THE REGISTRATION OF DOMESTIC SERVANTS.

To be Applied to the Towns First.

UNSUITABLE SERVANTS.

How the Employer may be Safeguarded.

The Domestic Servants Ordinance was discussed by the Convention of Associations at their sitting in Nairobi on Friday, and it was suggested that its application should be extended through out the Colony. The motion was eventually withdrawn.

Mr. A. E. Bester (Tika) proposed the following resolution:— That this Convention is of the opinion in view of the increasing danger to European women and children that Government should be urged to amend the Domestic Servants Ordinance as soon as possible. The motion, he said, had been brought forward as a result of considerable feeling in his district. They had been given to understand that the Ordinance was only going to be applied to the Nairobi area and they wanted it extended all over the country. All present natives were engaged without character, or faras, or if they had the latter, they might not have been manufactured. He did not think that the application of the Ordinance in the outlying districts was any harder on the native or the employer than it was in the townships. Many people thought that the difficulty could be overcome by using squatter labour as domestic servants, but he reminded them that on many of the coffee farms there was no squatter labour, as the size of the farms did not permit of it. It was frequently necessary for women and children to be left alone on farms and that should not be done, if nothing was known of the native servants.

Mr. Newton (Kipkarua) seconded the motion, and quoted an instance of a native employed by him as a houseboy who had been convicted of theft.

THE PAST YEAR'S WORK

THANKS FIRST.
Colonel Durham explained that at present settlers could obtain information about matters they were too busy to do. The Government Members had proposed to apply the Ordinance to the whole country, but Government had replied that it intended to apply it to Nairobi, Nakuru, and Eldoret.
Mr. C. K. Archer (Baring) said he understood Government intended to apply the Ordinance to the towns first to see how it worked. He submitted that it might be better to hold the report in the hands of the Government Members.
Colonel Kirkwood endorsed the views of Colonel Durham and Mr. Archer. He considered that the appropriate Government Officers should have been present for the discussion. He understood that the Ordinance would be applied in Nairobi and Mombasa first and that the cost of application would be about £10,000.
Colonel Durham said the last statement was misleading, as it should pay for itself when established.

Official Position
Mr. R. F. Spoor said that as Commissioner of Police he had successfully lifted the burden on to the shoulders of the Chief Registrar of Natives. But as he had collaborated with him he could explain the position. The great difficulty about applying it to the outlying districts was the machinery which it was necessary to use to put it into operation. It was hoped that it would be made effective in Nairobi and Mombasa and that it would spread to other towns and if found to be efficient to the whole of the settled areas. The opening stages required heavy machinery which covered the registration of all the natives and it became easier when it was only a matter of re-registering them. It was hoped that the staff which did the work in Nairobi and then Mombasa would be able to carry on with the work elsewhere afterwards.

If anyone wrote to the Police they were only too glad to tell them whether in their opinion a native was suitable for domestic employment. They were not allowed to disclose any sentences which a native might have. A native was not suitable for domestic employment when he was convicted of such offences as theft by a servant, and was

He called upon those for cordial co-operation in the great Ministry of the Christian Church for the welfare of the Colony. It was impossible, he said, to overstate the value placed of the Christian Church in the life of the Native.

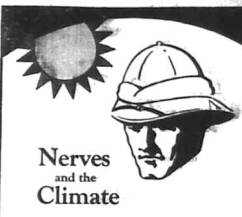

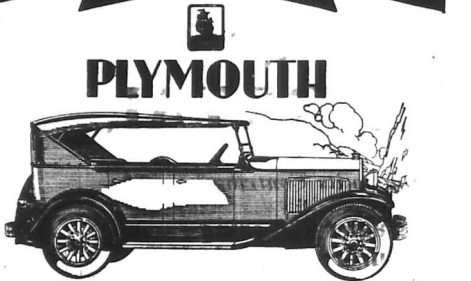

ROAD DEVELOPMENT. KENYA.

(Continued from page 1.)

At the Government had given a measure of road government and had also assumed the responsibility in road matters. Powers were given to the new road authority by additional legislation. Government now said "You have got your money, 200,000,000. The basic road grant was a very small one and worked out at about only 410 or 414 a mile. This only permitted the occasional scraping of the surface. The basic road grant for the whole of Kenya amounted to only £35,000 which was the extraordinary percentage of 1.4 of the revenues of the Colony."

A Major Issue. Continuing, the speaker quoted a leading section in the East African Standard in which the matter of roads was referred to as a "major issue." The idea of spending only 1.4 per cent of the Colony's revenues on what was a major issue was surely totally inadequate. The traffic and the weight of traffic was increasing and as an increasing amount of heavy produce was transported we have to play with the roads. He suggested to Government that it was necessary to introduce a different system—namely, whereby an increasing sum of money was provided for roads in proportion to the increasing revenue.

The revenue at present was in the region of two and a half million sterling, but it was hoped and expected that in a few years that would become five millions. That could only be done by increased trade and increased produce, and therefore increased traffic. He did not propose a definite figure but suggested that Government should consider that the revenue should be a vital one and one which very materially affected the progress of the Colony. It was well known that when communications were improved, trade followed, and the revenue would undoubtedly increase.

The figure he had quoted of 1.4 per cent referred only to the basic road grant. They admitted that there were other sums spent on the for trunk-roads. These roads needed a much larger amount than all the others. It was only he included the percentage would be 4.8.

Mr. Robinson (Hume) welcomed the motion. Colonel Hume had opposed the motion in its present form and confessed that

he was unable to follow it or to follow the argument of the speaker. He did not know how the percentage had been arrived at, as in addition to the basic road grant of 20 per cent allowed for roadward expenses. He thought the speaker was "When" the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement should have been present.

Colonel Hume, C. G. Durham said that he was supporting the motion but as it appeared on the paper. He hoped the Executive would consider the matter. There were other officials involved. In addition to the 20 per cent, there was also a sum of £10,000 which was provided for sanitary.

Amendments Proposed. Mr. Dumbury (Dempy Sabaki) suggested that whatever the percentage was he thought they were all agreed that the amount spent on roads was too small. Mr. Robinson (Hume) suggested the deletion of the words "approximately 20 per cent" from the resolution.

After Mr. Turton (Nandi) had expressed his support for the resolution of the motion, Major Lawry (Sabaki) suggested the substitution of the word "target" for the word "definite."

The amendments being accepted by the proposer, the motion was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

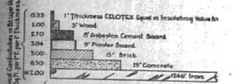

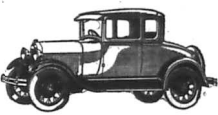

LIFTING, STORING AND PLANTING DAHLIA TUBERS.

(Continued.)

Best Situation for Dahlias.

The ideal situation for dahlias is an open sunny, sheltered from wind. Never plant dahlias near a water pipe or under trees, they will be stunted and fresh air circulating through and round the plants. It is a fact that the blooms of some varieties turn black in too hot sunbath, and if a situation can be found where plants can be shaded during the heat of the day, say from noon to 3 p.m., this would be perfection. If, in a better way, a few well-bleached blossoms in place of weak, drawn, aspy plants bearing flowers with drooping heads, such as are produced when planted too near to trees.

In many gardens too much open situation can be found for the dahlia patch, but don't worry often than not it is wind-swept, which really is fatal to dahlias. This difficulty can be overcome by planting a quick-growing tall hedge, or even a row of trees some distance away to form a complete windbreak which will not only supply the soil but form an artistic setting and background of green, greatly enhancing the beauty and colour of the dahlias.

Correct Soil Condition.

Most soils can be made suitable for the successful growing of dahlias; they are most accommodating subjects, thriving luxuriantly in any soil, provided they receive plenty of food and moisture, as well as good drainage. The ideal soil however is a medium, heavy, well loam, rich in humus, the latter can be supplied in the shape of well-rotted cow or stable manure, decayed vegetable matter and leaf-mould.

Now, as the best time to dig and manure soil, this will vary according to the situation, soil and climate in different localities. One cannot lay down a few rules that will generally speaking, heavy and medium soils should be worked during autumn and allowed to winter fallow during winter. Light soils may be worked in spring.

when, it is a wet, sodden condition, this will tend to make it more compact, whereas a rough, open condition, though not so good, that the elements may be stirred up, aerating and pulverizing. Heavy and Medium Soils. These soils may be manured at the same time as they are being dug, which is during autumn, when rough stable manure may be used as well as partly decayed vegetable matter, and a dressing of rough bonemeal applied at the rate of about 10 lbs. to a plot 100 feet square. They will, moreover, may receive a dressing of some additional, with benefit, the whole well-incorporated with the soil.

Light Sandy Soils. These soils should be dug as deeply as possible, a further work of light, sandy soil for the best results they should be as thoroughly consolidated as possible, this work is best done when the soil is a heavy friable condition, not too wet with a stagnation or tramping it, just before planting time. It is the only available, but exceedingly, to have a crop of something growing on it during the winter months, even weeds are better than nothing at all during the winter, the top soil from being washed away by heavy rain, and being blown away by the stormy winds of July and August.

Planting of Tubers. Tubers are to be planted in rows as provided, which is early

during autumn as already explained, and a green crop sown deep in during early spring. After the soil has settled, a layer of 2 to 3 feet of manure, which at this time may be sweet and well-decomposed, is sown manure to both soils and new manure for light soils—fill holes with soil into which the tubers or plants will be sown, or the tubers or roots of plants to come into contact with manure of any description (natural or artificial) at planting time, for the tender growing points of the young roots are most sensitive and easily injured by coming into contact with manure at this time, causing stunted weakly plants, for which the new-growers is an often blamed.

Planting of Tubers. Tubers are to be planted in rows as provided, which is early

September in warm localities or during the latter part of August, according to the season. In colder parts October is the best planting month for tubers.

Plant tubers in the centre of prepared holes flat on with the growing eye pointing upwards. The latter part of the manure of the tuber (with a sharp knife) being planted, as explained earlier in these notes. Plant at least 18 inches deep, after which give a thorough soaking of water, and keep just moist during the winter. New developed and plants are growing strongly and plants will be ready to suffer from drought.

Planting of Green Plants.

Plants should be thoroughly watered before being removed from propagators in which they are growing, for transplanting into their permanent quarters. This work requires to be done with the utmost care so as to disturb the roots as little as possible, the ball of soil surrounding the roots should be kept intact, or plants will require a check later on. The ball at least, the depth it was originally growing in the pots. Water thoroughly after planting, shade for a couple of days in warm weather and keep just moist, never dry, until plants will require more, and more water as they develop, until when in full flower, they will need at least a large bucketful of water a day.

Water.

Don't plant a dahlia near trees. Don't neglect plants when in flower; keep well cultivated. Don't allow plants to suffer from drought. Don't over-water newly-planted tubers or plants. Don't pull dumps by the stem at lifting time. Don't divide dumps until growing eyes are well defined. Don't allow clumps to decay in storage. Don't allow clumps to thrive in storage. (W.A. Gardening and Country Life).

Preservation of Game.

THE UKREWEK ELEPHANTS.

To the Editor "E.A. Standard."—Sir,—In view of the amount of information which has been obtained in connection with the depredations and destruction of game, I would like to submit the following instances which have occurred recently in Tanganyika Territory.

The first case reveals an entire lack of sympathy with the preservation of wild life.

I have been informed on impeccable authority that the Special Elephant Bearer on Ukrewke Island situated North of Nyanza in Lake Victoria Nyanza, has been abolished and the Elephants which had their habitat there (200 in number) have been exterminated.

Apparently representations made to the Provincial Commissioner then in charge of the island with the usual plea of damage to cultivation on the island advanced as a pretext.

Unfortunately the views of the Director, Game Department were overruled though he strongly opposed. Destruction was given and a Cultivation Protector sent to the island to kill off the whole herd.

The damage actually caused to the plantation is reported as negligible besides which the real estate of the Ukrewke Island consisted of nearly 200 sq. miles of dense forest in the interior.

This unique sanctuary in Africa had become a thing of the past.

A second instance occurred in the same area, the number of natives of the Ukruka Tribe who inhabited the Island of Ukruka were instructed by the P.C. to move off to the mainland and settle down there as there appeared to be rather over-crowded conditions. It is a fact that a headman that came would be a nuisance to the cultivation.

Promptly the P.C. gave instructions to build a game-sterve, which was done and over 500 animals were driven into a coil of one net and slaughtered. The number was quoted by an eyewitness as a conservative figure.

The sequel to the latter was revealed when an official subsequently stated that there was no settlement had presumably been created. He found that the natives had returned to their original island home.

It seems a shame that the efforts of the Game Department to protect fauna are nullified in this way and until the sympathy and active assistance of the public is elicited, further cases of such nature are likely to occur.
