

"Stampede" Observations.

LONGER DISTURBANCE CAUSED BY MACHINES FLYING HIGH

Interested in the allegations made recently in sections of the British Press and by the Chairman of the Society for the Preservation of the Fauna of the Empire, that airmen in East Africa were "swooping in aeroplanes from the clouds" and stampeding herds of game, Wing Commander Harris commanding the Royal Air Force machines now in East Africa, carried out a series of observations.

Having tested the effect of aircraft on game at varying heights, he has come to the conclusion that the stampede produced when flying comparatively high lasts far longer than the stampede caused by flying

Wing Commander Harris saw nothing abnormal in the behaviour of game and failed to see animals injured or mothers desert their young. It is his belief that in a short time game will become as accustomed to aircraft on the main routes as they now are to the presence of railway trains.

The huge bridge over Sydney Harbour which has taken huge bridge over Sydney Harbour which has taken seven years to construct at a cost of £9,000,000, was opened on Friday in the presence of hundreds of thousands of people. The official ceremony was per-formed by Mr. Lang, the Socialist Premier of New South Wales, at one end of the bridge and by the Mayor of North Sydney at the other end.

There was, however, a dramatic and unrehearsed incident. As Mr. Lang approached to cut the ribbon, a mounted police officer dashed forward and severed the ribbon with his sword, shouting, "I declare the bridge open in the name of the people of New South Wales."

This act was part of a premeditated demonstration against Mr. Lang, organised by an anti-Communist organisa-tion known as the "New Guard." Its policy is to oppose Socialism in Australia.


