tion Act" of 1890, repealed the ordinance to a certain and limited extent.

Where other provisions made by ordinance may be in force or procedure established by or under the said repealed orders and all acts of Legislatures in India now in force in East Africa, shall remain in force until such other provision is made.

We take it to mean that the Indian Codes apply in all instances where there are not special ordinances to cover them.

The 1902 ordinance chiefly refers to the Administration of the Protectorate. The application of law is differing from the application of law; the Court of Record, the powers of Removal and Deportation, substitution in the matter of the Maritime Shipping Act, and the repealing of other ordinances.

It is definitely stated that so far as circumstances admit the Civil and Criminal Procedure and Penal Codes of India shall be in force. The amount of argument (which has been introduced) in the words "as far as circumstances admit" in the past is probably responsible for the vulgar idea that English Common law can be applied in position to the Codes quoted, whenever it suits a litigant.

By circumstances admit we read (and it is to be corrected) that this refers solely to moral or racial differences between Europeans and Asiatics and their customs, manners, and moral traditions. We are not prepared to consider for one moment that those works infer that the procedure under the Indian Codes can be enlarged upon and, were this once admitted, then all our Indian Codes could be revoked at will by English law provided the latter were the fuller.

We may lay it down for granted that the Indian Codes, which framed its laws and procedure did not do so without very considerable thought and provision for all and every possible contingency which might arise in that country, and which, so far as we like to be governed by law, framed particularly to meet such legislation as we are now bound by. The changing of these laws will be in the near future, and the hands of East Africans, when changing them, we must remember that the application of English common law, as it stands, would be most unwise under circumstances of this country. It has been suggested to us that we retain our present code, amplified by the application of the Indian Statute, and also the English common law, leaving it for civil litigation to be decided by mutual consent by which law they shall abide. It is one of the things that is left to the courts of law to decide, and to have the right to select under what code he shall be tried. The question is, is it possible to be satisfied with the present code, and to be open to us, to clear up, once and for all, the chaotic state at present existing, is to frame our own laws as soon as possible.

"I am of the opinion that where matter it must be held that any with that matter and larger English Statute cannot be brought in. Thus Judge Buchanan's pronouncement has acted somewhat as a deterrent on the bursting of a bombshell among our legal and commercial community. It has given an extension to our law which cannot be considered as entirely authoritative yet at present it stands as the pronouncement of the High Court of East Africa, and remains so until upset by another authority.

UGANDA. DESPERATE EFFORTS TO STAMP OUT SLEEPING SICKNESS.

The Government of Uganda is making vigorous and radical measures being taken. It has been conclusively proved that the malarial fever, which is the cause of Sleeping Sickness, is being transmitted by persons suffering from the disease. The malarial fever is being removed from the district, and is being replaced by a specially organized (camp) system of malarial fever, which is being treated by medical care and is treated with Atoxyl.

Although the disease appears to be on the decrease the mortality is still appalling and the number of persons who die from the disease is still large. It is proposed to create ten Sleeping Sickness Settlements in the Kingdom of Uganda and it is expected that this will reduce the mortality to one in ten. It is expected that each one, for at least 1000, made up with their families, only those who are destitute will be maintained at the cost of the Government but the cost under this head will, in any case, be considerable. It is estimated that an expenditure of nearly £200,000 spread over 3 years, will be required in this connection.

The Cult of the Negligee.

The negligee is one of the items of a woman's wardrobe which is more appreciated in the hot months of the year than in any other. When visiting in country houses at leisure in preparation for the quiet hours which so many people like to watch, before dinner after the strain of fulfilling social obligations during the day, and with the still more pronounced comfort of the evening in prospect, it is an immense relief to slip into a light negligee. Some of these loungers or hoodies grown out of the most elaborate description and boast as much dainty intricacy and "fineness" as that which is put into baby garments. The first laws, or with modern employment, the latest modes being carried out somewhat in the delicate shape with full effect round the shoulders, the whole gown being composed of alternate bands of lawn and insertion. It is worn with a long tulle-trimmed bodice, supplemented with a wide sash caught in front with a jewelled buckle.

The negligee shape has been by no means ruled out of court, and a luxurious example was carried out in this style in the palest shade of pink silk, embroidered round the decolletage and at the hem in the most novel manner with realistic silk, the faint oyster-pink tint of the gown itself proving most effective with the brilliant embroidery.

Some of the negligees are made in the form of little sea-coats entirely composed of alternate bands of ribbon and lace arranged on the gown, as there are many with long tulle-trimmed skirts of muslin and lace. Most people, however, prefer the current made in one piece, the reason of a negligee being that it may be slipped on without any trouble, and that it should be loose-fitting. Flirt effects are much to the fore, the modified Princess style being adapted in some cases, while the waist is decorated with mouth-of-lace (tulle) and quilt lined with the softest description, entirely covered with this lace, are among the novelties of the moment, the flitting character, with embroidered hood-like bands of lawn or muslin.

Quite the most important fashion in the realm of negligees is represented by the baroque gown, which, in some instances is carried out in the greenish style, a distinct contrast being chosen for the lining, such as a tone of salmon-pink, blue, or a double of soft primrose silk. Another example, which was copied from a Venetian design, was fashioned of myrtle green silk satin, lined with old gold silk, and bordered with a rich gold embroidery.

Banana Jelly.

Soak one packet gelatine, when thoroughly soaked pour upon it one quart of boiling water, or even in tonic, clear with a little dissolved citric acid or essence of vanilla, and color if liked with cochineal. When partly set, place in it half dozen bananas, peeled and sliced lengthwise.

Prune Jelly.

One pound prunes, one pint water, 1 lemon, half pint sugar, two sheets gelatine, sugar to taste. Soak the prunes until very soft, then rub through a sieve, drain, the remaining, and use seeds for flavoring. Dissolve the gelatine in a little water, and add the clear juice of the prunes, and sugar. Mix all together in the stew-pan, but do not let it boil; now put in the jelly and mix well, place in a mould, and serve the following day, with sliced cream or custard.

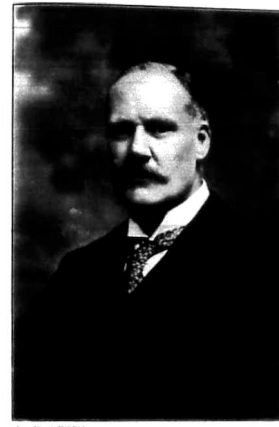

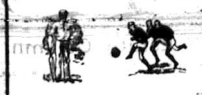
