The details of the most gigantic financial operation in history were announced by Mr. Neville Chamberlain, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, in the House of Com-mons last week. This is the conversion of the great five per cent. War Loan of which over £2,000,000,000 is outstanding.

From the end of this year the loan will bear interest at 34 per cent. but holders preferring repayment may receive cash at par.

It is anticipated that this transaction will save the Exchequer £32,000,000 annually.




