# THE PUBLIC PAYS THE PIPER.

## And Will Insist on Calling the Tune.

"The 'Esk' Atlantic Steamers' campaign today is a serious campaign. The campaign is directed against the payment of further taxation in any form until the scheme is completely abandoned and all present cessants Government expenditure have been ceased.

After three years of steadily decreasing depression increased, depreciation of loans, no further returns in the form of taxation can be extracted from the community without seriously weakening the country's recuperative capacity.

# A Battle in the Streets of Washington.

## "BONUS ARMY" ATTACK ON POLICE.

### Troops Fire on Rioters.

#### TEAR GAS, TANKS, CAVALRY AND MACHINE GUNS USED TO QUELL THE TROUBLE.

##### A fierce battle has raged in the streets of Washington following an attack by the "Bonus Army" on the Police.

Troops were called out during the course of the fighting, cavalry, infantry wearing gas masks and gas masks, machine guns, tear gas bombs and tanks were used.

Much of the fighting occurred in the neighbourhood of White House where the troops were forced to advance at the double with fixed bayonets. When it became impossible to move the rioters further their gas bombs were thrown into the "screaming, shouting mass."

After the "Bonus Army" had been driven from Washington the troops under the Chief of Staff, General MacArthur, were ordered to clear the main camp, five miles away. This they proceeded in doing, again using tear gas bombs, and the camp was eventually burnt down.

Among the casualties are one of the veterans shot dead, and over fifty of both sides wounded.

## ENTHUSIASTIC POLLING.

### Surge in Increase in Number of Communist Returned.

The Nazis have once again displayed their representation in the Reichstag as a result of the general election held throughout Germany on Sunday. In spite of their large losses in number of seats in the Reichstag, they still will be unable to command an absolute majority, even with the support of allied parties.

The Centre Party, led by Dr. Brüning, the ex-Chancellor, holds the Reichstag in power. It is expected that the vote of the statements by the Von Papen Government will be sufficient to defeat. This is considered a bitter blow to the Nazis.

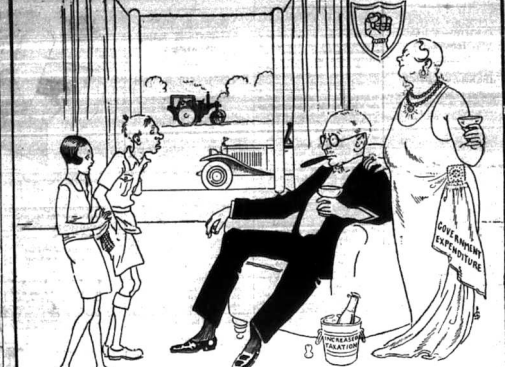

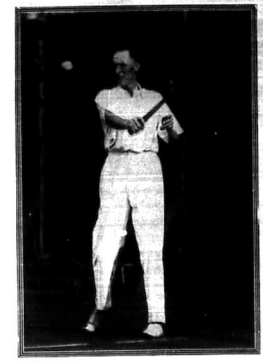

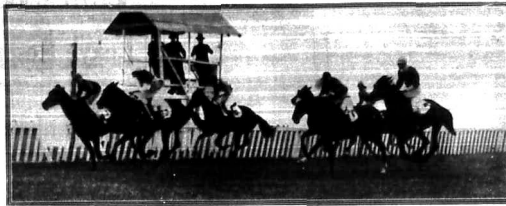
