RENEWED PRECAUTIONS.

THROUGHOUT INDIA.

Lahore, April 24. A message from Peshawar states that the rioting in the streets of four All-India Congress leaders—Khan, Asaf Uddin, Pura Khan and Khattak—has been immediately dealt with by the police. The military were called out and were compelled to fire the mob.

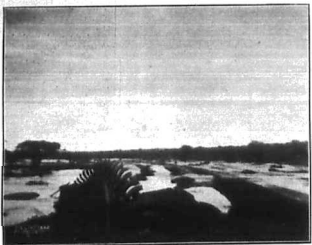

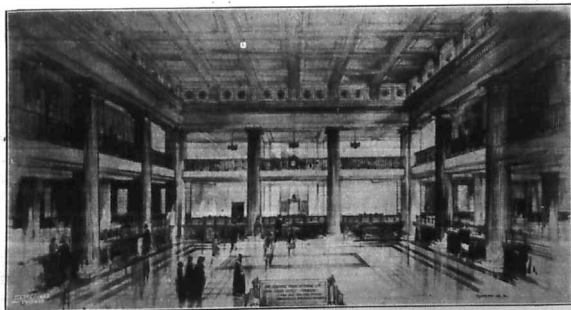

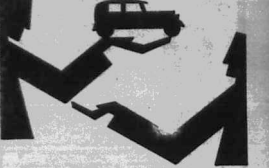
