The truce on the outskirts of Shanghai has ended with a terrific Japanese serial bombardment of Chapei. Efforts had previously been made by the Chinese mer-chants to obtain an extension of the truce in order to evacuate the women and children.

After the bombs had been dropped by the aeroplanes, an attack was launched on Chapei and Wooung by Japanese troops under cover of a smoke screen. A battle of unprecedented ferecity is reported to have followed, the attackers being driven back by intense machine-gan fire. Reports as to Japanese casualties are conflicting.

A French priest and a British colonel led a party of 13 French nuns.and one English girl into Chapei in an attempt to help the women and children who were atill chinging to their homes.


