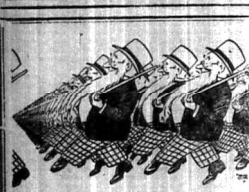

**ASSISTANCE FOR WHEAT GROWER.**  
 (Continued from page 7).

Any steps which could be taken to promote long term credit would undoubtedly have a stabilising effect, not only on this industry, but on the whole Colony as a whole, while immediate steps by the Government to encourage wheat policy represent financial credit could be of the greatest assistance in the present crisis. The Wheat Growers' Union has not recently met, and it is not our intention to propose detailed schemes for the alleviation of our present troubles until we have had further time to collect data, and to consult with the Milling Agents and the Wheat Advisory Board, but we consider that sufficient grounds already exist for establishing support for the industry necessitating immediate aid over the immediate crisis. It is towards this end that we have already been put forward by the Wheat Advisory Board for asking you for your full and unanimous support for these proposals. The industry is in urgent need of assistance, and we serve assistance for the following reasons:

(1) The wheat industry in a phenomenal short time has proved that wheat can be grown in this Colony at a cost which compares favourably with anywhere else in the Empire. (2) To the wheat industry which has united capital invested in land and implements has been a larger factor in supporting the general economy, and therefore this industry we feel that we are quite justified in appealing for assistance. (3) The wheat industry has provided and is providing its fair share towards the income of the Government. (4) The question of consumption of wheat and parallel also with wheat require a large sum towards the general economy. (5) Large sums have been spent in establishing the industry, and we have been definitely encouraged to persevere and plant wheat by the Government. (6) There is every reason to believe that the Kenya Colony has a future grain for East Africa, and the British Empire in East Africa should not have to depend on outside sources for its wheat. (7) The crisis which the industry is at present undergoing is no way reflective on the stability of the industry, but is caused by worldwide conditions. Capt. Farrar stated that there were about 600 families who in whole of their capital sink in it for an alternative crop, which because they had no capital or some was available. If therefore they had to shut down on wheat, and to continue to plant wheat a bag was an impossibility, these people would be thrown on somebody's hands. Moreover, it had to be remembered that the wheat industry circulated £50,000 a year as income commercial interests.

**Hard Fostering.**  
 Major Knappan said the promoters of the wheat industry had had a hard time in the early stages, and it would be great pity if at this point they were not supported by Government and the commercial community so that they could carry on successfully. In negotiating their position it would be necessary to ask for further protection. Many of the growers today were entirely dependent on one crop; therefore one of the suggestions was to have mixed farming, and before that could be done there must be a policy laid down by the Government of the country to assure them that if they did the goods the Government would organize the export of that particular product. The speaker asked the Chamber to support them in trying to establish mixed farming.

Cot. Griffiths spoke of the necessity of some assistance to the wheat growers. Mr. Hooper said they were asking Government to prohibit entirely the importation of wheat and wheat products; that was found impossible, that a prohibitive duty should be put on those products. It was a theoretical suggestion, able that the country should import wheat and flour to the extent of several thousand tons, whereby money went out of the country, and at the same time also export wheat at times, so that again money was going out of the country. Quoting from 1923 trade returns, the Chairman said the import of wheat from India was £135,000, valued at 22,100,000, and wheat flour 64,000 cwt. valued at 548,138, a total value of

out of the country of £812,244, a very small sum indeed.

**Production Difficulties.**  
 Replying to the Chairman on the matter of the low yield per acre, Capt. Farrar said that when he was in the country this year it was very poor, and conditions were not so good as they were about one bag to the acre. Some farms which started with 200 and the production increased to 400, some which started with an average of ten, last year averaged 12. But that increased to 200 and had to carry on the year the new land which was put under cultivation.

Cot. Griffiths explained that the wheat in the country was not too young to have bred and developed new varieties of wheat to replace the old as it was not in disease-resisting, and that wheat for 1923-24 was not so well exhibited, in 1922 there were 20,000,000 bushels, 22,000,000 in 1923 was just 2½ bags an acre; in 1920 it averaged 100 bushels for the whole country. Replying to Major Millon, he said that last year 12,000 bushels of wheat were milled in the Colony, and that the millers had not imported. The internal consumption was much higher than the quantity of wheat available.

**Quality of Flour.**  
 Mr. R. D. Hamilton asked if it were not a fact that the importation of flour from India might be less if the quality were improved? To this Mr. Hooper replied that the managing director of a Nairobi firm had assured the elected members that the quality of flour imported from India was better than that of the flour imported from the States. The speaker was a member of the Chamber, and they were doing their utmost to improve the quality of flour. Cot. Griffiths said there had been a reduction in the price of flour during last year, and at the first time this year there was a 25 per cent reduction.

**Price Comparisons.**  
 If there was imported very high prices in almost every flour, and Mr. J. G. Aronson, who was in a minority, if the local flour was so good for people to buy imported flour at a very much higher price? Cot. Griffiths replied that the difference in price in Nairobi was about 50 per cent, in Mombasa it was a much smaller, and frequently the local flour was sold at the same price as the imported flour. Answering another question, he said that the importation into Uganda last year was £100,000, and that the price was rapidly going down.

**The Alternatives.**  
 After the deposition had been drawn, the matter was debated by the Chamber. It was stated that the two alternatives, either the prohibition or prohibitive duty, but that both were bound up with the Customs Union and agreement with the Empire services.

**LORD PASSFIELD'S PROMISE.**

**Social Contact Between Officials and Settlers Criticized.**

Mr. C. Mitchell, Secretary for Native Affairs, Tanganyika, has advised critically the present law in force in the Territory. He maintains that it vests the whole of the land in the Government and in the minds of the natives, takes away what they regard as their real ownership rights while converting land tenure into a form of tenancy held from the Government.

He said that the tenancy the Tanganyika native live under is that of Kenya. It is more for the benefit of the white farmer. They considered the Kenya native as a class of tenants who were to be treated as such, and that the Kenya native had been fairly treated under the law and that such things as the Ropini system and restriction of coffee growing might have been done in Kenya.

Mitchell expressed his criticism of the Tanganyika law by producing a number of cuttings, one dated in London and another in 1929.

He stated that Administrative Officers found it very difficult to keep up their ideal view against the wishes of further public opinion of those with whom they associated.

Documents placed before the Commission in detail published to-day on page 9 of a scheme for the division of Tanganyika into three areas (1) The native area, (2) a block of densely populated districts, (3) the native area, and (4) the mixed area in which there is no settlement.

Lord Passfield closely examined the witness on the scheme and maintained that as long as separate legislatures could be enacted for the Native Areas (as in the case of Scotland and Wales) there could be a constitutional change; it would be done by arrangement. The Secretary of State stated that the question could certainly be considered by the proper people.

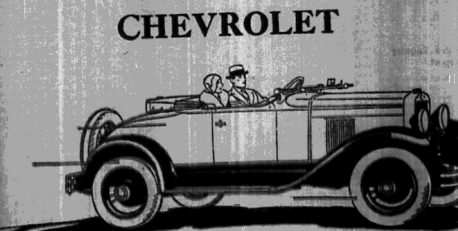
