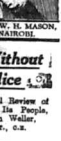

Mr. Dohbe said that one of the native women had said that on his farm a native would get 20/- a month and an other 10/- and said if a man had to put down on his card a "minimum wage" Mr. Dohbe thought that it would be a natural thing for an employer to give a boy a rise on his previous wage. If the wages were left out of the certificate a boy would get some fantastic wage and there would be no means of checking it.
