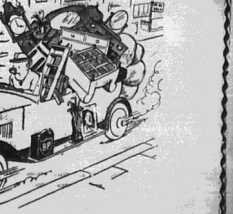

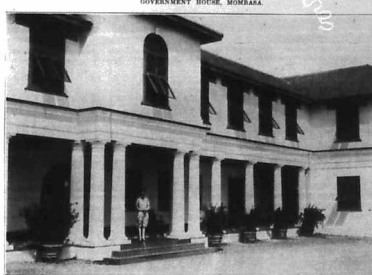

# FAREWELL DINNER TO DEPUTATION

## "KEEP THE HOME FIRES BURNING"

### Delegation's Request to People of Kenya.

#### THE ISSUES AT STAKE.

##### Lord Delamere Reviews Principles of Native Policy.

The Members of the Kenya Delegation were entertained at a public dinner held in Nairobi on Thursday evening when a very representative gathering were addressed by Sir James Wilson on some of the main issues facing Kenya at the present time.

**Discussing Native Policy**—the fourth of all the political difficulties—the Hon. Lord Delamere analysed the charges brought against the country regarding forced labour, emphasised that this was not to be maintained by Government and was to be employed for private purposes and finally declared that so far as the settlers were concerned they would welcome the abolition of compulsory labour tomorrow.

He also examined the position regarding taxation and land, pointing out that the facts proved conclusively the fallacy of the allegations of "wage slavery" and that the average settler could pay his annual tax by selling three or four chickens or a few dozen eggs.

**Speaking of Federation** he said: "I do not believe in banging doors but I sincerely believe that no man could count on arriving to advise or encourage—directly or indirectly—the risks of federation after reading the White Papers of 1950." It would be the duty of the Deputation not to take part in any discussions of federation at the present time.

To the Colony he said: "The Deputation's terms of reference to you are that you should keep the fires burning while we are away."

The Hon. T. G. O'Shea and Mr. MacLellan Wilson were also speakers. The former paid a great tribute to the help given by Nairobi business houses to the Fund and welcomed the return of the Capital to its old position in the leadership of the political life of the country.

"The country has placed its trust in the Deputation," he said. "It is completely necessary that we should be able to place our trust in the country to know that the country is to be trusted to do the right thing at the right time, trusting to their own political intelligence... trusted to keep its temper."
