THE PRINCE ARRIVING TO DAY

"MODASA" AHEAD OF SCHEDULED TIME.

Prince to be Greeted by the Governor.

ASHORE AT DAR-ES-SALAAM.

Smooth Journey in Pilot Boat to Tanganyika Capital.

"Standard" Correspondent. Mombasa, Monday. His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales will arrive at the "Modasa" to-morrow morning at daybreak, the only having made the passage at least a full day earlier than was anticipated.

There was no official reception in the case of the Governor and there will be none tomorrow for the Prince. He will descend the gangway as unostentatiously as an ordinary passenger. The Prince is accompanied by Colonel the Hon. Piers Litch and Captain Alford. The party is escorted by Inspector Burt of Scotland Yard and the Prince's valet.

"Standard" Correspondent. Dar-es-Salaam, Sunday. The "Modasa" arrived off Dar-es-Salaam at 5.30 on Saturday evening. The Governor's launch put out to meet the Prince ashore but the sea was too rough so the Hon. Piers Litch and Captain Alford went out to greet the Prince and escorted the Prince ashore.

His Royal Highness went to Government House on landing but at about 11 o'clock he arrived with His Excellency Sir Donald Cameron and Lady Cameron at the Gymkhana Club where a dango was in progress. He was accorded an enthusiastic reception. He dined with several local ladies and remained at the Club until the "Modasa" which had come into harbour. The ship left this forenoon and a large crowd assembled at the narrow entrance to cheer the Prince.

ELUSIVE ELEPHANTS.

The Governor's train left Nairobi at 10 o'clock yesterday and arrived at Mombasa at 4.30 this morning. It will then be on the way to Dar-es-Salaam. In view of the recent capture of an elephant, it is believed that the Prince will be advised by the Government to leave Mombasa as early as possible. It is anticipated that he will leave today (Sunday) for Dar-es-Salaam at 8.30 on Government House.

It is now possible to get a first-hand account of the Prince's journey at the expense of the Government. It is believed that the Prince will be accompanied by several ladies and that he will be met at the station by the Governor and his family.

The Prince is due to leave Nairobi for Dar-es-Salaam on March 10. He will travel straight through. He is expected to arrive at Dar-es-Salaam on March 11 and will join the a.s. Government train also proceeding westward from Dar-es-Salaam.

THE CASE FOR THE GEAR BOX

Necessity for Double-Clutching

HOW TO MAKE QUINT CHANGES

(Continued.)
Where this is the case, it points out the absence of a fibre clutch-top to the obvious need for clamping down the lubricant in the gearbox. Use a clean vessel as a container and drain off the lubricant in the box after coming to a full stop of approximately half of the clutch and make it up to the previous level with good oil. With a double-deck gear it should then be possible to make a "straight-through" change from first to second.

If, despite this partial remedy, the layshaft still shows up too quickly, "double-deck" change-up must be employed. The procedure is simple and is as follows—when the clutch, rev. the gear lever into neutral, re-engage the clutch, rev. up the engine slightly, disengage and shift the gear lever into the second-gear notch. The trouble is usually more pronounced when changing from first to second, because there is, in fact, a greater difference in ratio between first and second than between the other ratios.

As the gearbox wears up a little "straight-through" change-up is impossible and a pause with the gear lever in neutral becomes necessary. This call for no judgment as to one or two having exactly when a pause will be required in order to make a dead gear change.

Using the Engine as a Gear Brake

Many people fail to realize that the speed depends on the speed of the car if at the moment the change of gear is made. To reduce the duration of this pause, double-deck change-up may easily be employed, but with one important modification—no use of the accelerator pedal should be made. Instead of using the engine to rev. up, the layshaft slightly it is engaged as it breaks to slow it down. Thus, if a car is driven fast as it is put in gear, it is

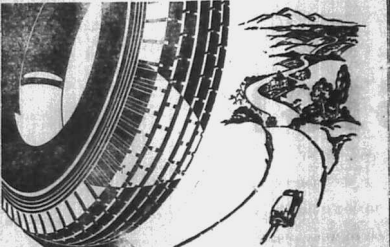

THE PRINCE ARRIVES IN KENYA.

Quiet Disembarkation at Mombasa. NO OFFICIAL RECEPTION.

Expected to Leave Last Night for First Safari Camp.

Mombasa, Tuesday. His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales disembarked on the British India steamer "Modana" at 8.30 o'clock this morning.

There was no reception of any sort. Even His Excellency the Governor, Sir Edward Grigg, did not attend. The Prince and in this and every other possible position every effort was made to respect the Prince's wishes for a quiet and entirely unofficial holiday. He came from Africa to-day as an ordinary visitor would come. There was nothing of the setting into which he stepped on the "Maida" in 1928—no red carpeted stairway to the wharf, no vast crowds of the motley ranks of East Africa, no officials of the Government in white uniforms and plumed hats, no Indian ladies in gorgeous silken dresses and only the mere resort in the hospitable arms of friends who over a year ago crowded every vantage point on the arrival of the King's son.

The wharf was not exactly deserted—because Kilindi and his always a hive of industry nowadays—but but the only official to see the Prince was exceedingly discreet in his dimensions although it sufficed to indicate to the Prince the fact that in Mombasa—the Gateway to East Africa—a warm welcome awaited him as he passed into the port.

Although the "Modana" arrived in port early, the Prince remained in his cabin until the arrival of the hour had been selected for disembarkation. When he reached the wharf he had made straight for a taxi and used this hired conveyance to take him to Government House where the Governor awaited him.

His staff—Colonel John Leigh and Captain J. J. Lind—accompanied him.

Although I understand that the Prince will leave Mombasa by his special train this evening at seven thirty, the greatest reticence is being displayed here regarding his movements.

There was apparently some doubt as to whether he would go so far as Mwingu or to Voi although I understand that he will be making his first stopping place at Mwingu.

THE VOYAGE.

Speaking to some of the Prince's fellow-passengers who arrived with the "Modana" I gathered that the voyage was of the most uneventful character. The Prince occupied an ordinary deck cabin and no special arrangements were made for him. He kept very much to himself during the voyage and seemingly desired as much privacy as possible. But when he came on deck he spoke in his most friendly fashion with those around him. There was some dancing during the trip from Beira and no festivities of any kind.

When the "Modana" reached Tangai the Prince went ashore and played a round of golf which he apparently enjoyed very much after being so restricted in his movements on board.

Mombasa, Tuesday. It is now definitely established that the Prince of Wales is going to Mungu to-night by special leaving at 11.30. The Prince spent the day at Government House and it is understood, as is playing golf this afternoon.

AGRICULTURE.

NATIONAL FIGHT AGAINST SOIL EROSION IN S. AFRICA.

Definite Action Being Taken by Bodies Concerned.

A national objective in which the Government, the Provincial Administrations, the Municipalities and Farmers' organisations will participate has been inaugurated in South Africa against soil erosion. The various bodies will be responsible for the hands they administer and the general policy to be adopted will be set out by the Minister of Agriculture, who will be assisted by a strong advisory committee. Research will be encouraged and an extensive propaganda campaign will be organised.

A conference was recently called off at Pretoria by the Minister of Agriculture, General Kemp, when the problem was considered in all its different aspects by representatives of different Provincial Councils, Municipal Associations and the agricultural unions.

The conference referred to the seriousness of the present position, the blame for which it was pointed out, could not be apportioned to any one particular section of the community, all sections—the Government Departments, Provincial Administrations, municipal bodies and the agricultural population—being responsible in part for the bare and broken condition of the land which is being crumpled up and carried to the sea by the rivers and winds.

After welcoming the delegates present at the conference, the Minister, in his opening address, said that the task of combating soil erosion was a great one, but the encouraging response to his call gave him also courage for the future. He hoped that the discussions would result in joint action in the solution of the difficulties encountered.

Combating soil erosion was of national importance; he said of every citizen of the country. The Railways should make special provision to prevent their lines from being washed away. The Roads Department and divisional councils had continually to repair damaged roads at great expense.

and this touched the pocket of every taxpayer. The farmer, unless he took early measures against soil erosion, knew that it would reduce the yielding capacity of his farm, and that drought occurred more often and became more intense than in the past. Millions of pounds were invested in dams, and the great problem was "What provision should be made for the silt?"

South Africa, said, was the only country faced by this evil. Other countries, for instance France and the United States, had already tackled this problem systematically and had obtained results which convinced him that the time had arrived for the country to take definite action.

In the United States, it was estimated that the annual loss resulting from soil erosion was \$600,000,000 and that already eight million acres of cultivable soil had been destroyed. In Texas the terracing system was used on a large scale with extraordinarily good results. The Federal Department of Agriculture was at present engaged in drawing up an extensive programme for controlling the problem in the other States; by extending these standards in the eighteenth most seriously affected districts, to about 100,000 acres.

Unfortunately, in South Africa, no figures were available to show what its estimated losses were as a result of soil erosion, but it needed no more than a quick journey through the country, even by rail, to convince every thinking person that the losses were tremendous and that the country would be faced with even more serious disaster if no definite steps were taken.

The Minister proceeded to quote a few instances to explain the present position.

He mentioned, had

estimated that, in 1919-1920, nine of the principal rivers of the principal rivers of the Union, or about one million square miles of one-foot deep. It was not surmountable, and it is contended that, as a result of the severe drought of 1921, the quantity of cultivable soil carried away annually since the report was issued had considerably increased.

Soil erosion, he pointed out, was to some extent indirectly responsible for the losses of stock caused by drought, as it reduced the great surface and the draining water.

Fountains and hoses that were previously strong, were dry and no security that water would survive periods of drought. The additional costs incurred annually in reaching the lower water level were a burden which every citizen should bear a share.

Investigation Commission, the decrease in the population in certain districts was closely related to the question of soil erosion. The total number of deaths in the Union during a decrease of European rural population during this period was seventy-six, divided among the provinces as follows: Cape Province, fifty; Natal and Zululand, nine; Transvaal, six; Orange Free State, eleven.

Several existing rivers, especially in the Karoo, were reported to be silted and valuable wide with little streams of water. For instance in 1952 the Tlokoeng River, a wide river, practically without banks, and covered with grass and other plants. To-day, the bed of the river was a sterile, hot, bare, and the surrounding surface ground level, to the 100 ft. Fall

PROS AND CONS FOR RACING.

Does it improve the Breed.

AN IMPARTIAL REVIEW.

Does racing improve the breed? The answer is "Yes and No." Yes, because only the competitive spirit engendered by competition can keep us right up to date; No, because racing has evolved a stereotyped machine, admirable for its purpose but, by no means ideal for sporting purposes—for the use of the everyday rider.

The fact of the matter is that there are, or can be, two breeds—the racing breed which is being overproduced, and the touring breed which has been in danger of extinction. At the present time we are suffering from a hybrid with a strong bias of the racing type.

Fortunately there are signs that the touring machine is to return to favour; for when it does so the market for motor cycles will increase and the public prejudice will decrease.

We can arrive at without the racing machine, and we must ever be grateful to such events as the Tourist Trophy races for producing machines which will cheer, bridle, and accelerate as do our present-day machines. Herein lies the danger that has produced the present noisy, intractable, dirty and unworkable machines of to-day.

The time of the Sports Bus.

Now jump on me, you enthusiasts! I am quite prepared to defend myself. The modern sports machine is stand and sturdy, than with an unbiased spirit. The modern sports machine is stand and sturdy, than with an unbiased spirit.

Why—let choice up the reasons for a few seconds and listen to the din from piston, valve gear, chains and gear box, and you will realize that it must take some constant to another it.

Intrestless—Take your best out on the road and see if you can do a steady 10 m.p.h., on top gear for a mile without stalling, misfiring, or a halt on the clutch lever.

doubt if you will be within five miles of it.

Dirty—Quite a short trip on a really wet day will plaster both machine and rider; otherwise, why all these advertisements for overalls?

Uncomfortable—Well, this is all a matter of degree, but let us see a decent spring frame and a modern four-cylinder engine, and you will see what I mean.

Now, I have to admit that there are machines which are quite different from most of these headings, though they are few and far between; and if they are, resounded from racing, means that these machines have become obscured by a cloud of interesting, ignorance. That knowledge gleaned from racing has some truth in them is also true.

Some of its Good Points.

I have to admit says "Unique in the Motor Cycle," that really modern racing machines, which include tremendously stiff crankshafts and crank cases and pistons, tend to make the single a remarkably smooth and pleasant engine to ride, and go a long way towards the removal of the "staggered" effect, "the steam hammer"; but, on the other hand, they tend to make a lot of metal bang around a single piston.

Let us not quite rate the modern high-speed single as a marvel. It has no distribution troubles, it produces immense power for its weight, it is remarkably simple, and it is, in many ways, a masterpiece of skillful, its balance is astonishingly good.

But with the magneto set for high speeds, it is useless to start on a cold morning, its power at low speeds is rather poor or spotty, it is very heavy, and it is almost impossible to adjust.

For racing it has proved itself to be almost ideal; for touring purposes it should be the last of all the very possible machines of to-day.

Do not make angles by all means, for the racing man and the sporting rider. Everyone knows that the sports angle in the back-bone is the one to watch; it is the one that must be encouraged, but why not develop the industry, run parallel with the other.

It is no good protesting that the racing single develops the cheap machine, it does not—since the price of the T.T. reaps models.

Compare, for the sake of example, to the price of such machines compare with those of such first-class four-cylinder home as the Douglas or the Matchless "Silver Arrow".

I have time to say these things, for I am still young enough to enjoy the ride of a hot-foot single beneath me, but it is useless to shut our eyes to the fact that the present-day motor cycle has a tendency to be entirely to the youthful set.

What Borneo the Enemy of Sport.

Now let me suggest an idea which will shock you with its beauty.

In the present time most so-called touring machines are modified speed bikes, and, good as they are at the job, they will shortly be superseded by twins and fours with unit construction and spring frames. When this millennium arrives—and I do not think that it is far off—a reversal of practice will take place and the touring machine will become the pattern for speed machines.

The spring frame will help to keep the rear wheel on the ground (for what home is a real money of speed), and the little multi-cylinder engine, with its smooth torque and brilliant acceleration, will give the single a run for its money in any road event.

In such times we misjudging and wealthier protection, racing and touring interests are directly opposed, and, with limits, weight is of little moment to the racing man, though it is the highest of the multi-speed tourist or the gift motor cycle.

The weight of most modern machines as ridden in the T.T. (without electric lighting, horn, and motor, and with the exception of mudguards and tool kits) is enough to harry any potential motor cyclist, and yet this weight shows tendency to increase.

After this trade it is only fair to give credit where credit is due, and to praise, particularly road racing—has done an enormous amount for.

It is in doing it has taught us how to design machines which start and ride in perfection, which develop immense power for their capacity, and maintain their power output over long periods.

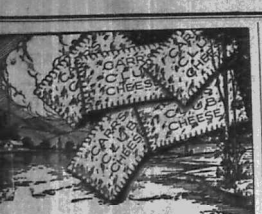

STORM IN FOOTBALL WORLD.

Protest by Amateurs Against Professionals.

BETTER FIGHT IN PROSPECT.

STANDARD (CORRESPONDENT).
London, January 16.
A storm of protest by the amateur footballers of this country has been raised against not only the decision of the Football Association to give another four seats to the Football League on the council of the parent body, making eight in all, but against the method by which they passed the Resolution, and it looks as though there is to be a bitter fight on the part of amateurs against rule by professionals.

The facts leading up to the controversy are as follows. The F.A. had an extraordinary general meeting for the purpose mentioned. When the talking was over and there were cries of "Vote" it was seen that the gathering was almost equally divided. Sir Charles Clegg, the President, announced that there were 41 votes against the proposal that eight seats on the Council should be allotted to the League, and added "and 46 for the motion and 112 protest." Then the President said—"On these figures I have to declare the resolution carried. In speaking Mr. H. A. Olivetti (A. R. B.) and demanded a poll whereupon Mr. H. A. Olivetti said that a poll must be demanded in writing and he was given 10 minutes to leave present. The President having the sense of taking a poll "hardly with" decided that that course be taken. Were the League to be dissolved, he would do anything for the F.A.S. The professional club had to find funds and players for every seat and constant. Mr. H. Jones (Dulwich) Hamlet thought it well to remind Mr. McKenna that amateur clubs provided the players for the professional teams.

A special meeting of the Amateur Football Association has been called to discuss the matter. It is understood that the legality of the action is being questioned. The F.A.S. has been advised to be opposed to the sending out of any players without any sanction having been given in the presence of the Association.

Obviously the feeling between amateurism and professionalism is fast becoming bitter. The real point is that 90 per cent. of the people of this country are amateurs and naturally they do not wish their interests, governed by Professionalism. Inevitably, however, with the interests of fact, but at least are anxious that no precipitate action will be taken until the matter has been most thoroughly discussed. There is no doubt that some drastic talking will be needed to clear the air, and it is felt that the F.A. were very unwise in employing press witnesses to the fact in a matter which was bound to be controversial.
