Chief Justice of Zanzibar Knighted.

London, January 1. (THROUGH BRITISH AGENCY.) One peer has been proclaimed and two new peerages have been conferred on recipients, according to the New Year Honours list issued for publication to-day.

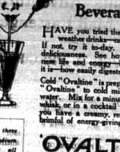

**Production at the Coast.**

For many years it has been well-founded complaint directed against the Government of Kenya that the development of the Coast Province (20,000 square miles), has suffered from neglect. It is certainly undeniable that the Coast does not make the contribution to prosperity which is known from other provinces. The assertion is true of every Native Reserve in the Colony. The subject of the Coast cannot be treated by itself on the part of the two Legislative Councils of Kenya. It is in the hands of the Legislative Council in stating their case both to the Government and to the public without repeated explanation demanded by them on the claims of the Coast. There is no reason to doubt that the improvement which has been effected in the Coast since the concentration on agriculture, with the result that the wealth from the land has attained in the acquisition of the economic and financial position will meet in some extent the claims of the Government to carry out its programme for the Coast during the year an intensified campaign of Native production will apply as fully to that district as to any of the other provinces and we have the assurance of His Excellency the Governor that the representative Board of Agriculture will give special attention to it. 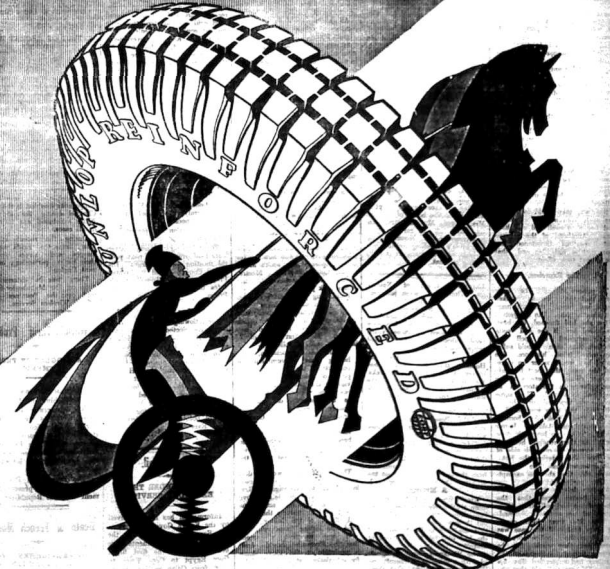
