# RAISING THE STATUS OF NATIVE WOMEN

## No Longer to be Regarded as a Chattel

### DEPARTURE FROM PAGAN CUSTOM.

#### Bill Introduced into Legislative Council.

Government proposes to make an important alteration in the law of native women. Under a Bill which has been introduced into the Legislative Council, and which has been referred to a Select Committee, native women, if the measure is passed into law, will cease to be a chattel for the whole of her life, but will be regarded as having her majority in law, and the custody of her children.

The reason for the measure was that in the case of Christian marriages, it was only right that the wife should be maintained, and the Christian influence should be maintained. Under the present law, if a Christian native woman became a widow, the child-pang, and would live for the rest of her life, in many cases she would be left without any support.
