### Indians in Highlands.

#### REQUEST FOR SUB-LEASES

In the course of recent discussions between the Government and a Deputation of Indian traders, reference was made to the position of Indians in the Highlands in connection with the proposed opening of the Highlands to European settlement. It is being sought for their rights.

The position is explained in the following resolution which was passed by a Committee of Representatives in connection with the recent Congress and by a similar resolution passed at the meeting of the Council of the Agricultural Society.

Owing to the numerous difficulties which are being experienced by the administrative officers in the way of Indian traders and industrialists, operating on business in the Highlands on private land owned by European farmers, the Government requests the Government to issue definite instructions to the various departments to regulate the rights of all traders and industrialists carrying on trade as respects the Highlands. Terms be recognized and the sense of injustice at present existing for such traders and industrialists owing to the policy of the Government be removed as far as the earliest possible opportunity.

### "Indians"

The explanation in the written form of the Government is to issue the fullest right to establish their claims to unimproved or improved land in the Highlands for agricultural and industrial purposes and while any Committee does not acquire in any manner the present arrangement of the existing ownership of land by Indians to commercial purposes.

It is the intention of the Government to bring to the notice of the Government the fact that the Government is unable to carry on trade and industrial operations in the Highlands with the permission of European farmers and approval of the Government, an elaborate order of some of its members owing to their inability to pay any kind of title in the form of land covered by them and also owing to the fact that the administrative officers cannot easily threaten such traders with cancellation of the trading license unless they being removed perpetually.

These traders cannot take any steps on the security of the land which they have obtained on which these buildings are erected. It is a general desire that with no any reasonable regulations which the Government might feel called upon to impose, the Government should be definite and the operation should be left to the discretion of the various individuals, who have been permitted to carry on trade in the Highlands otherwise, respectively closed to Indian settlement.

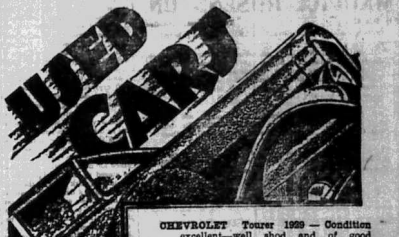

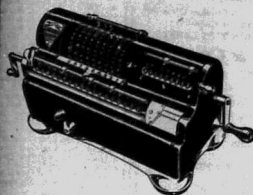

**AN ENQUIRY BY UGANDA

A dominating new factor in the situation is that the Native is no longer content to be educated by the missionary and he is asking for facilities outside missionary agency. 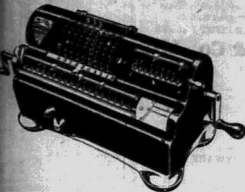
