In the opinion of the great majority of those who take an interest in the political situation, the fact that the German people have elected Herr Papen Government's supporters on July 21, but not in their stead, was an extraordinary feat.

The total poll amounted to 79 per cent. as compared with 66 per cent. on July 21, giving 222 members of the Reichstag as compared with 187. All the leaders have automatically been re-elected on the party line.

Although absolutely no account is taken of the opinion of Herr Hitler's loss of over 2,000,000 supporters and 75 seats since July 21, the fact that the vote of the Nationalists has fallen from 27 to 18 below 50. The German Nationalist Party, which supported Herr Papen, increased their vote by 70,000 votes, 30,000 respectively. The Conservatives gained 700,000 votes, chiefly, as the supporters of the Socialists, whose total declined by a similar number. The Centre loss of 200,000 was chiefly due to abstentions.

**Voting in Prussia.**

It is noteworthy that the vote in East or Greater Prussia was only slightly less in Berlin province. The total vote in Berlin province in East Prussia, Hohenzollern, and Silesia, was 114,000 votes, 57,000 votes, while in Westphalia, where the Socialists were in power, the Centre and Communists took 28 per cent. of the Nationalist and Peoples Party gaining heavily.

**Political Bill Cleared.**

The result does not constitute the slightest to alter the political situation. It is not worth saying it is possible for any grouping of parties to take account of their vote in this Government. If it were not that one agent, this side of the country depends upon their election on Hindenburg. Parliaments are already asking his intervention for as the new Papen Government is concerned it does not intend to do anything, but will prevent the Reichstag meeting. The German people are still decidedly against Herr von Papen, and still desire to restore after the result was known. Their will must be restored. The Nationalists have maintained their position as

M.P. RETURNS TO LONDON.

A Good Friend of the Settlers.

[Mr. Erasmus's "continuance."] London, Oct. 25. (By A. Mail.)

To Mr. Patrick Duggan, the former N.Y., who has just returned to London from a brief visit to East Africa, it seems that the Settlers have a good friend. Although Mr. Duggan admits that he has not had time to do anything more than consider the four demands of the question, he is in favour of the opinion that in East Africa the white Settlers have been mistreated, rather harshly. He is a native born settler. Apparently, most of Mr. Duggan's time was spent in Uganda, where he was arrested at the outbreak between the British and the immense number of Socialists which resulted in the outbreak of the natives. It is probable that he will continue to take an active interest in East African matters.

Incidentally, Mr. Duggan is one of the youngest Members of the present House of Commons and the father was in the Diplomatic Service. His family has many associations with England as well as Great Britain.
