Plends Not Guilty to Charges at Old Bailey.

R.M.S.P. COMPANY AFFAIRS.

Alleged Falsification of Balance Sheets.

The trial of Lord Kylesant and Mr. H. G. Morland, Chairman and Auditor respectively of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company, opened at the Old Bailey on Monday.

The case for the Crown was conducted by the Attorney-General, Sir William J. Williams, opening address to the Court outlining the nature of the charges, spoke for nearly five hours.

The opening of the charges was that during 1927 and 1928 the balance sheets were falsified representing the R.M.S.P. groups had made large trading profits whereas the group had actually suffered serious losses. The two accused were alleged to be responsible for the issue of these false statements.

It was also alleged that in 1928 Lord Kylesant had prepared a draft prospectus, which was subsequently issued as a prospectus of debentures. This prospectus was stated by the Crown to be a false and misleading one and misled members of the public to trust their money in debenture stock of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company.

CO-OPERATION IN THE COFFEE INDUSTRY.

Attitude of the London Merchant Houses.

C.P.U. SCHEME CRITICISED.

Intricacies of the Marketing of the Colony's Crop.

A special public meeting of Coffee Planters will be held in the Memorial Hall at 10-30 o'clock this morning to consider the scheme for the establishment of a Coffee Co-operative Society recently circulated by the Coffee Planters Union.

The Kenya representatives of several London firms who market the coffee crop have sent a statement on the scheme to the "Standard" for publication.

They examine the proposals to bulk lower grade coffees, set out the intricacies of the processing and its marketing and doubt whether there would be a sufficiently large quantity of such grades to warrant the necessary expenditure as a business proposition.

Unless bulking was done with knowledge and care, the stocks might find itself landed with unsuitable stocks and faced with heavy claims.

It is argued that if the sale of coffee for foreign demand was removed from the London market and centred in Nairobi, the effect would be to largely diminish the competition in London between the home and foreign trade which to-day keeps up the prices.

In regard to finance, it is explained that the business acquired by London merchant houses has been built up over a period of years requiring careful supervision and touch.

"It naturally follows, therefore, that the London merchants must reasonably consider how their interests might be affected by assimilating their business with a society which, however, well intentioned, might not be sufficiently experienced to render the similar service provided under their present arrangements."

The proposed changes are also criticised.

Finally it is pointed out that the writers are far from desirous of criticising adversely any efforts towards the establishment of a co-operative society.

Financial Problems.

The "East African Standard" has received a request for publication of the following statement by local representatives of the second London firm in the "Coffee Trade" in connection with the Co-operative Society's scheme which will be discussed in our article to-day. Further criticisms of the scheme are being received in the correspondence pages of the Standard and the following is a summary of the statement by the representatives of the London houses concerned. With reference to the scheme as recommended by the Executive of the Kenya Coffee Co-operative Society, we feel that the following points are worthy of consideration:
