding the political office given earlier would apply to every piece of land required for public purposes or did it apply only to that particular transaction.

Mr. K. P. Kikuyu thought it did apply to that particular transaction because the circumstances were unfortunate. He pointed out again that it had occurred immediately after the destruction of the reserve and although the Maragua Land Trust Bill had approved it had not then actually come into being. A promise had undoubtedly been given to the natives and the administration, had been made, and he thought to go so far that the land was to be given to the natives and would be most unfortunate if they were not to go back on their word.

Compensation.

He thought proper compensation would leave the native absolutely satisfied and the only just compensation would be an equal area of land or some other. They would, in his opinion, take an equivalent area, equally new but however much land they were given he did not think they would take it without resentment.

There was always a feeling of suspicion that this land might be taken over from them again. He feared that no reasonable compensation would be made for the money to go there, because of that deep feeling of suspicion he could not get away from.

A Better's Scheme.

The next witness was Mr. Ernest Thony, a local farmer and planter. His own view was that there was a plot of land on the Maragua River just below the Harau Dam on which there were some head works recently completed for the purpose of generating power. On that land which amounted to roughly 200 acres, there was a fall of 200 feet. Mr. Corviale had surveyed the fall, which with the present flow required for the 7.5 MW would develop 2,000 h.p. that was equal about 100 h.p. That they tried to get Armstrong Wharfedale to find the money to develop those falls, in discussing the matter with his telephone company in London, the firm said that that fall could be developed to 5,000 h.p. power through its turbines for a sum of £40,000, and if they got the contract they could do it in six months.

Then supposing that it was not enough for the Power Company's requirements, could there make up the river there was another waterfall on the Maragua River of another 200 feet. Mr. Thony said he believed it could be harnessed in very cheaply—he had only about 10 h.p. of water over the land with an amount. It was the same river that gave Harau its power. The problem was that the upper fall could be harnessed to yield about 1,000 h.p.

An Alternative.

He thought it would be possible for the Power Company to come to some agreement with the Maragua Power Co. to buy up their water and make full use of the rest of the river without any flooding whatever and without any disturbance to the natives. Harau given technical details of the works he considered would be necessary. Mr. Thony said that the Maragua Power Company had hoped to be able to supply an area of about 100 h.p. (Continued on page 10).

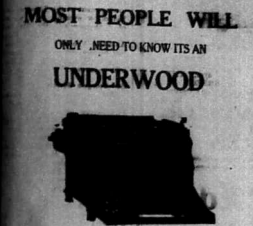
