The Wheat Industry in Kenya.

FACTORS WHICH HAVE LED TO THE PRESENT SLUMP.

Damage by Locusts.

A PROBLEM FOR EARLY ATTENTION BY BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

The wheat industry of Kenya is passing through a most critical period, due to several factors, principally locusts and the world depression.

The crop has declined so much an extent that not only is there no surplus for exports, which recently had to be imported to meet local requirements.

In the following article an attempt has been made to review the industry from the time of the beginning some 25 years ago, to indicate its possibilities and some of the difficulties facing wheat growers in Kenya.

The Local Market.

It is now about 25 years since wheat was first introduced into Kenya, and the promise of a profitable industry has been realized. A comparison of the value of the wheat crop in Kenya in 1910, with the value of the wheat crop in Kenya in 1923, shows a decrease of 100 per cent. Fight Against Rinderpest in Uganda.

THE CHIEF PROBLEM FACING THE VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

Work During Past Year.

SUSCEPTIBLE GAME RESPONSIBLE FOR SPREAD OF DISEASE.

The most serious disease which the Veterinary Department of Uganda was faced last year was that of rinderpest. In certain districts the disease was complicated by the presence of susceptible game, among which cattle was heavy and was a real menace to infection.

In the areas concerned, cattle were inoculated as quickly as possible and at the end of the year the disease was well under control.

During the course of a report on the work of the department during 1931 it is stated that rinderpest was a disease of mixed origin, particularly in regard to human cases, caused by the fact that natives failed to bury or burn cattle suspected of dying from the disease.

Valuable work was carried out during the year in the reclamation of foci in Byoga. As a result of measures adopted cattle have to be kept in considerable areas of fertile country for grazing.
