GERMANY DEFAULTS TO THE UNITED STATES.

Britain Meets All Her
Obligations.

FRANCE EXPECTED TO POSTPONE CAPITAL REPAYMENT.

British national financial stability is indicated by the prompt repayment to France of the credits obtained during the crisis of 1951. The whole of the obligations to France and the United States due as a result of the national emergency last year have now been met.

On the other hand Germany has formally notified America of her inability to meet the payments, due on August 31, on account of war reparations.

In regard to the French debt to the United States, an statement is due on September 15, but it is expected that only the interest will be paid, and that payment of reduction of capital will be postponed.

The loans by the United States Treasury of five year notes at 2 1/2 per cent, and "Certificates of Indebtedness" maturing in September 1953, has been six times over-subscribed. This loan was floated in order to meet maturing obligations of public debts and interest to provide funds for the Reconstruction Corporation.

American Loan Success.

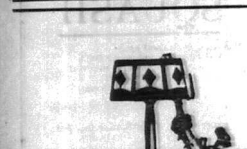

GANDHI TO "FAST UNTO DEATH."

Protest Against the Franchise Settlement.

OPPOSED TO PROVISION FOR DEPRESSED CLASSES.

Ultimatum to Government.

TO REFUSE OF ALL FOOD UNLESS POLICY ALTERED.

As a protest against the Government's decision in regard to communal representation on Indian Legislative, which provides for special electorates for the Depressed Classes, Gandhi has announced his intention to "fast unto death."

During the course of correspondence which has been maintained between Gandhi and the Premier and Sir Samuel Hurley, Gandhi stated that he would resist the Government's policy with his life, but that his life would cease if Government rejected the decision.

Gandhi explained at length his reasons for his opposition to the grant of separate electorates for the Depressed Classes. He stated that this special provision would be harmful both to the Depressed Classes themselves and to the Hindu community as a whole.

The Premier in his reply regrets Gandhi's decision and maintains that Gandhi's decision is the position which provided that the Depressed Classes should vote in the general Hindu constituency, but should also have separate electorates.

Mr. Marsdonald added that Gandhi's opinion was known and appreciated, but Government reconsidered that it was its duty to safeguard the rights of the Depressed Classes to a fair proportion of representation.

Letter to the Premier.

My dear Sir, I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th inst. regarding the proposed franchise settlement for the Depressed Classes. 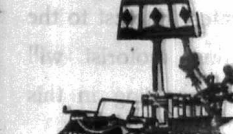

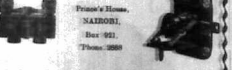

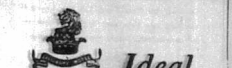

The Bowring Committee on Income Tax.

FINDINGS PRESENTED IN 1922.

Why Measure Was Withdrawn.

"IMBUTRABLY HAMPERING DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION."

The findings of the Bowring Committee, which sat in 1922, are considered amongst other things the question of income tax, one of the points which at the present time in view of the Government's intention to impose a similar tax in Kenya next year.

The Committee strongly recommended the repeal of the measure and were once again in favour of a stamping duty of the Colony rendered it immediately non-operative as a tax "which would be an impediment to expansion and development."

As a result of the recommendations of this Committee the income tax legislation was repealed.

Restriction on Capital.

In view of the introduction of the Government of Kenya Bill, the income tax for next year, the Revenue Department has been directed to submit to the Government a bill to restrict the withdrawal of funds from the Colony to the amount of the net income tax for the year. The bill also contains provisions which are of a financial nature. The bill was introduced in the House of Representatives on the 11th of the month of March 1922. 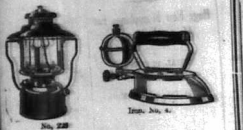

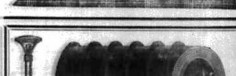

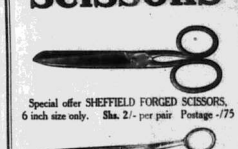
