

With such a resource at his elbow, however, a man comes as near to omniscience as is possible in these days and there never was a time when the value, the practical value, of information was more appreciated. The 29 volumes are witness to the amount there is to learn, but also to the amount that can be learned, with such a guide, greatly to the profit of the reader.
