The Irish Free State Government's plan to stop the importation of British coal by means of tariffs has failed. The coal merchats state that it is cheaper in the long run to pay the extra duty, rather than buy poorer quality from the Continent.

This has prompted Mr. de Valera to warn the merchants that unless they buy from the Continent, he will apply a prohibitive tariff on British coal. The gas com-panies have warned the Government that they will have to increase their prices unless British coal is.

The tariffs are being successful in other directions, how-ever, as two British chocolate firms are building tactories in Dublin in order to avoid the duties.
