REDUCING COST OF LIVING.
Cheaper Bread and Butter.
WELCOME SIGNS.

Bakers Follow Example Set by Millers.

Several important reductions in the prices of local foodstuffs have taken place during the past few weeks and there is a reasonable expectation that this first set of official statistics will reflect a welcome downward tendency in what is known as the index figure.

The price of bread has long been a common source of complaint and it was hoped that the recent reduction in the price of flour by ten per cent. would be passed on to the consumer. This concession is to all intents and purposes guaranteed by the decision of Nairobi bakers to reduce the retail price of their loaf by five cents and follows a similar step taken some months ago by one of the suburban suppliers.

Another indication of the trend of prices is the announcement that from to-day the wholesale prices of butter will be reduced by 15 per cent. This is explained by the fact that an improvement in the London market prices has enabled the companies to make a return to the charge which ruled in April before the overseas market was closed.

It will also be recalled that at least one dairy decided recently that from to-day the price of milk would be reduced and the consumers had a hope expressed by the statement that, as in the case of bread, this example to the rest of the suppliers will be followed by other retailers.

PROGRESS OF R.100'S FLIGHT TO CANADA.

The Anshir R 100 continues to make good progress in her flight to Canada. A message timed noon (G.M.T.) says her position was 64-40 North 90-20 West—roughly half way across the Atlantic.

An earlier message at about seven in the morning stated that the vessel was having a good day so far. The weather was very clear. At noon, when the ship's speed was 70 knots she stopped off at sea, being two hours in sight of the coast of Newfoundland. Everything then was O.K.

The Air Ministry this evening stated that the Anshir appeared to have passed to the North of a dangerous strait in the mid-Atlantic where she would encounter a heavy fog. It was then entering a region of the mid-Atlantic where the weather was showing no great vigour which led her to believe that she was in a safe area.

Reports from Montreal state that landing conditions are unlikely to be difficult. The R 100 embarked upon a trans-Atlantic flight in April before the overseas market was closed.

Wide Range of Agenda.
EMPIRE TRADE.

Extent and Effect of Tariff Preferences.

The wide scope of the coming Imperial Conference was indicated by the Prime Minister in the course of a reference to the subject in the House of Commons. In the economic sphere inter-Imperial trade and possible tariff changes will be discussed, with special reference to the work of the Empire Marketing Board and Agricultural Research as other matters which will engage the attention of the Conference.

A BIG PROGRAMME.

When asked in the House of Commons today for a statement as to the agenda of the Imperial Conference, the Prime Minister replied that the conference would afford an opportunity for a general review and discussion of all matters of inter-Imperial character relating to and arising from a discussion on the report of the Inter-Imperial Relations Committee of the conference of 1924. The special question of the position of women was included.

Foreign Policy. As regards foreign policy and defence the agenda would cover further development of the peace conference on the operation of Demilitarization.

tion that it would not be advisable to have other Imperial delegates than those mentioned above. Mr. Chamberlain and Sir Austen Chamberlain were asked for an undertaking that if any of the delegations desired the presence of members of the Dominions' staffs, they would be available within the conference.

The Prime Minister replied that he had declined to go further than the considered statement he had made.

On Thursday, Sir Austen Chamberlain asked the Speaker if he would be prepared to move an adjournment of the House tomorrow to discuss the refusal of the Government to invite the Chairman of the Commission to take part in the conference. The Speaker pointed out that such a motion under standing orders should be moved now but said that he would consider the motion and its merits when scheduled.

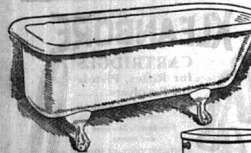

The latest wrap for such a frock is a soft velvet or velvet jacket with a wide circular cape to cover the arms. Such wraps are immensely popular.

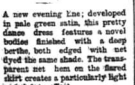
WHAT TO DO WITH LEFT-OVER FOOD.

However carefully we may cater, the table must at times present a heaping array of left-over food to be made tidy and used.

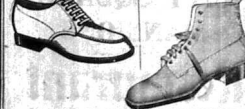

AFRICAN FILMS FOR THE AFRICAN.

A Suggestion by Sir Hesketh Bell.

RIGHT KIND OF PICTURE.

African films for the African is the theme of a letter to "The Times" by Sir Hesketh Bell, Secretary-General of the British Uganda, who has taken a very good interest in the subject of film cinematography. The letter is as follows:

... Up to a few years ago the picture of tropical Africa, India, Malaya, and the East Indies, the most important of the home films of the Empire, had only been shown here excepted their value as belonging to a race superior to them in culture, morals, and self-lightenment, and in India especially the prestige of the whole has been raised largely on the respect and consideration in which it has been held.

But about 15 years ago a new and most mischievous influence made its appearance in the tropical world. Almost suddenly and without warning cinema pictures, usually of a deplorable type, placed in the eyes of hundreds of thousands of uneducated natives (readers of the lives and habits of white people). Pictures representing white men indulging in every form of criminal act—robbery, rape, and murder—were displayed to the gaze of any native who could afford a few coppers for the entertainment. Worse than this, the exhibition of white women in a state of almost complete nudity and behaving in a shallow manner dealt a formidable blow at the respect in which the white race had previously been held. It is hardly too much to say that nothing has done more to destroy the prestige of the white man and to undermine the general respect of the natives against government of the Empire, which we are seeing every-where to-day, than the spread of these deplorable pictures.

In regard to Asiatic countries the harm has already been done and is almost irreparable. But in the greater part of our African Empire the damage is only in the early stages. There is still time to safeguard the 50,000,000 of our protected subjects in their part of the world from the disruptive influence which we are throwing them. No important vested interests have been created and the colonial governments are still in a position to furnish in work matters. Far from preventing the spread of cinema pictures among the natives of our African Colonies, the Protectors we should, on the

country, do all possible to encourage it. But we must try to let those pictures be British productions and of such a nature that they would inspire in the minds of all people for whose morals and Indian progress we have made ourselves responsible the admiration of cleanliness, decent living, industry, and humanity.

A Field for Enterprise. Apart from the beneficial effects which the cinema, as an educating medium, may have in the uplift of primitive Africans, the uplift of primitive Africans, the last is well worth the side of the problem on the hands of those who are now trying to raise the British cinema industry out of the Slough. I believe I am not saying that it is necessary to employ a force of 100,000,000 of inhabitants of our tropical African territories, there lies the possibility of a great and profitable field for enterprise.

Just as Indian film producers are now gradually replacing the silent imported films, so might we find the natives of tropical Africa flocking to theatres in which they could see people of their own race and colour performing plays which they could understand and appreciate.

Pictures showing the manners and customs of the people of their own kind in various parts of the Continent, their dances and tribal ceremonies, their games, their methods of hunting, etc., would be of absorbing interest to the inhabitants of all the various territories. Films that would be suitable for the education of the people of the Gambia, Sierra Leone, the Gold Coast, Nigeria, Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika, Nyasaland, and Zanzibar. The demand for such pictures would probably grow so rapidly that the cost of production would quickly be covered by the sale.

The natives of Africa are "born actors," and it ought not to be difficult to produce a comparatively small cost. African pictures of a harmless and highly entertaining nature. That very admirable and successful film "Palmer," which was made in Northern Nigeria about three years ago, proved that could be done with the cinema out of the most primitive Africans on the same lines, but on a much less ambitious scale, would probably supply an ever-increasing market for a special branch of the cinema industry, and I write this in the hope that our British producers may be induced to establish a branch, which may not only have far-reaching results, but may become a source of considerable profit.

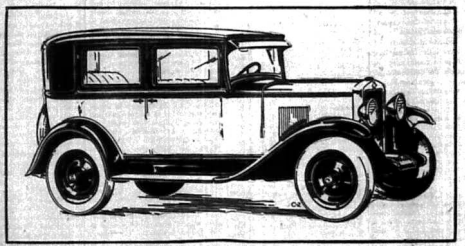

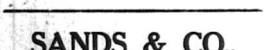
