So far as Kenya is concerned the increases in the duties on wines and spirits are negligible because Government at the same time repealed the Consumption Tax and embodied

On the other hand there is considerable increase in the taxation to be borne by the motor industry and private owner. For example the Customs taxation on tyres and tubes is doubled.

At the same time the East African Governments have decided to raise postal charges on local and Imperial mail matter from July 1 next to the point at which they stood in April last year. That is to say, the letter rate will return to twenty cents instead of

It is estimated that the Customs changes will yield £18,000 in a full year and the Postal
