FEARED LOSS OF A BRITISH SUBMARINE.

FAILED TO RISE AFTER DIVING NEAR SOUTH COAST.

Seven Officers and 54 Men on Board.

FEVERISH RESCUE ATTEMPTS BY AID OF SEARCHLIGHTS.

The loss of a British submarine with seven officers and 54 men is feared.

The first suggestion of tragedy was when the wireless operator on board reported ship had failed to rise in response from the submarine which had dived some three miles from the coast.

Attempts at rescue are proceeding feverishly. The submarine was so equipped as to be able to remain under water for 48 hours in an emergency.

A Dramatic Summons.

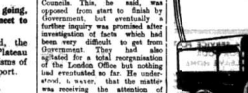

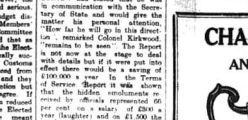

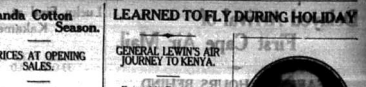
