TERRIBLE FLIGHT DISASTER IN NATAL.

Lt.-Commander Glen Kidston and Captain T. A. Gladstone Killed.

PLANE CRASHES DURING GALE.

Passing of Pioneer of East African Air Mails.

THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCY.

Cape Town, May 5. It is reported from Van Reenen in Natal that an aeroplane in which Lieut .-Commander Glen Kidston and Captain T. A. Gladstone (the ploneer of the East African Air Mail Service) were flying, has crashed and both were killed.

The reports of Lieutenant-Commander Glen Kidston's death were received from a store keeper at Mauba, 16 miles from Van Reenen, who told the Magistrate at Van Reenen that he had seen a plane crash near his station.

He rushed to the spot and found the two occupants of the plane killed. He and a visiting card on one body, marked "Lieutenant-Commander Glen Kidston." A gale was blowing and raising clouds of dust rendering visibility bad in the

mountainous country where the plane crashed. The bodies were left in charge of a European pending the arrival of the District Surgeon and Magistrate.

Arrangements for his next venture were practically completed, namely a long hop flight from Nairobl to London in two days, stopping at Cairo and Rome.

A RECORD NILE PERCH.

Fish Weighing Nearly 2 Cwts.

(From Dr. E. B. Worthington, Leader of the Cambridge Ex-pedition).

The Cambridge Expedition to the East African Lakes has now returned to its camp on the shores of Lake Rudolf for some

A remarkable fact brought to A remarkable fact brought to light is the very large size of the Lake Rudolf variety of the Nile Perch. In the course of a week's work four fish of over 100 pounds have been caught and examined, one of which weighed 214 pounds. This perhaps is a record fresh water fish for East record fresh water fish for East African waters in that it beats the 200j pound Nile Perch caught a few years age at Butisba. The Rodelf fish was, however, caught on a night-line, not on a rod, and curiously enough took an unhalted book, In Lake Rudolf there is a big In Lake Rudolf there is a big variety of fishes not found else-where in Kenya. Amongst other is a fish similar in appearance to the well-known "Ngege" of Lake Victoria and to the Tilapia which Mr. Dent introduced into

Lake Naivasha, but which grows to a size of 15 or 20 pounds instend of one or two pounds, and affords most excellent eating. Bass in Lake Naivasha.
