

The possibility of large areas in North Kariroo being granted as mining concessions under sole gold prospecting licences was the subject of a meeting by the Nairobi Association at its meeting on Friday when it was decided that a petition be drawn up for presentation to Government protesting against such grants.

It was submitted by speakers that the granting of sole prospecting licences over large areas to big companies would retard the development of the goldfields and of the country generally.

It was also agreed to while under the Mining Ordinance, His Excellency had power in the granting of prospecting licences, this decision was to be carried very largely under the control of the Secretary of State.
