LORD MOYNE'S REPORT.

Accepted Generally as a Fair Presentation of Facts.

When Lord Moyne's Report was referred to in the House of Commons during a debate in Committee on the Colonial Office Voic, there was general agreement that it presented the facts fairly and comprehensively.

The Income Tax proposal was regarded as reasonable and the opinion was freely expressed by supporters of the Government that the sion-native inhabitants of Kenya should be prepared to make some further contribution of a direct character to the cost of the general adminis-tration of the Colony.

The debate was remarkable for the spirit of animosity and prejudice displayed by Labour Members who suggested that the natives in Kenzya were not being dealt with fairly; that forced labour still existed; and that the Land Commission is so constituted that its findings are not likely to be impartial.

The Secretary of State in the course of his reply refuted the saligations of unfairness, recalled the irributes paid repeatedly by Commissions to the good relations between the natives and the European population and expressed surprise at the lack of knowledge of the facts displayed by some Labour Members who had been associated in the past with the Colonial Office.


