The Amery Reply.

Further Note Requested.

When the notes of the American reply to the British note has been received, it is expected that the little time will be lost in forwarding a further communication to America. In subsequent articles the possibility of separate trade

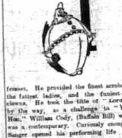

# Mystery Bank Registered in Kenya

## Operates to Commence in South Africa.

Capital of £10,000,000.

STARTLING DISCLOSURES BY JOHANNESBURG PAPER.

The Johannesburg "Sunday Times" has published an article giving the history of the Premier Commercial Bank, Ltd., incorporated in South Africa in 1925, with an authorized capital of £10,000,000, and which, after years of unusual success, has just come into new hands and at last commenced operation—"in South Africa."

The memorandum and articles of association were signed by a number of Johannesburg financiers, but none of the original directors are now connected with the board, an entirely new directorate having taken over on October 17 last.

As a result of investigations made by the Johannesburg "Sunday Times," it was stated that the reason why the company was registered in Kenya was that taxation and registration fees were much lower in Kenya than in South Africa and that the bank would come under the British Empire bank laws.
