WIDELESS IN PAST APRICA

NECESSARY TESTING AIDS.

Follow Instructions.

The wireless fan who takes an interest in his receiver will, of a necessity, require to make various tests at different times. For this he will require testing instru-ments and it is the purpose of this article to give a few hints as to the various instruments that would be useful.

One of the most useful instruments for any wireless enthusiast to have and in fact for a transmitting amateur it is a necessity and demanded by his licence, is a wavemeter. To give it its proper name a frequency meter is an instrument with a condenser and set of calibrated charts by which it is possible to find out exactly (a) the wavelength the receiver is set at, (b) the wavelength at which a transmitter is working.

A receiver can be calibrated, definite aerial, at a definite spot. under conditions of constant values of filment supply and H.T. All these are difficult to obtain n practice and furthermore average listener, has not-in fact very few listeners for that matter, have—the facilities,, knowledge or time to calibrate a receiver, especially as it is liable to varia-tion at a minute's notice. Whilst listening in on the receiver the condenser of the wavemeter is varied until the receiver stops oscillating. A few degrees further on the scale it will be found that the receiver goes into oscillation again.
