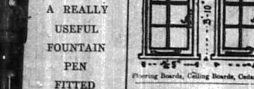

YEAR'S MORATORIUM FOR WAR DEBT PAYMENTS.

Senators Finance Committee, has been returned to Washington.

Assistance for Germany.
(By W. L. RAY, JR.)
More interest is being taken in the announcement issued at Washington, by President Hoover, stating that he will return from the Middle West on the previous day he had conferred with various leaders of both political parties, "with respect to certain steps which might take to assist in economic recovery with loan and abroad."

It is added, that the conversation, have been largely devoted towards the strengthening of the situation in Germany, and that while no definite plan or conditions have been arrived at, the response he has made will, from the leaders of both parties is soon grasping.

While the British newspapers recognize the advisability of continuing and continue in "keeping their eyes on the dollar," in this announcement, they regard it as of interest and importance as the first step taken by America towards consideration of a policy which might in certain circumstances involve a re-examination of her attitude towards allied debts and reparations.

Mr. Mellon's Visit.
The announcement is couched by the paper with the conversations which Mr. Mellon, the Secretary of the United States Treasury, has had in London during the last few days with Prime Minister Lloyd George, Foreign Secretary, and Mr. Montagu Norman, the Governor of the Bank of England. It is generally assumed that these conversations consisted of a frank exchange of views on the present economic and financial factors underlying the central European crisis and that Mr. Mellon has left Washington fully informed regarding developments in the situation and the conclusions he has drawn therefrom.

Mr. Mellon's arrival in England is generally regarded as a distinctly important step, but the British official statement reproduced in yesterday's message made it distinctly clear that no invitation to discuss war debts, or indeed, any subject, was made to him by the British Government, nor had any conference

sion to such an effect been held by the British Government to the Washington Administration.

Meanwhile the prompt and timely action of the Bank of England in going to the rescue in this financial situation, in London, is being gratefully acknowledged. Here too, the American Administration—has rendered appropriate recognition of the debtors and creditors—British Official War Service.

Proposed Moratorium.

(Through Reuters Agency.)
Washington, June 21. The year is being mentioned as the possible period during which war debt and separation payments might be suspended.

President Hoover outlined the conversation with political leaders today and also gave the British Ambassador, and he believed that he is continuing the conversation over the week-end, being his next trip to the country.

It is understood that President Hoover has received general approval of his proposal to introduce a moratorium from members of the Congress with whom he talked privately or by telephone. The fact that Mr. Mellon's speech should stand, it is thought, is a factor for Mr. Hoover's economic policy with the foreign governments.

America's Offer.
Washington, June 21. President Hoover has announced his offer to the world of a one year's suspension of government debt.

The Conditions.

Washington, later.
It is officially stated that "without consultation by Congress, the American Government will postpone all payments on debts of foreign Governments to the July 1st, conditional upon the repayment of one year of all payments of inter-Governmental debts, owing to importing creditor powers."

President Hoover is making this announcement as the first step in the proposition, is to give time to permit debtor Governments to receive their national property. I am suggesting to the American people that they would be wise creditors in their own interests, and good neighbors. The postponement includes all Governmental debt.

The Cancellation of Debt.
President Hoover said the purpose of the action was to give the American people the opportunity of the world and to help recovery of the world and to help from the recuperating forces in the new nations in the United States. But as it has no effect on the debtors it was the specially under normal conditions of the debtor to pay. Effect on Disarmament.

President Hoover said: "While this action has no bearing on the conference for the limitation of armaments being held in Geneva, because by the terms of the agreement, no final agreement should be made until the end of one year's suspension of the government's debt, it is possible that this will be of great value to the world of disarmament."

ROAD COMPETITION WITH RAILWAY

Protective Measure Before Council

TO BE FURTHER AMENDED.

Limited to Traffic Between Definite Points.

The Bill to control motor traffic competition against the railway has passed its second reading in the Legislative Council after a lengthy debate.

The Attorney General announced that it had originally been intended to control and regulate all carriage of goods by motor, but Government since the introduction of the measure had come to the conclusion that the proper purpose would be to confine the measure and had decided to limit the scope of the Bill definitely to traffic which competed with the railway. This traffic would be subject to special licence fees and regulation.

He added that the Bill would be referred to a Select Committee, when amendments on the lines indicated would be made.

The Elected Members generally expressed their approval of the principle of the measure, although certain details were criticised.

Hon. T. J. O'Shea (who at that stage left the Chamber) protested very strongly against the methods adopted by Government in putting forward the amendments.

Referred to Select Committee.

After a lengthy debate, an address of opinion between an Elected member and His Excellency the Governor, the Bill to control motor traffic against the railway was, as the result of a motion by Mr. O'Shea, referred to a Select Committee.

The Bill—intended to provide for the regulation and control of the carriage for reward of goods by motor vehicles over roads or paths outside the limits of the Colony—was brought up for second reading in the Legislative Council by the Attorney General.

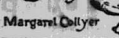

A Reply to the Address.

The Elected Members of the Kenya Legislative Council have been hoping that, as opportunity would be presented during the past fortnight to furnish a reply to the House to the important announcements contained in the opening Address delivered to Council by the Governor, they would have the opportunity of presenting several alternative motions, and thus, by the public representation of the Government, to express their views on the Government's proposals. To our regret, however, some time must now pass before a full answer can be given by the public representative to the policy laid down in the Address as the views of the Government on the subject of the institution of a public inquiry into the activities of the Kenya Legislative Council have been taken into consideration. 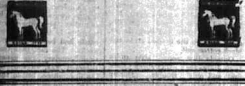
